Optional Practical Training



OPT is temporary work authorization (permission to work).

Most students use OPT to authorize work after completing an academic degree.

What is OPT?

OPT = VISA

- OPT (optional practical training) is a work authorization benefit for F-1 students only.
- OPT grants you 12 months permission to work after graduation.
- You do not need a job offer to apply!

When to apply for OPT?

When to apply for OPT

Determine your final quarter of enrollment.

- This will be your program end date, as listed on your I-20.
- Graduating early? OISS Advisor will shorten your I-20 end date.

Plan ahead! Average OPT processing time,

with USCIS, is 2-4 months.

When to apply for OPT

100

• days before I-20 end date: Earliest date you can apply with OISS.

90

• days <u>before</u> your I-20 end date: Earliest date you USCIS can receive your application.

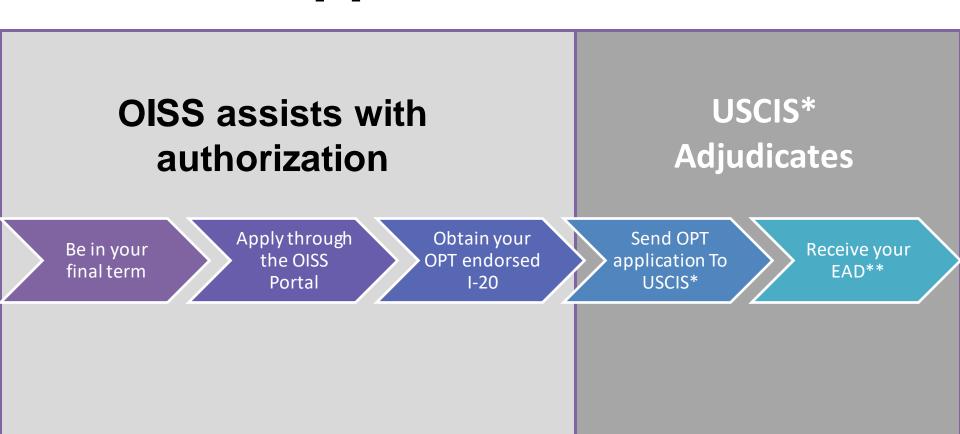
60

 days <u>after</u> your I-20 end date: Latest date USCIS will accept your OPT application.

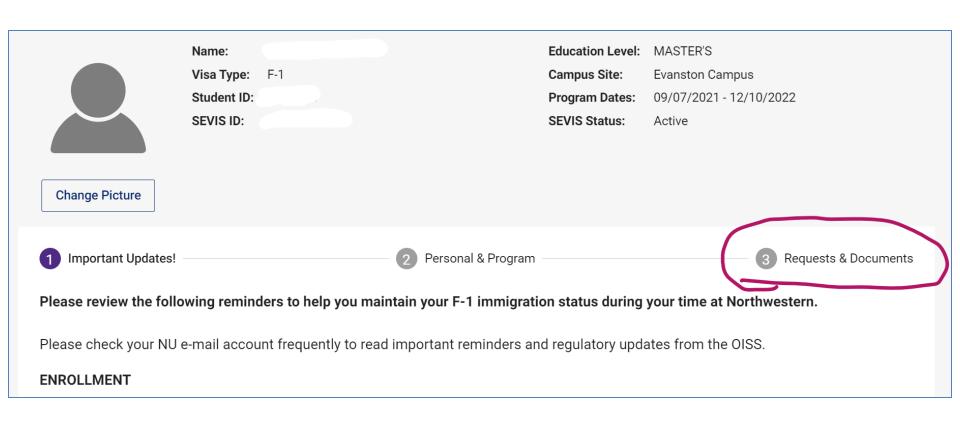
OPT Application Process



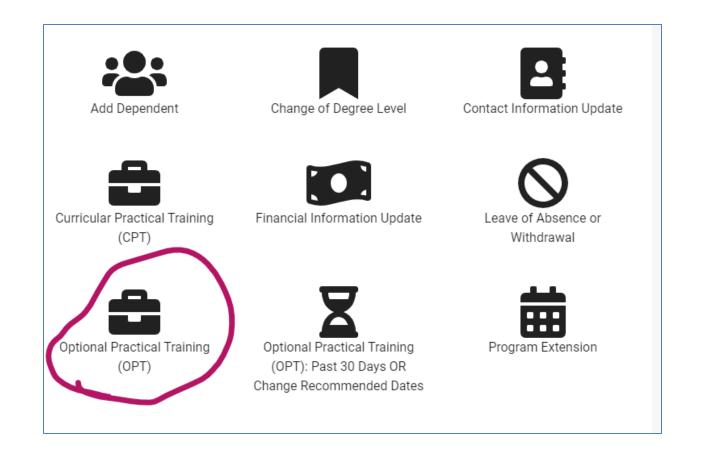

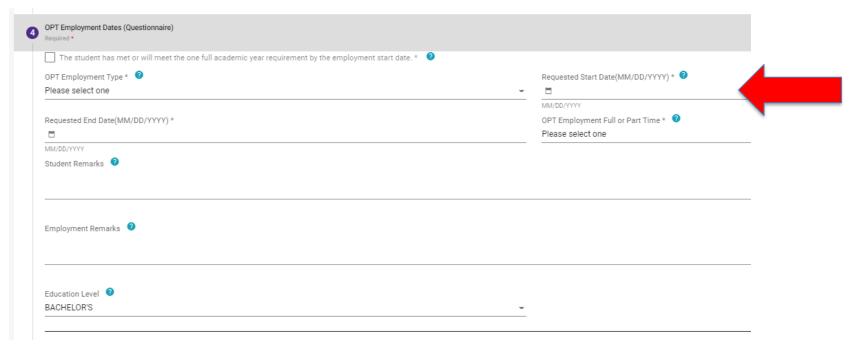

Read Eligibility for Post-Completion OPT & Maintaining F-1 Status on OPT, click "next" after each section. Type in your information in the Academic Program Details questionnaire.



Select "post completion OPT" under OPT employment type, choose your requested OPT start and end dates, and select "full time". Click next and add your **academic advisor's** contact information.

Remember!

After mailing your application to USCIS students cannot change/alter their selected OPT start & end dates.

Choosing an OPT start date

Important Reminders:

- You do not need a job (offer) to apply for OPT!
- Still job searching? Choose a later start date.
- Traveling? Consider your travel plans.
- Applying late? Choose a later start date.

Still not sure?

Ask your OISS advisor by email, phone or scheduling an appointment in the OISS Portal!

Choosing an OPT start date

For PhD & thesis-based Master's students:

- You can apply for OPT before officially graduating (before defense)
- For PhD→ ABD status you qualify to apply

Finishing early? Once you apply for OPT, we shorten
your I-20 to match term end date, and you cannot
apply for an I-20 extension once you apply for OPT.



Who is your "Approver" for OPT purposes?

- Graduate students: Program Director, Dept. Chair, P.I.
- Undergraduates: Advisor from your major
 - "Academic advisor" is defined as a person associated with an academic college that has advisory responsibilities and can verify your course enrollment & academic plan or degree audit.

OPT recommendation request is sent to your academic advisor via email.

Academic advisor certifies:

- You have completed all your course requirements
- You are going to graduate in the term you have indicated (or ABD)
- You are in good academic standing (no academic probation)

After recommendation received:

- OISS Advisor processes OPT Recommendation: Processing time is <u>one week.</u>
- Student will receive I-20 in the portal for download & email instructions
- Upon receiving OPT I-20, please remember to sign on the bottom of page 1 in ink.



Don't forget step 1!!

DO NOT...

.... Submit OPT Application online with USCIS until you receive an updated I-20 with OPT recommendation on the 2nd page.

The updated I-20, with OPT recommendation on page 2, is only valid for 30 days from the day the OISS processed your OPT request.

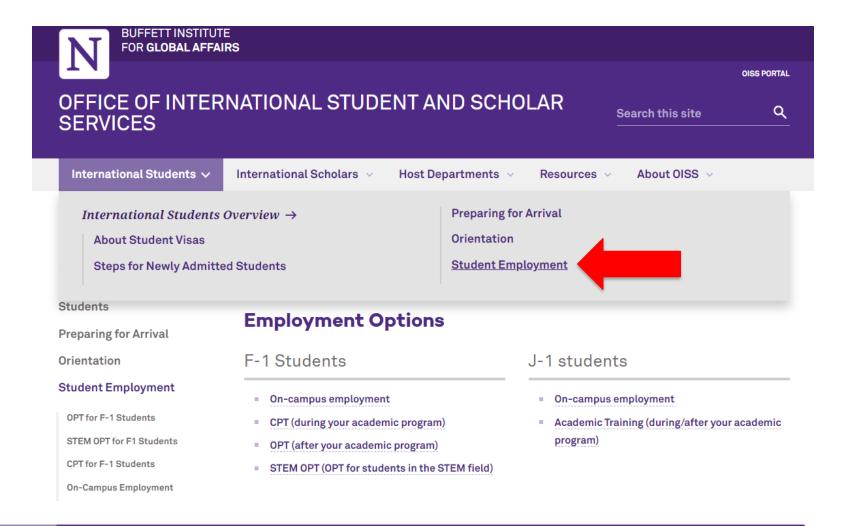

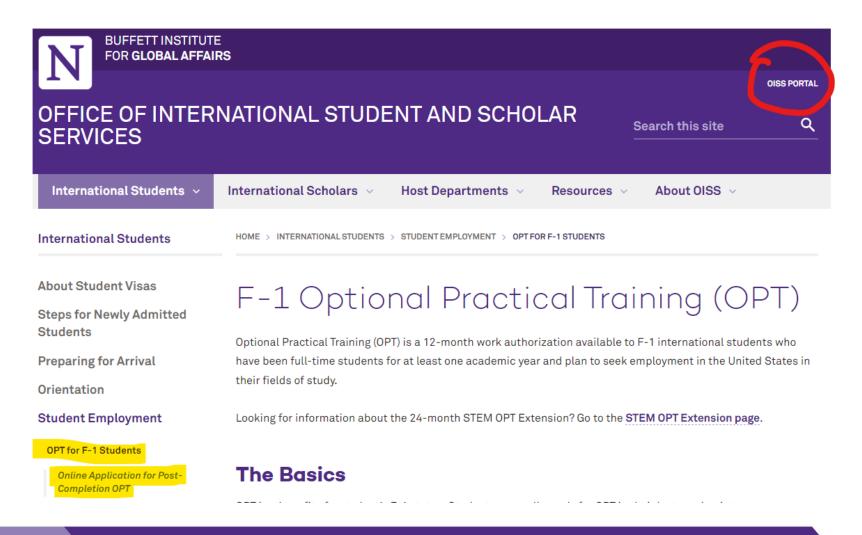
ONLINE APPLICATION CHECKLIST - Review Instructions 2 x 2 Photo of You (digital): Upload one U.S. passport style photo. Follow guidelines outlined in online application to ensure photo is acceptable. Review the U.S. Department of State photo requirements website Form I-94: Upload your most recent I-94 entry record. Download most recent Form I-94 at cbp.gov/i94, it is not necessary to provide your travel history. Employment Authorization Document: Upload your passport biographical page . If you previously applied for OPT, include copy of the front and back of your previous EAD card(s). If you lost your EAD(s), upload a copy of your receipt notice or approval notice with a statement explaining your EAD was lost. Previously authorized CPT or OPT: Any I-20s with CPT Authorization and/or OPT from any U.S. based institution. If you lost any Northwestern CPT I-20s, ask your advisor for a CPT printout. Form I-20: Most recent I-20 with Post Completion OPT Recommendation on page 2. Sign the bottom of page 1. Payment: Be prepared with bank card (debit or credit) or bank withdrawal information. Confirm filing fee on USCIS website. - Online application does not require as many documents to be uploaded.
- Full online application <u>instructions</u> found on our website

Step 2: Send your application to USCIS

Form I-765: Mailing Address

- Input U.S. mailing address that is valid 6 months into the future
- Sign up for USPS Informed Delivery Free Service
- If you are moving:
 - Ask a friend, family, peer is they can help receive mail for you.
 - Rent a Post Office Box (PO Box) from USPS or UPS



Step 2: Send your application to USCIS

 Most recent <u>I-94 number</u> (not the travel history)

 If you cannot retrieve the number or details are incorrect, contact your OISS advisor.

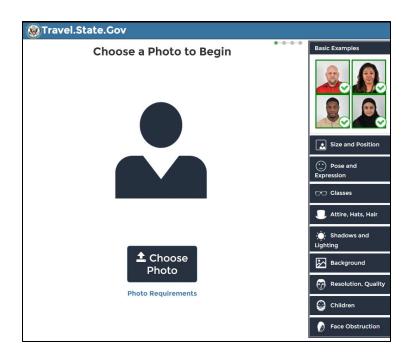

OPT Application Documents

Application fee

Current fee: \$410 (verify on uscis.gov) *possible fee increase in the future*

- Students can now pay online with USCIS.
- Only use U.S. Based Accounts Credit, Debit, or Direct Bank Withdrawal.



Step 2: Send your application to USCIS

Submit your application online to USCIS <u>as soon</u> as possible after receiving your updated OPT endorsed I-20

- Students must submit online or mail OPT application to USCIS <u>within 15 days</u> from receiving confirmation your OPT request has been processed
- Make a copy of all your application documents

After Submitting OPT Application

Online application:

 Download receipt notice (I-797c) immediately upon submission

Within 2 to 4 months (hopefully):

- Receive approval notice (I-797) and EAD!
- Do not start working until you receive your EAD and the start date arrives.

Possible Outcomes for OPT Application

- 1. OPT Approved
- 2. **Request for Information**
- 3. **OPT Rejected or Denied**

If #2 or #3 happen:

<u>Do not panic!</u>

Contact your OISS Advisor and email them a copy of the notice.

After Submitting OPT Application

After your I-20 program end date you are still in status.

While you wait for your OPT Approval <u>and</u> Employment Authorization Document (EAD):

Students Can:

- Take a break! You earned it!
- Travel in the U.S. or internationally.
- Search, apply, and interview for jobs.

Students Cannot:

- Work (paid and un-paid).
- Re-enter the U.S. must have EAD

Travel - International

Before I-20 end date

International Travel is permitted!

Travel with standard documents:

I-20, Passport, F-1 Visa Stamp

After I-20 end date

International travel is permitted!

New documentation required!

- You must have EAD to re-enter the U.S.
- Along with your I-20, Passport, and F-1 Visa Stamp
- Eventually travel with your offer letter.

Travel - International

Remember:

While on OPT - your I-20 travel signature is only valid for 6 months.

Request a reprint through the OISS Portal!

Students may renew F-1 visa stamp!

- Plan accordingly! Always a risk of delay or denial
- Travel with a copy of your NU transcript, <u>status letter</u>, and job offer letter
- Talk to your supervisor! Tell them you are travelling for your visa renewal and there is possibility of delay

ALWAYS Re-enter in F-1 Status!

OPT Document Reminders:

- Confirm your name is spelled correctly on EAD.
- Check your EAD dates should be one year minus a day.
- EAD is not a form of identification. Only needed when requested by employer, SSN Application, Driver's License, or international travel.
- Make copies physical and electronic scans.

Appropriate OPT Employment

Must be 20+ hours per week

Must be directly related to your field of study at NU

- Can be paid or unpaid (including internships)
- Can be work for multiple employers
- Can be contract work or through an agency
- Can be self-employed

Keep accurate records of all employment!

90 Days of Unemployment

- 90 days are <u>cumulative</u>.
- Unemployment days begin on OPT start date
 (printed on EAD). OPT start date is not always the
 same as the requested OPT start date.
- No grace period after reaching all 90 days make plans to depart the U.S. as soon as possible
 and contact your OISS Advisor.

SEVP Portal

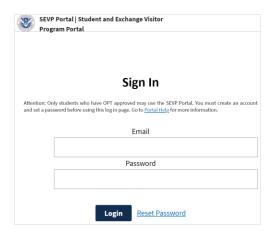

SEVP will email you a link to create your SEVP Portal account – on OPT start date.

- Submit an SEVP Portal Reset Request in the OISS Portal if:
 - You do not receive an email from SEVP during the first week of OPT
 - Your SEVP Portal account is locked

Reporting is required:

- Update your US address within 10 days of moving.
- Update your US employment information within 10 days of starting/stopping a job.
- Report brief 3 to 4 sentences on how job relates to your major area of study.

Reporting late?

Submit OPT Employer Update through OISS Portal.

STEM OPT Extension:

24 Months

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math programs qualify for 24 additional months of OPT.

Eligible students may apply for the STEM OPT Extension approximately 3 months before your Post Completion OPT end date.

Employer must be E-Verified & position must be paid.

After the OPT EAD End Date

- You cannot work.
- You have a 60-day grace period to stay in the U.S.
- You can transfer to another U.S. university to begin a new academic program.
