THE PULI CLUB OF AMERICA CODE OF ETHICS

- A. On breeding, a breeder should;
1. Breed only from stock that is itself physically and mentally fit.
 2. Breed carefully to improve the breed.
 3. Use all available means to determine that stock retained or sold for breeding purposes is free of inheritable diseases.
- B. On sales, a breeder should
1. Maintain a reasonable price within his locale which price should also be compatible with national prices.
 2. Intelligently and honestly classify stock as to show prospects, breeding prospects, or as pets.
 3. Not sell stock with AKC papers if it may be a potential detriment to the breed. However, the seller should hold the registration available for future needs, such as Obedience or Field Trials. (Withholding the AKC registration requires a written agreement between seller and buyer).
- C. On showing, a breeder should:
1. Show and encourage the showing of high quality stock.
 2. Exhibit only the most creditable ring department and accept only the services of those professional handlers whose behavior is exemplary.
 3. Help the novice exhibitor and breeder. Use constructive, kind and honest criticism.


Dear Miss Kirkpatrick:

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

The annual board meeting of the Puli Club of America, Inc. was convened at the Town & Country Motel, Warren, Ohio September 21, 1973.

Minutes of the previous board meeting were read and approved as corrected.

Committee reports:

Treasurers report not made due to the absence of the Treasurer.

Mrs. Robert Coleman read the report of the Ways and Means Committee, a copy of which is made a part of these minutes. Miss Kirkpatrick thanked this group for their excellent effort.

Mrs. Iverson reported that the Trophy Committee had collected \$460. in donations. Reported that supply of medallions was exhausted, a motion was made, seconded and carried that new medallions be ordered and that presentation be made to champions of record owned by Puli Club of America members at next annual meeting with presentations retroactive to 1973. Members to apply in ample time to allow claims to be checked in Gazette. A notice is also to be sent to all Show Superintendents that our former offer is no longer valid and should be deleted from copy of show giving clubs.

Mrs. Skolnik reported that no figures were yet available to give for Annual Meeting and Specialty Show.

Mrs. Monday reported that plans were progressing for Spring Specialty Show to be held with Oshkosh Kennel Club the third weekend in May, 1974. Specialty will be held on Saturday with the Sunday show twenty miles away at Winnegamie Kennel Club. Judges selected by the Board for the Specialty is Mr. Bracey with Mrs. Mangrum being selected to do the Sweepstakes assignment.

This report led to considerable discussion from the floor with Messrs. Becker and Mischka questioning the manner in which the Board was and had selected Specialty judges, their feeling being that the present method of selecting judges from the show giving clubs slate did not allow the membership the opportunity to voice their choice. It was also brought out that PCA did not have the funds available to pay for their judge if they selected someone not on the judging panel. Messrs. Becker and Mischka cited that the Puli Club of Southern California had a much better working arrangement with the Kennel Club of Beverly Hills.

Comment was made that this club would undoubtedly receive more consideration on these matters since they held their show in the same location each year while PCA moves their show every two years.

O. F. A. POLICY CHANGE

Based upon the professional recommendations of the Canine Hip Dysplasia Symposium and Workshop held in St. Louis, MO on Oct. 19-20, 1972, the Board of Directors of the OFA have suggested the following change in the procedure followed by the Dysplasia Control Registry effective January 1, 1974.

THAT THE MINIMUM AGE FOR THE RADIOGRAPHIC CERTIFICATION OF NORMALITY WITH RESPECT TO CANINE HIP DYSPLASIA BE 24 MONTHS OF AGE AT THE TIME THE RADIOGRAPH WAS TAKEN.

Although severe types of HD can be identified at a relatively early age there is evidence that some dogs which appear normal at 6-18 months of age will show radiographic signs of HD at a later age. The OFA radiologists will continue to evaluate pelvic radiographs of dogs at a young age, however only those that are two years of age or older at the time of the radiograph, will be eligible for the assignment of a breed OFA number.

A Proposed Canadian Selective Registration Scheme for Control of Canine Hip Dysplasia

A selective registration scheme, designed for the Canadian Kennel Club but not yet adopted by it, is proposed for genetic control of canine hip dysplasia. In the scheme it is recognized that heritability of genetic predisposition to hip dysplasia is low. Hence, individual or mass selection against the disease will result in very slow progress, but selection based on family performance should give rapid progress.

Individual animals demonstrating genetic freedom from hip dysplasia would be recognized by official notation on their registration documents. Four notation categories, each one more desirable than the one preceding it, would be established:

Category 1.—The individual animal is shown by radiographic examination to have normal hips. Upon presenting documentary proof to the kennel club, the registration certificate of the dog would be amended to recognize its superior genetic worth.

Category 2.—The individual animal and its sire and dam are shown by radiographic examination to have normal hips.

Category 3.—The individual animal and four or more full siblings are shown by radiographic examination to have normal hips. Proof of normal hips in sire and dam is desirable but would not be compulsory; if progeny are normal, parents have demonstrated their breeding worth.

Category 4.—The individual animal and its progeny are shown by radiographic examination to have normal hips. For a male to qualify, documentation must be presented for four offspring from each of three unrelated dams. For a female to qualify, documentation must be

presented for four offspring from each of two unrelated sires.

The purpose of the scheme is to encourage use of selection based on family performance rather than on individual performance alone—or, selection of genotype rather than of phenotype.—*R. D. Crawford and M. M. Kaye, Saskatchewan, Sask., Canada.*

THE SAN FRANCISCO CHRONICLE recently had an article about a remarkable breed --the Puli. The result was a deluge of mail (about 40 pieces at last count) to our new secretary, Dee Rummel.

MR. DUNCAN WRIGHT appeared and testified before a hearing in Washington, D.C. in regard to regulations on animal shipment. He presented findings from an independent testing lab. on the strength of boxes used by some shippers as well as other data. Duncan was recently on Detroit TV -- Channel WXYZ.

THE CALIF. BILL - AB 77 has passed the Assembly & is now in the State Senate. Would appropriate \$50,000. to Univ. of Calif. for fertility control research. A small amount but a step in the right direction for all dogs everywhere.

PEG SCHUSTER, an owner of "Bondi" - the Specialty BOW wrote the following to our secretary: We would like to thank the Puli Club of America for the lovely silver plated mug & wine coasters they donated at the Sewickley Show and the beautiful silver mint julep cup and picture frame donated at the Trumbull show. Being new at this - these were Bondi's third and fourth shows - we were quite surprised to see all the beautiful things Bondi had won. Our sincere thanks.

Should Pets Travel by Air?

Thousands of them do annually. But some critics say airlines mislead the public as to the treatment they will receive; that it's really (mis)treatment. This interview with Bruce Gebhardt, Director of Cargo Sales and Services, provides United's side of the story.

Q. The March issue of *Consumer Reports* magazine criticized airlines' handling of pet shipments and said they mislead owners as to the actual conditions of pet travel. Before we get into specifics, do you have any general comment?

A. I think it would be a lot better if some of the people who do these "consumerism" articles would take time to really get the facts. I say that not just with respect to the *Consumer Reports* article but also a recent TV show done in Washington which was critical of the airlines — United in particular in this same regard.

If they had done a little more research, I think both the article and the TV program would have been much more helpful to the public.

Q. How many dogs does United carry in a year?

A. About 50,000 in 1972. Of that total, an estimated 30 died while in our care.

Company experts — and we have a number of employees who are knowledgeable dog breeders and owners — say that about 10 of the 30 probably would have died under any circumstances because some dogs just aren't suited for travel. They get overly excited and perish from heart attacks or other nervous causes.

Q. The article states that United's Guide to Pet Travel says "they travel in heated, pressurized comfort just like you in our air conditioned aircraft." It goes on: "Since

no airline has air conditioned baggage compartments, the United pamphlet is a cruel deception." It also questions whether baggage compartments provide enough oxygen for pets.

A. Unfortunately, there's a grain of truth in the statement about the pet guide. On review, it appears our copywriter was a little too enthusiastic, but the guide could hardly be characterized as a "cruel deception."

The compartments we designate for live animal shipments are heated and pressurized in flight. They are not air conditioned (except for Compartment C on the 747s and the floor level compartments on the QCs and freighters, which are temperature controlled). In other words, they are not cooled by any means other than the outside air.

Under certain circumstances then, if a flight is delayed on the ground for a long time, the temperature in the animal compartments could build up and — in rare cases — reach an extreme that would be fatal to an animal. This possibility is why, during the summer months, we suggest people choose early morning or late evening flights for their pets' travel.

Q. Are we going to re-do the Guide to Pet Travel?

A. Yes, but only to remove the slight inaccuracies. Basically, it's an excellent guide and very helpful to pet shippers. Many veterinarians and dog breeders have said so.

Incidentally, tests have shown that inflight temperatures in the pits designated for animal travel usually range between 40-50 degrees Fahrenheit and 60-70 degrees. These are perfectly suitable for carrying animals comfortably.

Q. What about the oxygen supply?

A. As far as oxygen is concerned, there's no problem in the specific compartments in which we put live animals provided other cargo isn't loaded in such a way that it blocks circulation of the air. We also specify that animals should not be put in a compartment where dry ice is being used because it forms carbon dioxide which can cause suffocation.

Q. Do we work with outside dog breeders, veterinarians and others as well?

A. Yes, we stay in touch as much as we can. We're happy to work with anyone who feels we're doing something wrong or who can help us benefit from their experience.

Q. What instructions do our ground personnel receive in this regard?

A. They're told which pits on which aircraft are designated for pets and what size animal fits what size kennel.

Ground personnel also are instructed how much breathing space to leave around the different size kennels and how much other cargo can be carried in a pit along with animals.

All in all, they're given a fairly thorough briefing as to what's required to carry animals safely.

Q. Do we specify any particular care for pets when they're on the ground?

A. We tell our people to use common sense and to treat them like human beings. That means you don't leave a dog in a kennel sitting in the hot sun, for example.

In general, we try to be careful and to treat them like our own.

Q. What are the major problems encountered with pet shipments?

A. Two major problems are heat and putting a big dog in a small kennel.

Some dog owners seem to feel — for economy reasons or what have you — that their big dog can go in one of our small kennels. Sometimes, they're insistent. This causes problems.
