

#### First Reading:

#### QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

#### First Reading:

After Israel's return from their captivity in Babylon, Isaiah prophesied the Lord's salvation to all people of faith and good will, not just Israel. Why do you think some people resist the idea of God's impartiality?

#### **Second Reading:**

Paul sees the rejection of Jesus by the Jews as the vehicle for God's mercy to all, both Jew and Gentile alike. When has God turned a negative into a positive in your life?

#### **Gospel Reading:**

Jesus initially reacts negatively to the Canaanite (Gentile) woman in a manner familiar to most Jews of that day. But Jesus showed the disciples that faith in him transcends the historic divide between Jew and Gentile. When have you allowed your faith in Christ heal a division?

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? \* CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### **Question:**

Why are Catholics required to give money to the Church?

#### **Answer:**

Offering money and other goods to God and the Church is, before all else, a statement of gratitude. We see this when we look at how our spiritual ancestors showed their gratitude to God for the gifts they had received (e.g. Genesis 14:18-20 and Genesis 28:16-22). One of the ways they offered thanks to God was through a practice called "tithing," in which 10 percent of a person's goods (crops, livestock, money, etc.) were given back to God.

Today, the practice of tithing — giving 10 percent — is still common in many Protestant communities, but it is not required for Catholics. Instead, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to [their] own abilities" (no. 2043). This means that, although we are not bound to practice "tithing" in the traditional sense, we do share a responsibility to share our money or other resources with our parish communities. Like our spiritual ancestors, we give as a sign of our gratitude for the many gifts that God has given to us. Beyond this, we also share our resources with other Catholic organizations to help them finance their ministries, to continue and grow their outreach to the poor and the needy, and to provide just wages for their employees.

How much we give depends on our individual circumstances, but since we share a responsibility for the programs, outreach, and health of our parish communities and Catholic organizations, this question gives us a wonderful opportunity to ask some important questions about the quality of our giving and what our priorities are. Remember, we are only stewards of our time, talents, and treasures and as the First Letter of Peter reminds us, "As each one of you has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied graces" (4:10)


### How to become Catholic? RCIA is the answer!

St. Francis de Sales asks the simple question in his sermon for the assumption: What son would not bring his mother



FROM THE DESK

The Assumption of Mary is not only a demonstration of God's deep love for her, but his fitting response to her faithfulness to his will and it reminds us of our own future glory which will be ours if we too strive, aided by grace, to live a life of faith and obedience to God's will.

Blessed Mother Mary Assumption into heaven reminds us of our own destiny. Christ our Lord is like an artist. Artists showing their works hang their finest paintings. So, Too, Jesus attracts all of us to the destiny that awaits us by setting before us Mother Mary as the most sublime expression of his redemptive work, because of which all of us believe will rise one day body and soul glorified like Mary. Just as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will come to life again (1 Cor 15:22).

This means that we are like a tulip plant. In spring this flower has a beautiful body but by the time fall comes, the tulip's body loses all its beauty and at winter only a bare bulb remains. So, too, at the fall of our lives, our body would lose all its beauty and strength because sin would have taken its toll in our human nature. However, when the time of our resurrection comes, we will emerge with a beautiful new body.

Mary not only reminds us of our destiny but, while on earth she also showed us how to reach our destiny. The way she showed was one of faith and saying always "YES" to God's will, accepting his plan that he has marked for each of us. If we follow the same way, God will do mighty works in and through us also.

But we need to take note of this: Mary was able to live a life of faith and absolute surrender because she was also aided by the grace of God. It is so with us and the grace is available to us through Mary. We need therefore constantly to pray to her, which must not be difficult.

By her Assumption she has not disappeared from us. She has only assumed a new and more powerful way of being with us. As Dutch catechism says, "Mary is more in the world now than any other woman. Cleopatra is remembered. Mary is addressed. She is the most closely present of all women." Because Mary is with us, we honor her with shrines. Hence today we pray to her: Draw us Mary to your Son our Master and Savior.
