## For Those Returning to the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

If you have not partaken of this sacrament for some time, the following is a good refresher to prepare a good confession and receive a renewed spirit in time for Christmas:

**Greeting:** The priest welcomes the penitent warmly and greets him or her with kindness.

**Sign of the Cross:** Then the penitent makes the Sign of the Cross, which the priest may also make.

**Confession of Sins and Acceptance of Satisfaction:** The penitent confesses his or her sins and accepts the prayers or deeds that the priest proposes as a penance.

**Prayer of the Penitent and Absolution:** The priest asks the penitent to express sorrow by praying one of the prayers found in the ritual or in his or her own words. The priest then prays the Prayer of Absolution, to which the penitent responds: "Amen."

**Proclamation of Praise and Dismissal:** The priest continues: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good." The penitent responds: "His mercy endures for ever." The priest then dismisses the penitent, using one of the formulas found in the ritual




## "rejoice ye"; "take ye pleasure in".

In the readings, we hear about miracles associated with the Messianic age, its coming, and what we need to do to prepare. We also learn about the doubts of John the Baptist, how he dealt with them, and the blessing that makes us even more fortunate than John was.

What significance does this have? Advent is the season of preparing for the arrival of the Lord Jesus (both his first coming and his second coming), and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through the season. Thus it is appropriate to rejoice as we see the goal of the season approaching: "The Lord is near."

What is the appropriate liturgical color for this day? In this mass the color violet or rose is used
