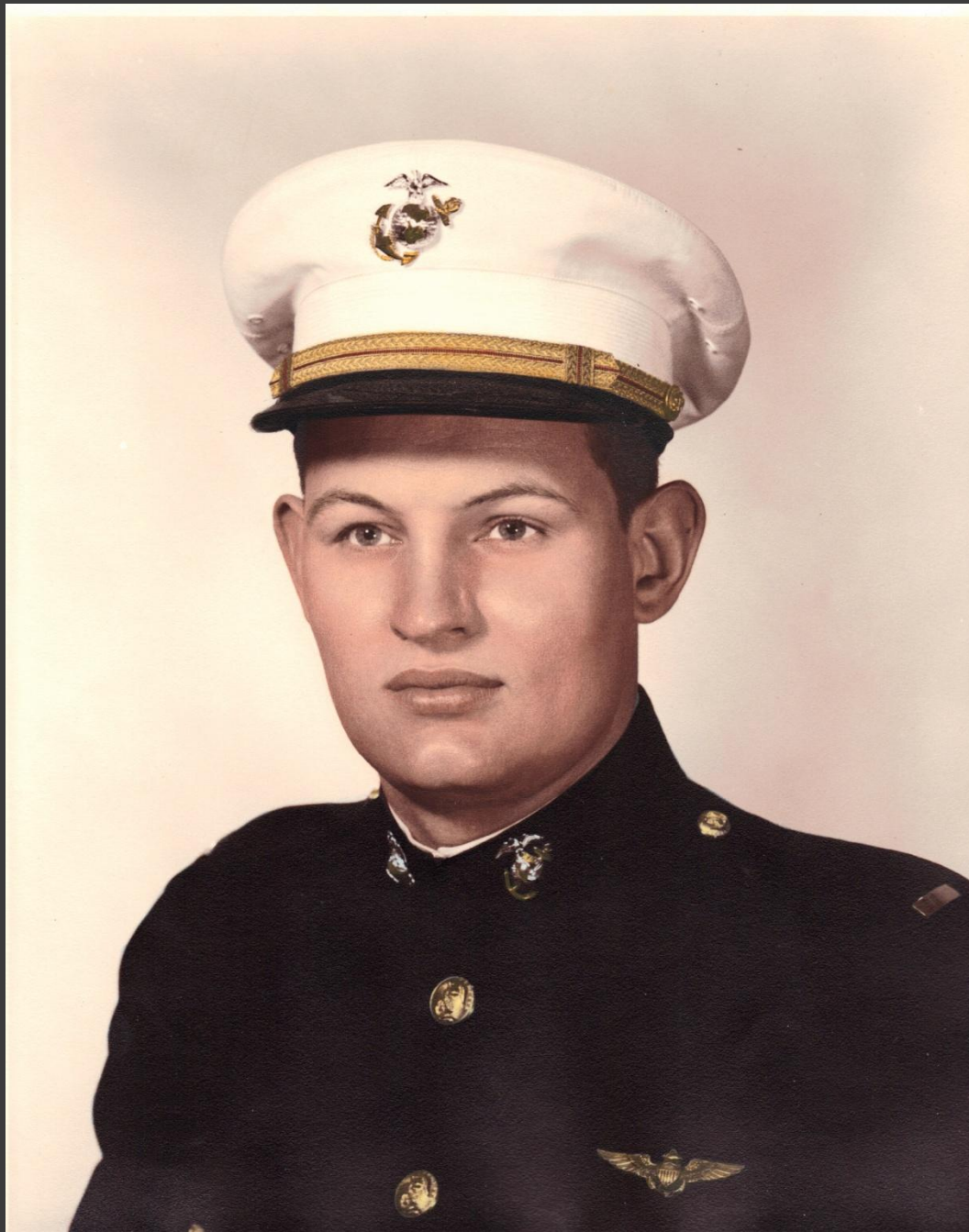

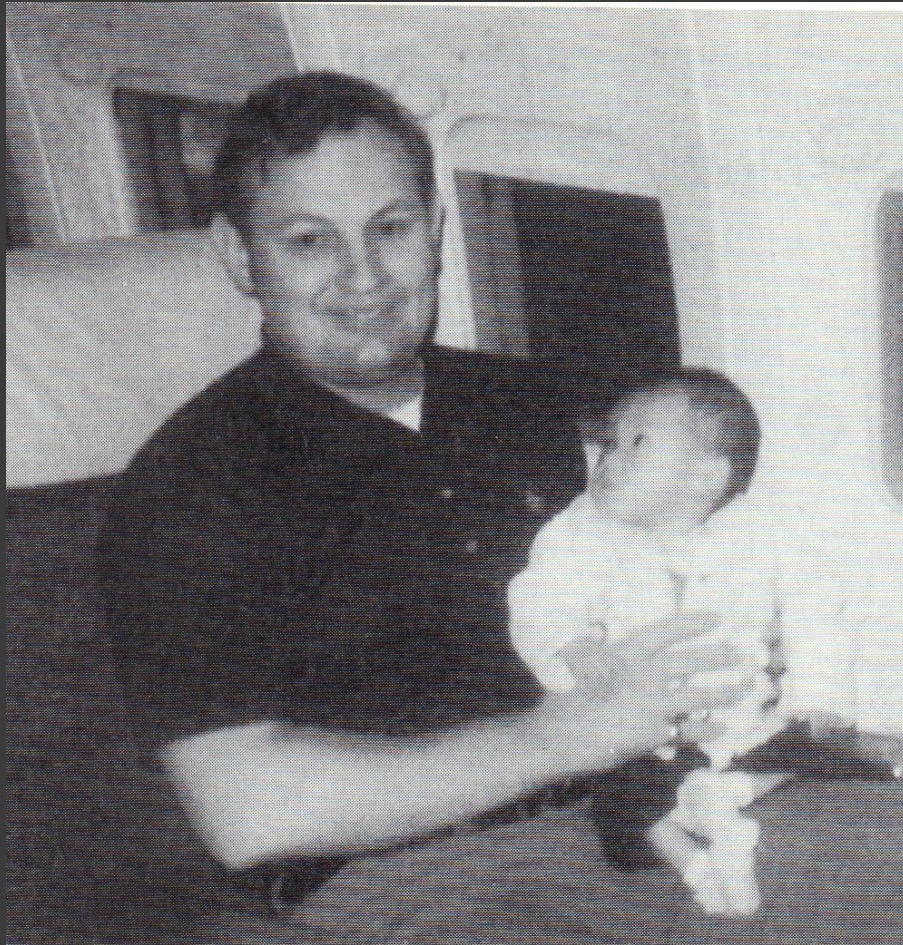

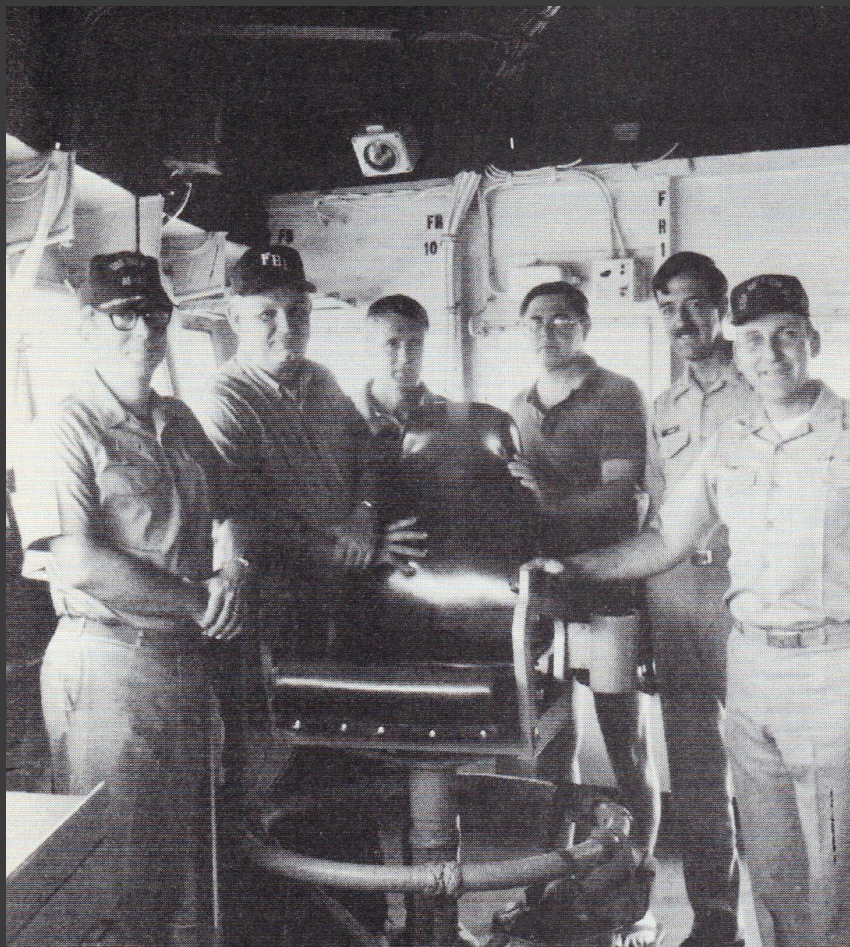

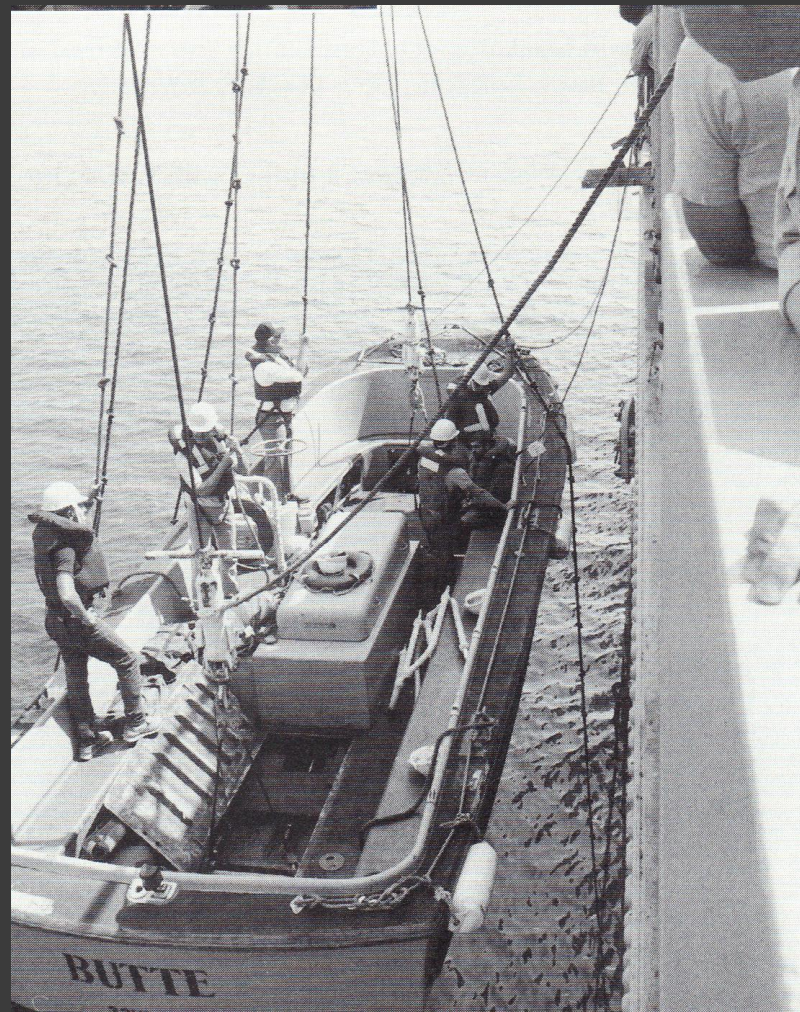

Statue of Justice marking Revell's seven years of service as Chairman of the Board of the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration



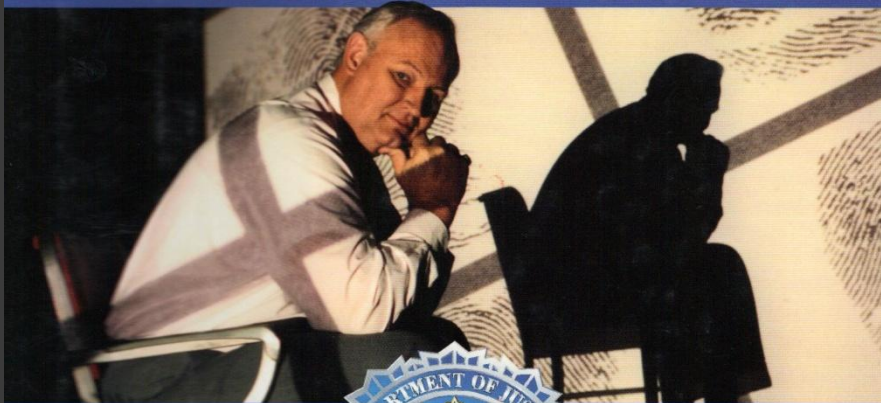
