P-EBT Team



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What is Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT)?

Through P-EBT, eligible school children receive temporary emergency nutrition benefits loaded on EBT (food stamp) cards that are used to purchase food. Children who would have received free or reduced price meals under the National School Lunch Act if their schools were not closed or operating with reduced hours or attendance.

Student Eligibility Requirements



A child is eligible for P-EBT benefits if two conditions are met:

- 1. The child would be eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program were operating normally. This includes children who are:
 - directly certified SY 2020-2021, or a)
 - b) certified through submission of a household application processed by the child's school district for SY 2020-2021, or
 - enrolled in a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school or a school c) operating under Provisions 2 breakfast and lunch
- 2. The child does not receive free or reduced-price meals at the school because the school is closed or has been operating with reduced attendance or hours for at least 5 consecutive days in the current school year. Once the minimum 5 consecutive day threshold is met, children are eligible to receive P-EBT benefits for closures or reductions in hours due to COVID-19.

Free/Reduced Application Eligibility



- During COVID over 90 percent of our SFAs are serving free meals under SSO and SFSP.
 - Resulting in a large number of families who have not submitted an application to the SFA.
 - Deadline May 1st for submission timeline.
 - Superintendent's office & Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) has been marketing the P-EBT program on CNP webinars/townhalls encouraging the submission and processing of a Free/Reduced application for those families that qualify.

Standard for P-EBT Eligible School Status



- The school is closed (including any delayed start or early closure to the school year), or the school is operating with reduced attendance or hours.
- School closures do not include weekends, weather related closures, or days when the school is closed due to a holiday or regularly scheduled break (Thanksgiving, Holiday Break, Spring Break, etc.).
- The period of closure or reduced attendance or hours must meet the current school year minimum 5 consecutive day threshold before any child is eligible for P-EBT benefits. Once the minimum 5 consecutive day threshold is met, children are eligible to receive P-EBT benefits for closures or reductions in hours and/or attendance due to COVID-19 for the rest of the school year.

- 12/22/2020
 - New Language of P-EBT in congressional law
- <u>2/1/2021</u>
 - Updated P-EBT template for plan submission
 - Guidance on childcare included at this time
 - New updated dollar figures (next slide)
- · 2/23/2021
 - Superintendent's office worked with DHW on the submission of an Idaho P-EBT plan to USDA.
- <u>3/23/2021</u>
 - Plan approved by USDA
- <u>9/30/2021</u>
 - Expiration date and all monies must be spent by this date

Benefits to students



- Students may have different benefit amounts
 - Each student will get a separate card
 - Benefits are unique to the school learning model at each <u>school</u>.
 - A family with more than one child could potentially have different dollar amounts put on each child's P-EBT card.

Responsibilities of the Superintendent's office



- Superintendent's office to develop software for SFAs to enter information.
 - Working with software vendor, April
 - Testing with schools and DHW, May
 - Uploads from schools with eligible children in May to be transmitted to DHW in June
 - Disburse payments in July
 - All payments must be issued by September 30th

Responsibilities of the Superintendent's office Cont.



- Superintendent's office will contract for Call Center Support
 - will field common questions from households of children that are eligible and potentially eligible to participate in P-EBT,
 - ensure that all children who are eligible are able to receive their P-EBT benefits
 - refer disputes to schools and answer eligibility questions

Questions



- How many students are estimated to be eligible?
 - Because the Superintendent of Public Instruction's office continues to get updates from school districts, the eligible number of 71,110 is only an estimate
- What is the projected amount of funding to come to Idaho?
 - The Superintendent has requested \$1.6M in admin funds.
 - DHW has requested \$1.8M in admin funds to issue individual cards
 - Families are estimated to receive \$21,237,058 (but this is still being calculated and verified)

P-EBT Website



Idaho School P-EBT

Through P-EBT, eligible school children receive temporary emergency nutrition benefits loaded on EBT (food stamp) cards that are used to purchase food. Children who would have received free or reduced price meals under the National School Lunch Act if their schools were not closed or operating with reduced hours or attendance for at least five consecutive days are eligible to receive P-EBT benefits.

Idaho State Department of Education is the lead agency for the Idaho School P-EBT.

A child is eligible for P-EBT benefits if two conditions are met:

- The child would be eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program were operating normally. This includes children who are:
 - a. directly certified SY 2020-2021, or
 - certified through submission of a household application processed by the child's school district for SY 2020-2021,
 or
 - enrolled in a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school or a school operating under Provisions 2 breakfast and lunch
- The child does not receive free or reduced-price meals at the school because the school is closed or has been operating with reduced attendance or hours for at least five consecutive days in the current school year. Once the minimum five consecutive day threshold is met, children are eligible to receive P-EBT benefits for closures or reductions in hours due to COVID-19.

How Can Individuals and Organizations assist?



- Outreach to include information that <u>not all children in Idaho qualify</u>. It depends on their schools predominant learning mode and the child's free/reduced status in 20/21.
- Linking to SDE website
 - We encourage organizations to link to the SDE website instead of building a website of their own. This will ensure accurate and updated information as the program progresses.
- Encouraging families to update addresses and apply for free or reduced meals before May 1st.

Payment Information - FAQ




- When will the first families receive their money?
 - The Superintendent's office plans on having schools submit one upload with data starting around May 2021 and submit eligible payments to DHW for children by June/July 2021.
- Is a FAQ document available?
 - Yes, this is available on the Idaho State Department of Education P-EBT website.

Will funds be placed on a Quest Card?



- The P-EBT Card will be a white card with black print sent to each eligible child in an amount calculated by eligible school.
- Each child's benefit may be different.
- The Superintendent's Office will not be able to track any spending from the card.





Childcare Settings?



- What about childcare settings—will Idaho Food Stamp Program consider this understanding ISDE is school age only?
 - The Superintendent's office is leading the public school P-EBT program.
 - The approved plan does not include childcare P-EBT.
 That data is housed at DHW.
 - You will need to contact DHW concerning the childcare P-EBT.
