Today's Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye.

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

LENT: It's all about Baptism!

Ash Wednesday: March 2: Mass and ashes at 12:05 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.

Lent the Church's annual retreat: We look more closely at how God is active in our lives, examine our response or lack of it to that grace, and discern how God is calling us forward.

Ashes to Easter: Easter is the high-point

of our liturgical year, as we plunge more intensely into the paschal mystery of Christ's dying-and-rising, when we are made a "new creation in Christ." The Church initiated us into that mystery at our Baptism, and that journey will culminate when Christ raises us to eternal life.

Catechumens and Candidates: Easter is the privileged time for Catechumens and Candidates to enter the Church, through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. We have walked with them as they have responded to Christ's call to continual conversion of life and an ever more generous response to God's grace. Our solidarity with them leads us into our own renewed commitment to our Baptismal promises and ongoing conversion, expressed through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This solidarity is the origin of Lent, modeled on Christ's own 40 days of prayer and fasting in the desert after his Baptism.

Baptism: At the Easter Vigil, we will renew our baptismal vows, by which we renew our covenant, made in the Blood of Christ, the Sacrificed Lamb of God. We re-commit ourselves as disciples of Jesus, commissioned to collaborate in his work of building the Kingdom of God. And we receive into that covenant those to be baptized.

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving: These traditional Lenten practices invite us to unite ourselves more closely to the Lord, to "fast" in ways that deepen our hunger for God, and to extend practical concern for those in need

We will distribute a booklet of **Daily Reflections for Lent** on Ash Wednesday and will also make it available in the back of church. There will be also a Communal Penance as well as Stations of the Cross during Lent.

Our Lenten liturgies will invite a **"fast of the senses,**" through more somber music and more silence. We will begin each Sunday Mass kneeling to recite the Confiteor. We will not have flowers or incense at Mass during Lent. The Alleluia is "buried" until Easter and the Gloria is not sung or said. These will be restored in abundance on Easter!

We will once again participate in **Operation Rice Bowl** and we will take up that collection at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.


A Time for Reconciliation: Help us prepare for Easter by participating in a communal celebration of God's forgiveness on **Tuesday, March 22 at 7:00 PM in the church**. Make your Lenten celebration of this Sacrament demonstrate your Lenten effort to convert more faithfully to the baptismal life in Christ. Several confessors will be available.

Holy Week: Palm Sunday. Tenebrae. Chrism Mass. Holy Thursday. Good Friday. Easter Vigil. More news about each of these grace-filled liturgies in upcoming bulletins.

Easter: Through our RCIA program, we will baptize Jeff Whitlock during the Easter Vigil. His wife, Anna Garcia, already baptized in another denomination, will be received into the Church. Their 6-month-old son, Wes, will also be baptized at the Vigil. Matt Blaszczyk will also be received into the Church; he and Paige Niezelski, already baptized in the Catholic Church, will be confirmed along with Anna and Jeff. As they continue their formation in the faith, we join our prayers with theirs as we prepare to welcome them as our new sisters and brothers.

Catholic Christians at Old Saint Joseph's 2022: Lent is all about Baptism. Lent is our annual retreat. Lent is that grace-filled season where we recall the wonderful things God has done and continues to do for us in Jesus. Join us in the Church's Lenten pilgrimage from Ashes to Easter.
