OHIO COUNTY 4-H SPEECH CONTEST will be held on Thursday, March 14 at the Ohio County Extension Office. Speeches



are given by ages (age as of January 1, 2019). Age divisions are: 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17-18. Example: Nine year olds will compete only against nine year olds, 10 year olds will only compete against 10 year olds, etc. Speeches for youth ages 9-13 years old should be 3-5 minutes in length. Speeches for youth ages 14-18 should be 5-7 minutes in length. Ribbons will be awarded to all participants. Two champions in each age group will receive a trophy. Age Champions advance to the District 6 North Communications Event to be held at a time and location to be announced.

OHIO COUNTY 4-H DEMONSTRATION CONTEST will be held on Thursday, March 21 at the Ohio County Extension Office. 4-H Demonstrations are given by category topics and have a time limit of 15 minutes. Age divisions are 9-13 years old and 14-18 years old as of January 1, 2019. Ribbons will be awarded to all participants and a trophy will be awarded to each category champion. 

The requirements to receive the \$50 discount are: The 4-H camp fee must be paid in full, submit a completed 4-H Camp Registration Form and provide Health Insurance information by Thursday, May 23, 2019 - 12:00 noon to the Extension Office located at 1337 Clay Street, Hartford. The 4-H Camp Fee will be \$175 per camper with the discount. Participants not meeting the camp fee paid in full and completed paperwork deadline will be charged the full price of \$225. (This includes camp registration form, insurance information, etc.) Campers are accepted on a first come first save basis (there could be a waiting list for campers to attend the 2019 4-H Camp). A 2019 4-H Camp reservation form is now available at the Extension Office and may be filled out along with a \$25 deposit to hold a 4-H camp spot until the deadline of May 23. For those participants not meeting the May 23rd deadline, all camp payments (\$225) and camp registrations forms/insurance are due no later than Thursday, June 13. 

SEE RED ON VALENTINE'S DAY

See "RED" on Valentine's Day and throughout the year. Red fruits and vegetables contain many health-promoting phytochemicals including lycopene and anthocyanin. This color group may help promote:

- -- A lower risk of some cancers
- -- A healthy heart
- -- Memory health
- -- Urinary tract health

Red fruits and vegetables include: Tomatoes, spaghetti sauce, pizza sauce, tomato juice, red peppers, red onions, beets, red cabbage, kidney beans, apples, pink grapefruit, red grapes, strawberries, cherries, watermelon, raspberries, cranberries. and pomegranates. Some "red" ideas for Valentine's Day (or any day!) include:

Heart Shaped Pizza. Shape pizza dough into a heart or use a heart shaped cookie cutter to make individual hearts from pizza dough. Spread with your favorite pizza sauce. Add vour choice of toppings.



Pasta with tomato sauce. For added fun, serve heart shaped pasta – check with stores offering specialty pasta shapes. Add a few of those tiny red hot cinnamon heart candies to a popcorn snack.

Tossed Salad with such red additions as red bell peppers, red onions, cherry or grape tomatoes.

Raspberry Smoothie - Put 3/4 to 1 cup vanilla flavored yogurt in a blender. Add a few tablespoons of frozen raspberries at a time, blend until desired consistency. After mixing -if desired-blend in 1 or more teaspoons of sugar or no calorie
