### **Student Reports**

Staff are finalising these in readiness for their upcoming distribution on Friday 8th December. Semester 2 reports are an indication of your child's achievements during the past two terms and our teachers have been assessing students according to curriculum outcomes which generally allow two years for students to progress through each stage. The report will give you information about their academic, physical and social development at this point in their education. They will include:

- Clear, accurate information about the performance of each child:
- Information on what the student can do well and on areas still developing; and
- Information about the student's social skills and commitment to learning.

Learning is continuous and children learn at different rates. However all children need encouragement and praise to be confident, happy learners. Some children try very hard and find learning difficult. They deserve your praise and encouragement. Some children find learning easy and often don't try as hard as they could. Your encouragement here is critical as well. For those students who have no difficulty learning and put a lot of effort into their work, they need continued acknowledgement and praise to keep this level of enthusiasm and commitment. For those students whose effort is minimal, closer home and school partnerships are an important key to improvement.

If you wish to discuss any aspect of these, please arrange a suitable time with your child's teacher.

### How we form our classes

We are presently organising our class structure for 2018. One part of this is the allocation of students to each of the new classes. We would like to point out a few facts about the assigning of students to class groups and ultimately, teachers to classes. This process is always a complex issue, which the school takes very seriously and parents usually understand how difficult the issue of assigning students to classes can be.

For those new to the school, it is worthwhile again to outline the school's procedures for this very important task. Literally dozens of hours of work go into the formation of classes and looking at the students that are placed

together to make a class. We ensure that all necessary factors are taken into account during this process and try to take into account the following factors:

- The number of classes in each stage of learning (ie Early Stage 1, Stage 1, Stage 2 and Stage 3);
- An equal division of students as possible in each year level into the number of classes;
- Balance of gender in the class;
- Spread of students with additional needs;
- The issue of siblings being in the same class;
- Mix of independent and dependent workers; and
- Whether students have had the teacher before.

To ensure that we develop the optimal balance in classes, we also use a range of assessments and information to base our decisions on as well.

As you can see, the allocation of students to class groups is not a simple process where students are thrown together in a haphazard manner. It is a task which we tackle with great thought and consideration.

The development of class groups precedes the actual allocation of the teacher to the class, as often final staffing is only known in the last week of term or at the beginning of the year.

If you are not going to be at Narrabri West in 2017 could you please let us know ASAP as this may impact on our class plans for next year.

### Beach to Bush Talk

On Monday the 20th of November, all students from Pre School to Year 6 participated in a beach and waterway safety information session. In a one hour session for each stage, three volunteers from the New South Wales Royal Life Saving Society travelled from Port Macquarie to share their knowledge about beach and sun safety.

Students were given the opportunity to dress like lifesavers, have fun using some rescue equipment and learn about what the different flags and signs mean at the beach. A few teachers were sporting some very fashionable zinc lines for the rest of the day after each session.

All students were given information booklets and stickers to re-enforce the information they learnt throughout these sessions, free of charge from the Life Saving Society.

These sessions were a valuable learning experience for all students with the Christmas holiday period coming up very fast.



Stage 1 News

What a fun term of learning we are having! The children have especially enjoyed learning about life cycles in English and Science this term.

We have learned about the life cycles of butterflies, sunflowers and sea turtles in English. The children have planned and written explanations of these life cycles. We formed groups to present 'elevator speeches' during our sea turtle unit. Each class has been researching a different species of sea turtle and we are looking forward to sharing the information we have gathered with the other Stage 1 classes. The students have enjoyed using Microsoft PowerPoint to publish their writing.

In Science we have enjoyed learning about how things change and grow. We have learned about the life cycle of meal worms. We even have actual meal worms in our classrooms and we have enjoyed watching them grow and change throughout the term. The children are now excitedly preparing animations of various life cycles and we look forward to seeing their finished productions.

In Maths Year 1 have been focusing on money (identifying and totalling coins), measurement (informal units to measure capacity, mass and area), arrays and related facts in the past few weeks. The students have enjoyed the more practical aspects of these lessons using hands on materials. Year 2 have also been focusing on measurement (introducing formal units), multiplication and related facts. The students have particularly enjoyed going outside to measure length using metre rulers and trundle wheels.


