Our Lady of Good Success

February 2nd, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Presentation of Our Lord, is also the Feast of Our Lady of Good Success. Two years ago (January 23 - February 4, 2017), I had the privilege of going on a pilgrimage to Quito, Ecuador to pray before the miraculous statue of Our Lady of Good Success and learn about her amazing story and her messages for our times. I participated in the daily novena leading up to her feast day and joined thousands of pilgrims from all over the world in the Rosary at Dawn on February 2nd. It was truly a memorable experience.

This odd title of Our Lady, which remained in obscurity for over 400 years, is just now becoming known because of the significant prophecies for our times that Our Lady revealed to a 17th century nun in the course of several apparitions over a period of 40 years (1594-1634). These apparitions have been approved by the Church and Mother Mariana de Jesus Torres has been declared Venerable, the first step towards canonization. As proof of her sanctity, when her casket was opened in 1906, the body of Venerable Mariana was found to be incorrupt and exuded the fragrance of lilies.

Our Lady of Good Success' warnings and predictions offered a timeline of events that was quite specific, even mentioning the 20th century in particular, which indeed matches with our own experience. But before we go to her messages, let's learn about her story.

In 1577 five Conceptionist sisters traveled from Spain to Quito, Ecuador to start the first convent. Mariana de Jesús Torres, one of the young nuns, is said to have seen the Blessed Mother. On February 2, 1599, as Mariana was praying, the Blessed Mother appeared to her and commanded a statue to be made to her likeness.

"First so that men in the future might realize how powerful I am in placating Divine Justice and obtaining mercy and pardon for every sinner who comes to me with a contrite heart. For I am the Mother of Mercy and in me there is only goodness and love. When tribulations of spirit and sufferings of the body oppress them and they seem to be drowning in this bottomless sea let them gaze at my holy image and I will always be there ready to listen to their cries and soothe their pain. Tell them that they should always run to their Mother with confidence and love..."



Taken aback by this request, Mother Mariana argued that it would be impossible to reproduce the majesty, beauty, size, and other characteristics of the Heavenly Lady in wood. In response, Our Lady ordered her to take off her cincture (a corded rope around the waist of her habit), and with

this to measure her height, a process in which she herself helped by holding one end of it. After this, the Heavenly Lady said, smiling, that she could see to the rest of it by herself.

Over the course of ten years Mother Mariana struggled with the issue of completing the statue. Many obstacles prevented its sculpting. One obstacle was a fear of idolatry on the part of the native people in Quito. Another was Mother Mariana's personal fear of not being believed and thus putting the convent in jeopardy. In the year 1610, she asked the permission of the Bishop to create the statue. The sculpting of the statue of Our Lady of Good Success was given to Francisco del Castillo. Castillo was chosen as he was a talented sculptor and a devotee of the Blessed Mother. It is said that St. Francis Assisi himself and the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael helped finish the statue. The miraculous statue of Our Lady of Good Success was blessed on February 2, 1611. On that day, she was placed above the seat of the Abbess chair at her own specific request as a sign to all that she was the one who governed and watched over the convent. Her official title being that of "Mary of the Good Success of the Purification" (Suceso in Spanish means "event" or "occurrence").

Next week, we will learn about Our Lady of Good Success' prophecies for our times.
