CONCEPT NOTE

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 aims at creating knowledge society, wherein emphasis is laid on interdisciplinary learning with focus on outcome of learning. Another salient feature is that of quality in imparting holistic education. To achieve these objectives, NEP desires digital pedagogy to be adopted by teachers. From an institutional stand point, the National Education Policy seeks to radically change our perception of what constitutes a higher education institution. A College in future will refer to multi-disciplinary institution of higher learning that grants undergraduate degrees based on imaginative and flexible curricular structure with multiple entry and exit points and emphasis on community engagement and service. IT skills, environment education and value based education are expected to be integral part of the undergraduate courses and will have to be integral to the syllabi for different subjects. The multi-subject based curriculum, high quality pedagogy, scientifically designed assessment methods and accountability to deliver outcome oriented education are the cornerstones for quality learning and holistic education.

Implementation of NEP will not only entail major restructuring of courses but also change the manner in which they will be taught. On the one hand, teachers will be required to lay greater emphasis on cognitive skills and learning outcomes and on the other hand, shed away the present culture of narrow subject specialisation. Teachers will be required to acquire wider multi-speciality knowledge with an emphasis on IT inputs in teaching, assessment and evaluations.

The proposed FDP is being organised to create an awareness about the broad features of New Education Policy, understand the challenges in implementing it and ascertain the opportunities for self-improvement and career advancement. The programme also provides an opportunity to interact with expert resource persons and share and discuss our own understanding and perceptions about the changes. The shared interests and knowledge will be a useful collective resource for the faculty to prepare for the challenges ahead and also mentor the students for the brave new world that awaits all of us.

Report Day 1: The Inaugural Session started with **Dr. Gita Lakhanpal** by welcoming the guests and participants to the FDP. She established the need for the FDP: ‘The Road Ahead: NEP and Pedagogies’, which would focus on pedagogical input, assessment tools and policy understanding. The Resource Persons of the FDP were introduced.

Dr. Gurmohinder Singh welcomed the distinguished guests and the participants. He also thanked the participants for their enthusiastic participation and wished the FDP success.

Dr. Vimal Rarh introduced the institution Guru Angad Dev Teaching and Learning Centre. She highlighted its significant contribution to the training of faculty and creation of digitized content for the online teaching platforms.

Prof. A. K. Bakhshi delivered the Special Address and talked about the objectives of NEP. How the shift from teaching centric to learning centric approach necessitates a change in teaching and assessment process. In his motivational words to the participants he said, “Professional development of teacher should become a journey”.

Prof. Ved Prakash in his Keynote Address spoke about the reforms that are needed in the education sector. Emphasized the need to understand the policy and all that entails in making a policy. Adopting the NEP would involve enabling conditions for revamping the education system, examining the existing institutions for the purpose of aligning and formulation of new apparatuses. He also spoke about the regulatory framework and mechanisms.

Inaugural session Vote of Thanks was proposed by Dr. Neeta Dhingra

Before the start of the Academic Session instructions were given to the participants on how to access My eClass by Mr. Dhanesh Kumar from GAD-TLC and Dr. Arun Julka.

Dr. Jaswinder Singh started his talk by giving some statistics regarding the number of colleges and universities in the country and teacher and student strength in higher education to establish the need for a strong governance mechanism. In his talk he explained the regulatory structure suggested in the NEP. Higher Education Commission of India will be the umbrella body with four verticals under it, namely: National Higher Education Regulatory Council, National Accreditation Council, Higher Education grants Council and General Education Council.

Dr. Meena Singh coordinated the QA session and thanked Dr. Jaswinder Singh for his talk.

Report Day 2: Prof. A.K. Bakhshi alleged that the role of the teacher in the present day scenario is to disseminate knowledge and create knowledge. Teachers aspiring for excellence should possess 4 C's: Curiosity, Creativity, Collaboration and Communication skills. Prof. Bakhshi also spoke about the challenges in HE, such as AI, Mass Education, Crisis of innovation, Growth in Knowledge and Technology. Education 4.0 is technology driven so it is imperative that teachers acquire ICT skills. He also said that Time management, confident, positivity, proactive and self-challenge are some characteristics that teachers should cultivate.

Dr. Meena Singh coordinated the QA session and thanked Prof. Bakhshi for his talk.

Dr. Timir Tripathi spoke about the importance given to research in NEP and the proposed establishment of National Research Foundation to foster research and innovation in India. He deliberated upon the present Research scenario and that proposed under NRF. Acknowledging the fact that country presently has limited resources for research. He elaborated that under NEP multidisciplinary research will be encouraged and funding and recognition will also be facilitated. The objective of research will be providing solutions to emerging social changes/challenges.

Dr. Gita Lakhanpal coordinated the QA session and thanked Dr. Tripathi for his talk.

Report Day 3: Dr. Arun Julka took a hands-on session on use of LMS as assessment tool. To begin with he gave two quizzes to participants to attempt and then moved on to asking the participants to create a quiz of their own. Participants were also familiarized with the process of uploading content on My e Class.

Report Day 4: Dr. Vimal Rarh enlightened the participants about the use of ICT in teaching learning and assessment process in the light of NEP. She talked about the goals of education such as responsible citizen and competent personality. Also spoke about the importance of e content, the four quadrant format

of MOOCs and the precautions to keep in mind in the preparation of it. Dr. Vimal elaborated on how to prepare e content and the kind of technical assistance needed for recording purpose.

Ms. Sukhvinder Kaur coordinated the QA session and thanked Dr. Vimal Rarh for her talk.

Prof. A.K. Bakhshi started his talk by elaborating upon the kinds of education, such as formal education received from educational institutions, Informal education acquired from the society around oneself and Non formal from the training process undergone. Prof. Bakhshi also spoke about the three domains of learning, namely Cognitive, Psychomotor and Affective. Discussed the limitations of Talk and Chalk method of teaching and pointed to the need to overcome passive learning and recognizing that all students don't have identical learning abilities. To cope with these problems and to achieve higher learning goals according to Blooms's Taxonomy he introduced the Flipped classroom approach.

Ms. Sukhvinder Kaur coordinated the QA session and thanked Prof. Bakhshi for the talk.

have played a very important role and various pedagogical techniques were used to engage the students in a better way. He discussed the importance of National Education Policy where the assessment methods have to undergo a very significant change and should be based on learning centric outcome approach. Various activities like peer teaching, Flip Teaching etc can be used to make it more interactive.

Dr. Gurmohinder Singh thanked the guests and participants for their whole- hearted participation and wished them well in their endeavours of implementing the learnings of the FDP in their class.

Dr. Neeta Dhingra while proposing the Vote of thanks spelled out the salient features of each Resource Person's sessions and thanked them for their valuable contribution towards making the FDP a success. 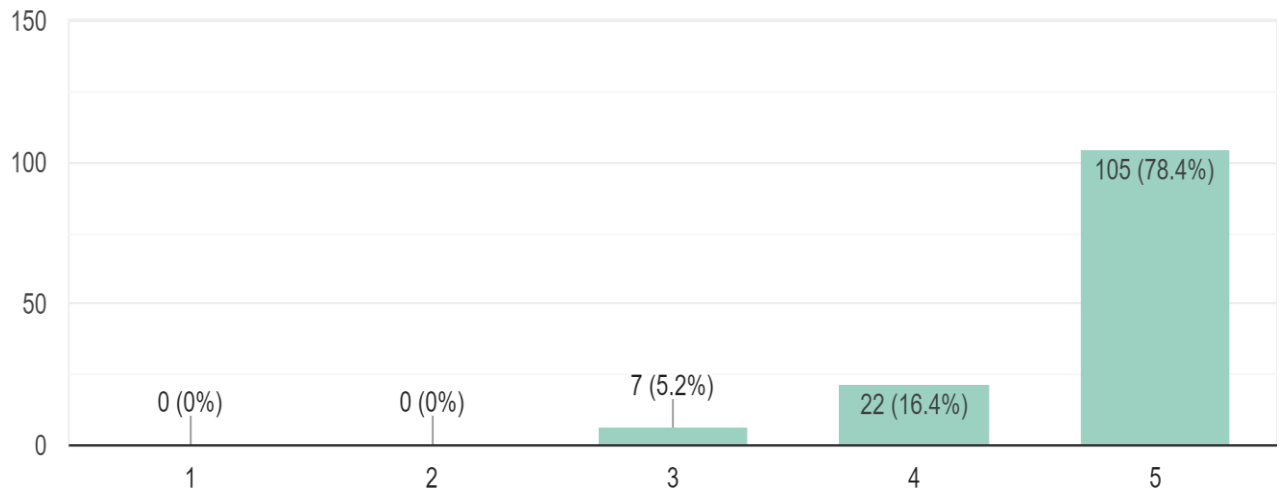

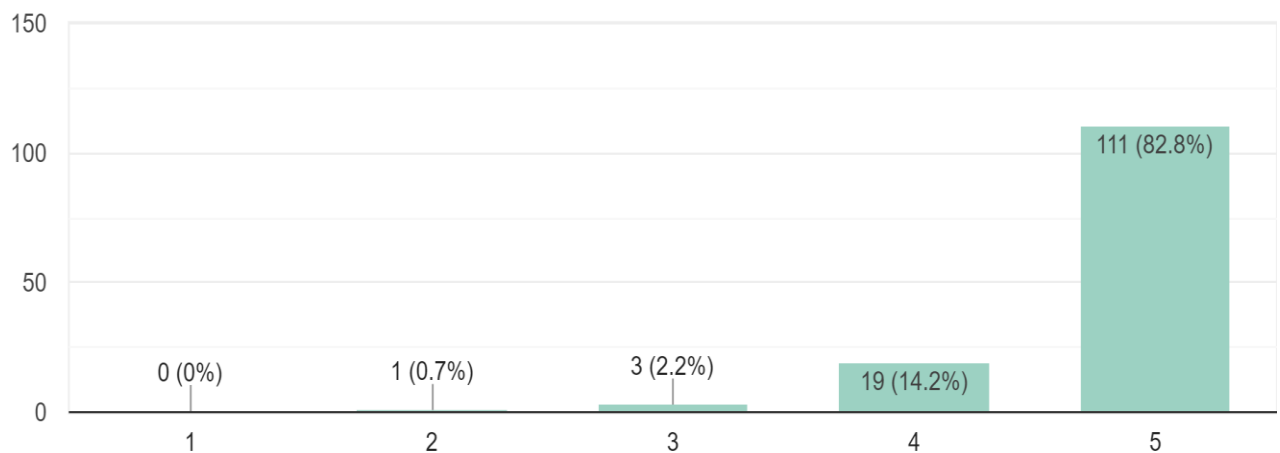

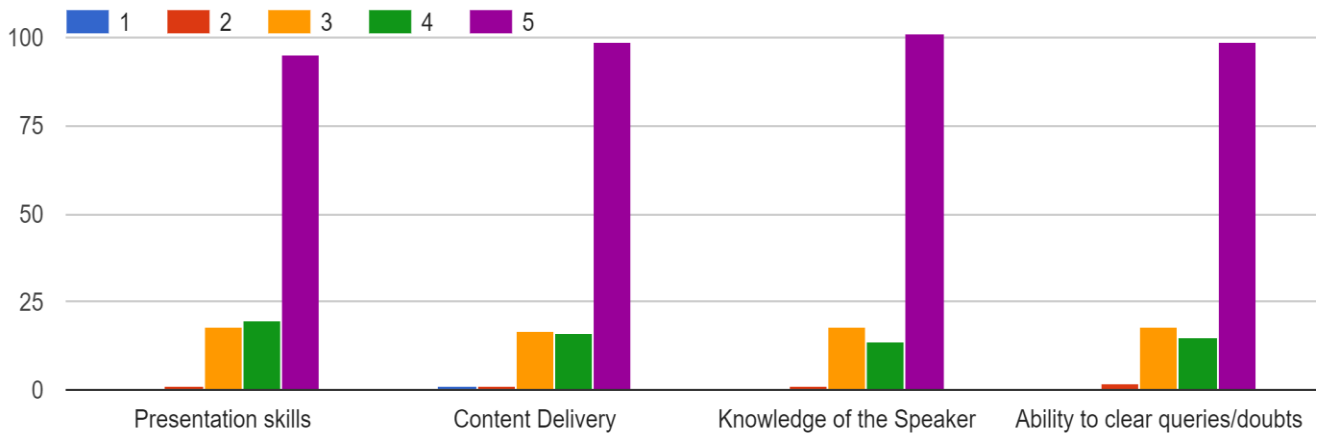

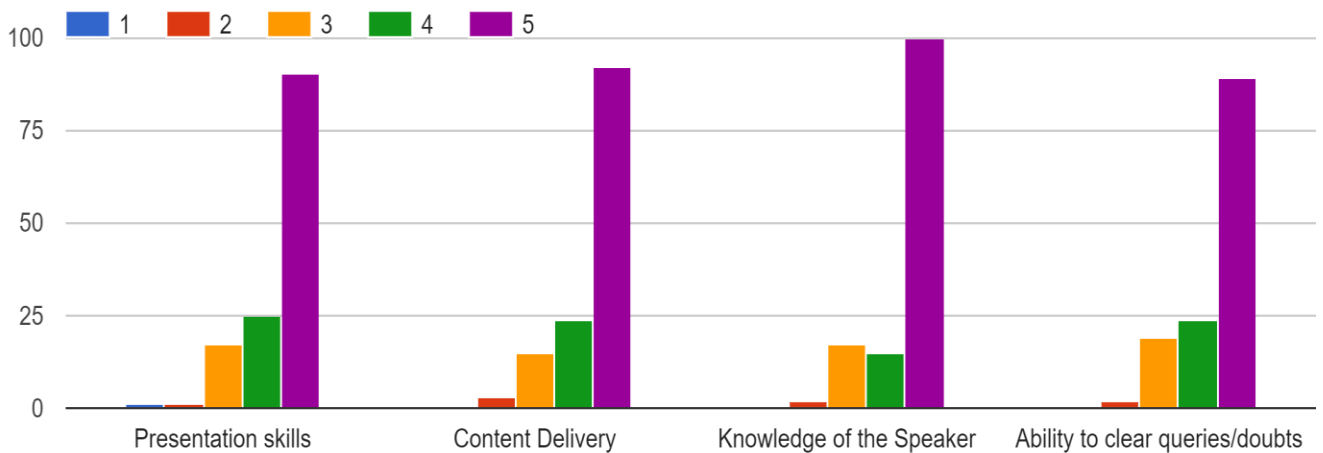

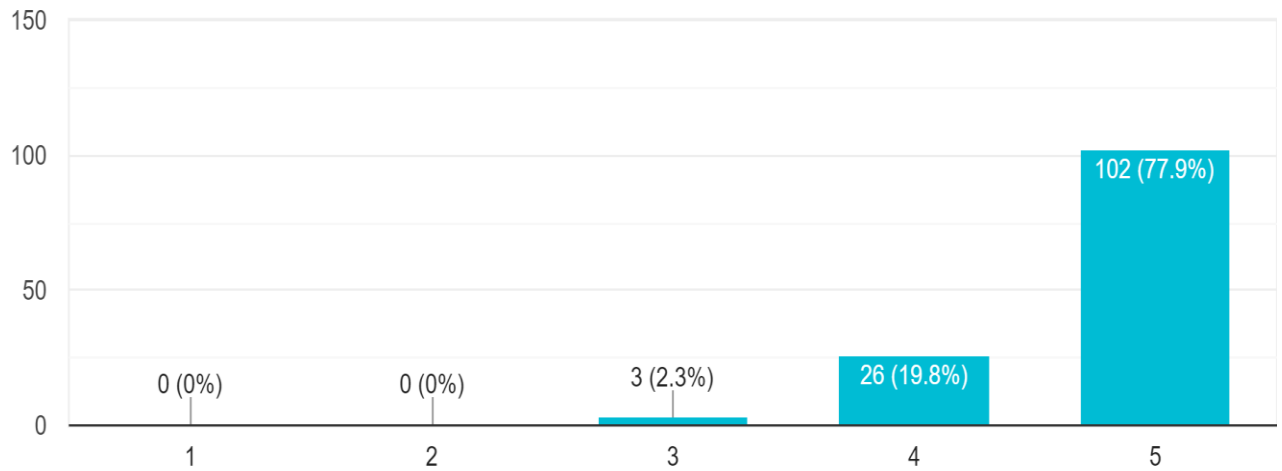
