F35 SITE SURVEY UPDATE

Beginning Monday, June 19, 2017 the Air Force will begin conducting a five day on-theground site survey of the 115th Fighter Wing at Truax Field AGS as a part of a deliberate enterprise-wide look for its F-35A basing. Site survey teams will assess the 115th Fighter Wing against operational requirements, potential impacts to existing missions, infrastructure and manpower. They will then develop cost estimates to beddown the F-35A at Truax Field. Once complete, the Air Force will execute the Environmental Impact Analysis Process for each of the candidates before making a final basing decision.

LEGISLATIVE CORNER

JOINT FINANCE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION ON UW TUITION

The Wisconsin Joint Finance Committee recently made recommended changes to the UW System Budget. Two provisions directly support the National Guard:

- Includes a requirement for the UW and Technical College Systems to accept the American Council of Education (ACE) credit recommendations found on a current or former services members Joint Services Transcript of Community College of the Air Force Transcript when they apply for credit transfer.
- Includes a Nonresident Tuition Exemption for members of the National Guard. Students
 who have resided in Wisconsin for six months immediately preceding the beginning of any
 semester would be eligible for resident tuition.

These provisions have bi-partisan support which was introduced by Rep. Ed Brooks and Rep.

CONTACT YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVE

Senator Orin Hatch (Utah) has filed S. 1086 which would allow federal employees who are also members of the Reserve Components to utilize Tricare Reserve Select. This bill could provide significant savings to Guard members. You may wish to read this bill and consider contacting your Senator/Representative if you support it.

STATE SPONSORED LIFE INSURANCE (SSLI)

Personal life insurance is used to provide income for surviving family members to replace the earned income of a deceased primary wage earner. About 7 out of 10 adults have some form of life insurance, and for 70% of those insurance owners, life insurance is the only substantial asset in their estate.

The principal concerns for purchasers of personal life insurance are that the survivors would suffer a devastating loss of income and would be burdened by debt. However, as time passes and a family's needs, objectives and financial situation changes, the family's life insurance needs will likely change as well. Because of the changes that affect many families, an annual financial check-up should be planned. However, certain changes demand that an individual immediately reevaluate his or her life insurance plan. These important changes include:

Marriage Birth of a child Purchasing a residence Planning for children's education Children leaving home Beginning a business Panning for retirement

Upon the death of a primary wage earner, a family might not be able to meet mortgage payments, provide for college or prepare for retirement. Immediate and future family needs could be put on hold as a result of a death.

If the surviving family is left without sufficient funds to meet basic needs, they will have a financial crisis to cope with during a time of grief. Because the financial needs of families with young children are often greater than the needs of families without children, families with young children have a clear need for life insurance – often a large amount of it. Even if both spouses are employed outside the home, the loss of one income through death can cause the family immediate economic hardship and can make it difficult to meet future needs such as properly educating children.



2017 NGAUS/WINGA MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS

The 2017 NGAUS/WINGA membership drive will wrap up 30 June 2017. As of 31 May 2017, the percentage of paid members for actively drilling soldiers and airmen was 60% for the Wisconsin Air National Guard and 79% for the Wisconsin Army National Guard. Our overall NGAUS membership strength is currently at 106% due in large part to the 519 individuals who are active life NGAUS members. Active life membership counts toward NGAUS membership even after the member has retired. This represents the 37th consecutive year that Wisconsin has attained 100% membership in NGAUS! Thank you to all who are paid NGAUS and WINGA members!

2017 Incentive Life Membership Update: Again, in 2017, the WINGA Board offered a life member incentive program. This program offered a \$500 incentive for company grade officers and a \$250 incentive for field grade officers who became NGAUS and WINGA life members. 
