Entering the final week and 10 games of regular-season play, 10-of-12 seeds remain up for grabs for next week's Pac-12 Tournament, including the coveted No. 4 seed and its first-round bye as well as the regular-season champion and No. 1 seed.

>> Should there be a tie for first, the group of tied teams will be crowned regular-season co-champions. Seeding will then be determined by tiebreak procedures (Pg. 7 of notes).

For the first time in Conference history, three teams have reached the 25-victory plateau during the regular season. It marks the seventh season in league history that at least three teams have reached 25 wins (2006-07 (4), 2007-08, 2008-09, 2012-13, 2014-15, 2015-16, **2016-17**).

Three Pac-12 teams are ranked in the top 10 of this week's AP Top 25 poll in #3 UCLA, #6 OREGON and #7 ARIZONA - the only conference in the nation with three in the top 10. It marks the fifth week this season the league placed three teams in the top 10, the second-longest stretch in league history.

- Averaged 18 points on 52 percent shooting (16-31) in Oregon's road sweep through the Bay Area.
- Scored seven of his 22 points in the final 2:36, including a go-ahead jumper with 58 seconds left before his second game-deciding triple of Pac-12 play with 0.2 seconds left in 68-65 win over California.

PAC-12 TIPOFF

DRAWING A CROWD: 98 games into the 108-game Pac-12 slate, league contests are drawing 8,624 fans per game. That mark would be the highest average since the formation of the Pac-12 for 2011-12, besting the 8,380 during 2015-16, which featured an 8,323 average through 98 league games.

EVERY GAME'S A BATTLE: Through 98 league games as of Feb. 26:

- >> Average scoring margin is 12.9 ppg.
- >> 45 have been decided by single digits.
- >> 16 have been decided by one possession (3 pts or less).
- >> 9 decided by a team's final possession.
- >> 3 overtime games (4 total OT periods).

HOME SWEET HOME: OREGON owns the nation's longest home court winning streak at 42 consecutive games. The Ducks (2016-17) have joined ARIZONA (1988-91, 1998-2000, 2014-15) and STANFORD (2003-04) as the only Conference programs to go a perfect 9-0 at home in consecutive league seasons.

INSIDE THE RANKINGS: ARIZONA's 95 consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 dates back to 2013 and is the second-longest nationally behind Kansas' streak of 159. OREGON's stretch of 25 consecutive appearances is its longest in program history, surpassing 21 from 2007-08.

RECORDS WATCH

ARIZONA's **Sean Miller** is the 21st coach in league history to reach 100 career Conference victories. His .741 winning percentage in league games (106-37) is fourth to only **John Wooden** (.810), **Lute Olson** (.764) and **Jim Harrick** (.743) among those to reach 100 wins.

OREGON (6.8 bpg, 2nd in NCAA) is ahead of WASHINGTON's Pac-12 single-season record block mark of 6.59 set last season.

ARIZONA STATE is only the fourth team in league history to reach 300 made three pointers in a season along with OREGON (350 in 2007), WASHINGTON (305 in 2011), and OREGON (304 in 2002). UCLA (293) is also on pace to join the Sun Devils this season.

While not on pace to break marks, UCLA's offense has proven to be one of the most-prolific in modern Conference and Division I history as it would rank among the best of the past three-plus decades in several categories:

>> 91.6 PPG - highest in league since 1990-91 (UCLA, 92.3), highest nationally since 2008-09 (VMI, 93.8)
 >> 52.9% FG - highest in league since 1987-88 (ARIZ, 54.5%), highest nationally since 1991-92 (Duke, 53.6%)

>> 21.7 APG - highest in league since assists became official NCAA stat in 1983-84, highest recorded in Conference since 1979-80 (OSU, 21.7), highest nationally since 1995-96 (Kentucky, 21.8)

>> 293 3FG - Sixth-most in a season in league history

At his current clip of 23.2 points per game, WASHINGTON's **Markelle Fultz** is aiming to become the first freshman to lead the league in scoring since CALIFORNIA's **Shareef Abdur-Rahim** in 1995-96 (Conference freshman record 21.1 ppg). Fultz would be only the third freshman to pace the league in scoring along with Abdur-Rahim and **Cliff Robinson** (USC, 1977-78). He's on pace to be the first Division I player since 1997-98 to average at least 23 points, five rebounds and five assists in a season.

With 219 assists, UCLA's **Lonzo Ball** is already third on the Pac-12's freshman single-season assists list. At 7.6 apg, he's on pace to shatter the rookie mark of 229 set by OREGON STATE's Gary Payton in 1986-87. Ball is on pace to be the first Conference player to average at least 14 points, seven assists and six rebounds in a season since Jason Kidd in 1993-94.

UCLA's **Bryce Alford** has entered the Pac-12 career top 10 in three-point field goals as his 307 triples (5th active in NCAA) are sixth all-time. Alford's 1,832 career points are the most among active players from Power 6 programs (17th active in NCAA) and rank 30th in Conference history.

ARIZONA STATE's **Torian Graham** (95 3FG) has cracked the Conference's single-season top 10 in made threes, currently in 10th place. UCLA's **Bryce Alford** (94 3FG) is close behind.

The 54 career double-doubles for WASHINGTON STATE senior **Josh Hawkinson** are the highest active total in NCAA Division I. Hawkinson is also fifth among active Division I players in rebounding with 982 career caroms, a total which currently ranks tied for 17th in Pac-12 history, 10 shy of 15th place occupied by WSU career leader Steve Puidokas and UCLA's Don McLean. He's on pace to be the 13th player in league annals to reach 1,000 career boards.

OREGON junior **Jordan Bell** (208 blocks) has moved into sixth on the Pac-12's career blocked shots list, while COLORADO senior **Wesley Gordon** (196 blocks) is just behind in eighth and OREGON's **Chris Boucher** (182) is nine shy of the top 10.

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

DILLON BROOKS, OREGON Junior, 6-7, F, Mississauga, Ontario

- National Player of the Year candidate Dillon Brooks earned his third Pac-12 Player of the Week award of the season and fourth of his career in voting conducted by media who cover the league.
- Brooks averaged 18 points on 52 percent shooting (16-31) in Oregon's road sweep through the Bay Area, highlighted a team-high 22 points and the game-winning three pointer with two-tenths of a second remaining in Wednesday's 68-65 come-from-behind victory at California.
- Brooks scored seven of his 22 points against the Golden Bears in the final 2:36, including a go-ahead jumper with 58 seconds left before his second game-deciding triple of the Conference season.
- Brooks' fourth career weekly honor is tied for the most ever by an Oregon player with Blair Rasmussen (1983-85) and Kenya Wilkins (1994-97). His three selections this season match the most in a single season by a Ducks player (Jerry Adams - 3, 1985-86).
- Brooks appears on the current finalist lists for the John R. Wooden and James Naismith National Player of the Year awards and the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE-SEEDING & TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding: The seedings and pairings shall be determined upon completion of regular season play on Saturday, March 4. The won-lost percentage record of the teams in regular season Conference play will determine tournament seedings. The team with the best won-lost percentage in Conference play will be seeded #1, the next best won-lost percentage in Conference play will be seeded #2, and so forth through all the seeds.

Tie-Breakers: Tie breaking procedures for determining all tournament seeding will be:

1. Two-team tie

- Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season.
- Each team's record (won-lost percentage) vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record (won-lost percentage) against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- Won-lost percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.

2. Multiple-team tie

- Results (won-lost percentage) of collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams.
- If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record (won-lost percentage) vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating teams with inferior records, until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record (won-lost percentage) against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

If at any point the multiple-team tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

- Won-lost percentage against all Division I opponents.
- Coin toss conducted by the Commissioner or designee.
