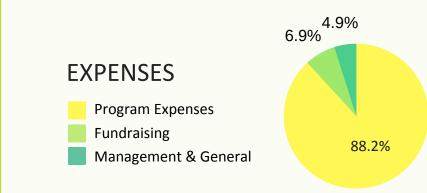

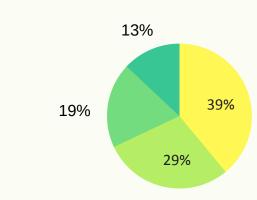
Changes in Net Assets
