ADVENT SERMONS

The Advent sermons have been a fascinating journey; curiously begun by a request to study C.S.Lewis' infamous book entitled *The Screwtape Letters*. Having read much of Lewis' work long ago, I again picked up his other well-known work, *Mere Christianity*. Serendipitously it is divided into four (4) sections. I wondered if the four sections might correspond with, or inform, the three advent and Christmas eve sermons this year.

The next piece of inspiration was a series of sermons I heard Fred Craddock preach back in the early 1990's: *What Is The Church Anyway*? Craddock began his series with a covered wagon stopping shortly at a general store in Dallas, Texas on its way out west. The clerk asked the driver of the wagon, "What'cha got in the wagon?" To which the driver answers, "I've got a church!" The clerk says, "What? You can't have a church in there. It's too small." And the driver begs to differ, "Oh, yes I do. I've got a pew in there, and a pulpit, and a baptismal font." And with each piece of the "church", Craddock spins a tale of what the church really is, anyway. I'm no Craddock, but these two masters have inspired Advent preaching.

OUR EVERGREEN 'ANGEL TREE" COMES FROM THE TRADITION OF THE JESSE TREE

A Jesse Tree is a decorative tree used during Advent to retell the stories of the Bible that lead to Jesus's birth. Since Advent is a season of waiting, a Jesse Tree helps build joy and anticipation as we wait for Christmas.

Jesse Trees have three main parts: A tree, symbolic ornaments, and passages or scripture readings to go along with them. Jesse Tree readings are designed to be read each day of Advent, and highlight the key stories throughout the Old and New Testaments that connect to Jesus. Each story/ reading has a corresponding symbol/ornament that is hung on the tree each of Advent.

The term Jesse Tree comes from this verse in the book of Isaiah 11:1: *There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.* In this verse, Isaiah predicts the coming of Jesus. He is telling the people that, one day, a great ruler will rise up from the descendants of the great King David. Jesse was David's father. This was exciting news to the people of Isaiah's time. Many of the kings who ruled after David weren't very good rulers. They led their people away from worshiping God. Eventually David's kingdom split in two and faded away; and Isaiah's prophecy of a stump shows how the family of David had been "cut down". But Jesus would be like a new growth/a new hope for the kingdom that was once strong and worshiped God as one. <u>https://www.myjessetree.com/what-is-jesse-tree/</u>

A Jesse Tree tells the Biblical story of God's greatest gift to us, Jesus. Our Angel Tree represents this continued tradition of giving gifts to others. We have decided to, once again, help the 20 clients of *Evergreen Life Services* with no family. The Christmas Tree near the Fellowship Hall will have pockets with cards inserted that have presents listed on them. The clients were asked to name one present and one snack favorite to receive. When the members of our congregation choose a gift, there will two pieces of paper in the pocket. One is the gift tag to be placed on the gift and the other is for a signature of who is buying the gift. Please return the small paper with your name on it back to the pocket and take the gift tag for your present. This year we are only responsible for 40 gifts total. They need to be wrapped and returned to the tree by **Friday, December 22nd** in order to be picked up over the weekend.
