#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Thanks to your most generous support during 2010, increased income from burials, lot sales, and publications sales, and ever increasing returns on our investment portfolio, Prospect Hill saw an increase in overall revenues in 2010 of 12.5% to \$86,000. Expenses also increased, by 15.4% to \$77,700. Major capital expenditures in 2010 included a new Scagg lawn mower.

#### ALL ARE INVITED TO HELP ON CLEAN UP DAY AT THE CEMETERY

Spring has sprung! And it's time for some spring cleaning at our Prospect Hill Cemetery. Superintendent Connell says there is plenty to do, but he also says he could use a little help.

So your Board of Trustees has designated Saturday, May 14, at 10:00 a.m. as our second annual Clean Up day to make sure our historic cemetery will look it's best for our annual lot owners' meeting and memorial service on Memorial Day, May 31.

So get out your rakes, brooms, clippers, weed wackers, old shoes, work clothes and gloves in readiness for the big Memorial Day weekend when many relatives and friends of those buried here visit and decorate the graves of their loved ones.

Best of all, refreshments will be available to the volunteers when the work is done. In case of inclement weather, call the cemetery office for a decision on canceling the program.

# ONLY EIGHT BURIALS PERFORMED, TWO SITES SOLD LAST YEAR. MANY CHOICE BURIAL SITES STILL AVAILABLE TO PURCHASE

As in years gone by, only a small number of burials were performed at Prospect Hill in 2010. Superintendent Connell oversaw only eight interments, one more than each of the last two years. Three interments were full body burials. The other five were cremains burials.

And only two burial sites were sold in 2010.

It has been declared an historic site in a beautiful setting high on a hill in the capital city of the United States with the capital building just down the street. What more convincing site could you ask for or find?

#### PROSPECT HILL ESCAPES MAJOR DESTRUCTION AFTER FEBRUARY STORMS

Despite the severe wind, ice and snow storms in February, our cemetery escaped any major destruction reports Superintendent Joe Connell. R & R Tree Service came out only once during that period to remove large fallen limbs and one small, old dead tree near the hill in the upper right border of the cemetery.

Superintendent Connell was kept busy, however, shoveling snow around the front porch area of the gatehouse and along the North Capitol street sidewalk.

#### PROSPECT HILL HONORS VETS BY PLACING FLAGS ON THEIR GRAVES

Memorial Day weekend is always a special time of the year at Prospect Hill. That's when Superintendent Connell and members of your Board of Trustees honor United States military veterans buried in our cemetery by placing American flags on their graves similar to the annual ritual performed at Arlington and all national cemeteries.

To make certain we do not miss your ancestors or family members who served in the U. S. military please fill out and mail the form on the last page indicating on whose grave(s) you would like flags placed. There is no charge for this service.

#### PLEASE CALL FIRST AND MAKE AN APPOINTMENT

At times, folks have entered the cemetery unannounced seeking help or direction from Superintendent Connell and found no one at home. Since he is our only employee, his duties sometimes take him away from the cemetery. He suggests you call first and make an appointment.
