

The year started out with high expectations to make progress on the restoration of the '60. I finally got the body into media blasting after spending a good couple of weeks cleaning the underside of the car with alcohol to get rid of all the grease and road grime. With the body now stripped of paint it became clear that there was more damage to the front section of the car than was originally expected. So the decision was made to replace the entire front clip (dash-forward). Unfortunately, by the time the new clip arrived it was well into

summer (i.e., hot and humid). So the car sat for a number of months and then finally in November I got back to the project. As you can see from the picture at right, the front clip has been removed (in one piece, btw). So the next steps are to clean (grind) the remaining bonding material and then media blast the now exposed areas. Once that is done, then the new clip will be fitted and glued (yup—the car is literally glued together). Maybe by the next newsletter I can show pictures of the new front clip in place.
