GRATITUDE: Choosing Gratitude: Learning to Love the Life You Have, by James Autry

"In his latest book, Choosing Gratitude: Learning to Love the Life You Have, renowned author James A. Autry reminds us that gratitude is a choice, a spiritual—not social—process. Made evident as behavior, gratitude is not the behavior itself. We may automatically respond, "Thank you" or "Appreciate it" in the daily course of our lives. These are polite, conditioned responses, but they are not gratitude. Instead, gratitude is a way of life, a belief system, that means cultivating a spirit of thankfulness even through the negatives of life. It is remembering there will always be more reasons for gratitude than for despair.

In a society consumed by fears of not having "enough"—money, possessions, security, and so on—Autry suggests that if we cultivate gratitude as a way of being, we may not change the world and its ills, but we can change our response to the world. If we fill our lives with moments of gratitude, we will indeed love the life we have."

We were definitely tired each evening, but it was a good tired. It was the kind of tired that is felt when you've done your best and you've given your all. We'll never know all the effects of our time and efforts in Slidell, but we were truly touched to be part of God's Plan A for five days.

PROGRAMS AT CFUM

The Breakfast Club is a year-round breakfast program for children, serving an average of 80 children during the school year, and an average of 60 children during the summer months. In conjunction with the Breakfast Club are the **Power Hour** where academics are supported, and the **Power Breakfast** where volunteers read and mentor students. **The Supper Club** provides an evening meal for 110-150 adults and children Monday-Friday and 40-60 adults and children on Saturday.

The Haven is an after school program offered to 50 children during the extended school year at Moulton Extended Learning Center daily. It offers literacy enrichment and homework help along with recreational and creative activities for grade-school children. **Backyard Boyz**, and **The Whyld Girls** are gender-specific programs for middle school students.

Awesome Days takes place Monday through Friday during the Moulton school breaks. Educational components such as reading, writing, computer skills, math, art, cultural activities, and field trips fill the days.

The **Back-to-School Health Fair** is held annually in July. The fair offers physicals, dental and vision screenings, school supplies, and a tent-full of neighborhood agencies available for families with children returning to school.

Friday Fun Night and Community Celebrations and a Winter Clothing Closet are other programs available.

Day gift baskets after each service, through April (13) 14.

They may be picked up either May (4th) 5th, or (11th) 12th.

Earthen Vessels

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart....But we have this treasure in earthen vessels so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.

- II Corinthians 4:1,7

In April, we will be receiving members on two different Sundays. On April 7, we will be receiving our New Members class. We had originally scheduled our New Members class to be received in March, but two different snow storms caused us to postpone two class sessions. That's the first time I can remember that happening. I admire the perseverance of our New Members class. They have hung in there through the whole process. Then, on April 14, our Confirmation class will be joining. We have enjoyed good learning times and good experiences together and it will be a joy to receive our youth as members of the church.

I remember reading an article by Bishop Gerald Kennedy, in which Kennedy was responding to someone who was discouraged because they thought when they joined the church that they were becoming a part of a holy fellowship that would make everyone kind of holy who was a part of it. They were surprised to discover that the church was filled with imperfect people who sometimes got upset with each other, who could sometimes spend a lot of time on petty things, and who could sometimes make poor decisions. The lay person was discouraged to find out that church committees could be just as inefficient as the committees of his lodge. Kennedy said that the lay person had assumed

that he was joining the fellowship of the saints and he discovered his church was filled with people who were still sinners, which took him by surprise.

It would have been no surprise to Paul. Paul had to deal with imperfect people, even within the church. The church at Corinth was a prime example. There were factions within the church, and disagreements between those factions. Paul said that we have the "treasure" of the Gospel in "earthen vessels." We are imperfect carriers of the Gospel message. And yet, God, by His grace, has given us the gift of being bearers of the good news that in Jesus Christ, God has come to save us.

Karl Barth says that there is no place for idleness or indifference in the Christian community. Even though we are unworthy of this ministry, still God, by His grace, calls us to this task. We cannot use the excuse that we are imperfect, and therefore, we ought not to try at all. Because of God's grace, we may share in His ministry. Barth puts it like this: "the members of the Church, in all their humanity, are invited to share in God's own work of proclaiming His Word." And when we share in God's ministry, we might well be amazed at how God can use us to bring His love and grace to others.
