# Letter from the Chair



For OLLI at AU, June is traditionally a time of transition. The OLLI Board bids farewell to departing members, welcomes new ones, elects new officers, reviews and approves the budget for the coming year, and approves the committee chairs and coordinators. This time, however, June also marked two new and particularly significant milestones. Last week, for the first time in 16 months, the OLLI Board met in person and in our facilities in Spring Valley. The next day, across the street at Pizza Paradiso, Social Committee Chair Jeff Porter hosted the first in-person Social Hour since the shutdown, bringing together long-absent friends and colleagues, many of whom were venturing out to a restaurant for the first time. Thanks, Jeff. We needed that.

Last week, the Board said goodbye to departing members Lew Cohen, who served six years on the Board, and Linda Kiser, who served two. Lew and Linda, thank you for your able service. We also welcomed new members: Stuart Frisch, who served as Chair of the Personnel Committee for the past two years, and Penny Hansen, a long-time SGL (The Supreme Court and, more recently, Populism). Welcome aboard! Board Chair Judy Havemann, who provided unerring leadership during our most challenging year as an organization, completed her term of office and stepped down. Having served as Judy's Vice Chair for the past year, I have the honor and privilege of taking her place as the new Chair. Fortunately, Judy remains on the Board where we will continue to draw on her extensive knowledge and experience. The Board also elected Dave Hensler as the new Vice Chair, Martha Cutts as Secretary, and Jo Anne Friedenthal as Treasurer, with both Martha and Jo Anne reprising those roles.

With the June Minis coming to an end and the July Shorts locked in place, the Board and staff are now focused with increasing excitement on the fall semester, when OLLI at AU will have the opportunity to begin gathering as a community once again. In September, we will reopen the OLLI social space so members can mingle over coffee or lunch. Field trips and other in-person activities will be back on the menu. Most important, for the first time since March of 2020, we will have some in-person classes. We will be offering a heady combination of in-person, hybrid (mixed in-person and Zoom), and Zoom-only classes. The staff is currently working with SGLs, interns, and others to make sure all these moving parts come together smoothly.

Colleagues, it has been a challenging year for OLLIs all around the country, many which suffered sharp drops in membership and some which closed down completely. But OLLI at AU has not only survived, we have thrived thanks to our extraordinary staff—Tony, Mary Fran, Lesley, Jesse and Niranjan—and our committed SGLs and members.

Looking forward, COVID restrictions are rapidly dropping off, travel is opening up, and friends and families are being reunited. Please everyone have a safe and happy holiday wherever you are as we celebrate America's 245th birthday.

# Serendipity Talk: David Kuney on Reclaiming My Family's Jewish Identity, July 28

### David Kuney, On Rockingham Street: Reclaiming My Family's Jewish Identity—Our Journey from Vilna to the Suburban South

Wednesday, July 28

### 3:30-5:00 PM, via Zoom

Wipf & Stock has just published David Kuney's intergenerational memoir that explores how assimilation of Jewish immigrants arriving from Eastern Europe in the early 20th century was shaped and affected by the culture of the Suburban South in the 1950s and 1960s. It probes the key question of Jewish continuity, including whether American Judaism has left many Jews unable to answer the question, "Why are we Jewish?" The talk will include readings from the memoir.

David Kuney is an Adjunct Professor at Georgetown University Law Center. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Pardes Institute of Jewish Studies. More information on the book and David can be found at <u>https://www.davidkuney.com</u>
