MARRIAGE ANNULMENTS (Declarations of Nullity of Marriage):

The Tribunal of the Diocese of Bismarck is staffed by persons who have been appointed by the Bishop of Bismarck and who have received special training to represent him and the faith community in church judicial proceedings for marriage cases and other matters of Church law. Most of its work involves assisting divorced persons who are interested in proving the nullity of a prior marriage bond, allowing them to remarry in the Church. As such, the Tribunal has a three-fold ministry:

Protecting the integrity and indissolubility of marriage as Christ taught;

Assisting in the exercise of rights given in Church law for those who are seeking a possible remarriage in the Catholic Church; and

Helping participants experience reconciliation with their faith community insofar as possible.

The Lord Heals the Brokenhearted

February 7, 2021

I would guess that most people have experienced what is often referred to as a "broken heart." My mom's record collection from the late fifties and early sixties, as I remember them, often included songs about a "broken heart." I don't doubt the loss of her husband at such an early age (he was only 36) broke her heart in more ways than one and lasted the rest of her life. Something tells me there was more to her choosing those records than the melody they offered. "Broken hearted Melody" by Sarah Vaughn; "I can't stop loving you" by Ray Charles; "I am so lonesome I could cry" by Johnny Tillison; "What becomes of the broken hearted" by David Ruffin; "Crying" by Roy Orbison; and a few years later I added one of my own titled: "How can you mend a broken heart" by the Bee Gees. My mom wholeheartedly agreed it should be in her collection as it was also in my own. I am no exception and we have all had that experience in which we would claim a "broken heart" experience. Unfortunately, we often are not limited to only one. But... "the Lord heals the brokenhearted."

We say so as we recite this weekend's responsorial psalm, some of us with hearts healed and some of us with hearts still broken. And God is not finished with us yet. Perhaps our healing is yet to come. Don't give up hope. I lived with these songs and the strong faith life that my Mother passed on and practiced with my brother and I. Like the story of Job, there is always a ray of light and hope in our stories even the ones with chapters of a broken heart.

Most of us are familiar with Lourdes, the Catholic shrine in southern France built at the place where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a young girl, St. Bernadette Soubirous, in 1858. Pilgrims today continue to throng to our Blessed Mother's shrine, hoping to be cured of their ailments. Over the decades, thousands have left behind their crutches and braces as silent witnesses to the Lord's power to make them well. This sort of thing is, of course, nothing new. Sites of holy apparitions and miraculous healings ranging from Lourdes (France), Fatima (Portugal), Guadalupe (Mexico) and Medjugorje (Yugoslavia; [not yet authenticated by the Church]), to the holy sites in our own land, have drawn pilgrims from all countries throughout the ages. These seekers have made their way to sacred temples, grottoes, and hillsides in the hope of finding healing and strength. Some dismiss such journeys of Faith as childish piety, inappropriate in an age of therapeutic advances such as our own. But healing is an essential element of the Gospel message. Our hearts can be healed. "The Lord Heals the Broken Hearted." Surely, Jesus, whose Sabbath day of preaching and healing ministry is described in today's Gospel, will not disappoint us today when we are assembled around the altar seeking his power, healing, and favor in our own lives.
