We had no idea that the cost would be so high to get this mandatory project done. It is not exactly how we wanted to use our resources. Asphalt is scheduled to be poured August 10. We will be so happy to have a place other than mud to park, and people with limited mobility will find it much easier to get to our front door.

Medical Team Update

We are making great progress with our medical teams. We now have three teams of vet techs and assistants that rotate weekly taking care of our cat intakes and kittens. We have a fourth team that will only do the monthly medical exams for all the cats in our care. Dr Ann Langer is a relief veterinarian that will be assisting

us. She has given our cat/kitten foster parents a workshop on basic procedures that they can use for their cats' care.
