

#### Reflection for the 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary time

'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Many people say that marriage is not an easy thing that is why you have to weigh the cost before getting into it. Once two people are engaged and decide to marry, their life can't be the same again. They have to sacrifice their former way of life and embrace the life of married people knowing that they have new responsibilities and status. That is why a real loving relationship costs.

In the same way, we all who have been baptized are engaged to Christ in a special relationship, and we perfect this relationship every time we come for the Eucharist, and this engagement costs. We can't be followers of Christ and remain attached to our old bad habits, or ideas, behaviors and actions that go against this relationship. Instead, just as two lovers commit themselves single-heartedly to each other, so is Christ expecting us to sacrifice all obstacles and distractions no matter where they come from. It is because of this that in the Gospel today, Christ uses a very strong Semitic language, "to be my disciple you must hate your family"-this simply means that to follow Christ we have to be detached from all those things, actions or ideas, behaviors that take us away from remaining faithful to him and his teachings even if those things are as dear to our heart like, or come from, a wife or children or family.

We see this practically in the second reading. Paul's letter to Philemon, probably the shortest letter, is addressed to Philemon, a Christian member of the church at Colossae. Paul who was writing from prison most likely Ephesus around 55AD is aware of the practice of slavery at the time. Onesimus was the slave in Phile-

mon's household; he had run away probably stealing something of value from his master. He fled to Paul to seek refuge and during his time with Paul, he was converted to Christianity.

Paul would have kept Onesimus with him but recognized the proprietorship of Philemon and sent Onesimus back. The question many have asked is why didn't Paul condemn slavery? Well, Paul was prudent given that slavery was deep in the institution, if he had overreacted, Philemon could have done anything to Onesimus, even as worse as killing him. So, Paul, instead of attacking the institution to bring an end to slavery, chose to change the hearts of believers who in turn would do what was necessary to end the inhumane treatment of people. He urges both Philemon and Onesimus to see each other from a different angle, not as master and slave but as fellow believers or followers in Christ. He challenges them to be true and authentic followers of Christ.

So for the sake of following Christ, each person in this letter had a cost to pay. Paul, though in prison, had to forego the help that his "child" in faith offered him.

Onesimus also had to return to his master and face the consequences of his actions - stealing. And Philemon was being called upon to forgive Onesimus and even more than that, elevate him to the level of "brother." All that was the cost each had to pay to remain faithful to the personal relationship with Christ. What about us? Are there some things, actions and habits that we need to renounce so as to be more faithful disciples? Jesus tells us: "...anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

Father Chrispine has asked me to let the parishioners know about the parish finances on an regular basis.

First of all, I want to thank those who give to the parish on a regular basis. We have parishioners who give weekly or monthly by using the envelopes system or using Online Giving. Secondly, we have people who give loose checks, currency and coins in the offering basket each week. We receive \$400 to \$800 each week from these generous givers. These are the funds we count on to keep our budget going. Sometimes we receive bequests or larger donations that help, but these cannot be counted on.

You may wonder about the money we get from our rentals. We do have two major leases for the school building that bring in roughly \$10,000 each month. Sadly, we have our two houses currently vacant so we have lost about \$3,700 in monthly income. Added to that is the expense of getting them ready to rent again. This loss of income will affect our budgeting for this fiscal year. There are two ways to make up the difference: Spend less and/or make more. The staff is working on the former by reevaluating our expenses. To make more, we need to have some really great fundraisers and/or increase donations.

As we move into fall, we will be looking at some of these options. Please pray for our parish to find good people to rent our facilities, and pray for great ideas and energy for fundraising.

#### **Echoes of Faith**


We need adult helpers in our religious education program and Children's Liturgy of the Word.
