The Duke of Edinburgh's SILVER Award

The Duke of Edinburgh's Silver Award is available to any of our students in Y10. If your child has already achieved the Bronze Award, they will not have to complete the sections for as long as someone who is starting the Award for the first time (a direct entrant).

Cost

The cost for the DofE Silver Award account is £25.

This covers the cost of the student's registration fees, the Welcome Pack and online DofE account (eDofE). This money cannot be reimbursed once paid as the Welcome Pack stays with the student until the age of 25.

How it works

At silver level, students need to commit 6 months (12 months for direct entrants) of their time to work towards the three sections listed below and then take part in a small expedition later in the year:

Section	If you have already completed the BRONZE Award	If you have NOT completed the BRONZE Award
Volunteering	6 months (24 hours)	Direct entrants must do a further 6
Physical	One section for 6 months (24 hours) and	months in the Volunteering, or the longer

	Qualifying Expedition: 3 days, 2 nights	Qualifying Expedition: 3 days, 2 nights

Temporary Changes to DofE

Temporary changes to the DofE rules allow for a greater flexibility in terms of what can count towards the different sections – students can complete any sort of volunteering at home e.g. helping around the house, helping younger/older siblings, ringing older relatives to check in on them. In the event that we are not able to run the Expedition section as usual, the changes to the framework allow for the Expedition to take place on the school field. The temporary changes will remain in effect until 31 December 2022.

Additional Costs

Should the Expedition be able to go ahead later in the year, there will be an additional cost for the expedition for the campsite fees – we estimate the total cost of the expedition to be in the region of £30. Students will be provided with a tent, rucksack, sleeping bag, compass, gas stove & cylinder and survival bag. Students will need a pair of walking boots and waterproofs as well as food for the expedition.
