
Whatever the outcome,



I am constantly being asked what to do to spruce up citrus trees. There is no great secret to any garden.

Success stories are simply attention to detail. One of the reasons that lemons, particularly, are small and dry is lack of water. So, the simple way to jazz up your lemon tree is take a garden fork and stand under your tree level with the outside spread of the tree canopy, work your way around the tree pushing the fork in to the depth of the tines. Work in to about a hand-spread from the trunk to avoid damaging the roots. Set a sprinkler or soaker hose very low and leave until the ground is thoroughly drenched. Using a full bag, spread blood and bone liberally in the same area and water in thoroughly. Using a sharp pair of secateurs, trim any spindly or damaged branches back to a robust upward-facing bud and generally tidy up the tree. Repeat this treatment coming into Autumn, and your reward will be a healthy robust fruit-producing asset to your garden. We will then put the results to a few lemon meringue pies.
