Message from Fr. Joe



Our gospel this weekend is about the greatest commandment. Jesus points out not only one but two commandments. The first is: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second commandment is "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

These two commandments are quite inseparable; one cannot stand without the other. Our love of God expresses itself in our love for our neighbor. Neighbor means anyone who comes within our reach be it our family or friends and even our enemy. But there is more to just lov-

ing our neighbor. God commands us to *love your neighbor as yourself*. In the book of Leviticus, Moses tells us that the way to holiness is summed up in the commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself... and loving your neighbor means not to hate them, by not making false judgments, by not seeking revenge and by not holding grudges." From this we can say that to love you neighbor as yourself, involves self-abandonment and self-sacrifice.

My dear friends, today's gospel readings challenge us not only to know and love our neighbor, but also to take a good look at ourselves. Do we love ourselves more than our neighbor? Do we pick and choose our neighbor? Are there limits in loving our neighbor?

And so this weekend, let us reflect on these two greatest commandments. They are not easy commands to follow, but they are words of wisdom that tell us how to love God and our neighbor and gives us the light of who we are in Jesus' life and who is our neighbor in Jesus' name.




