

Blast off with a summer full of space-themed programs



A celestial programming spectacle sure to excite any space enthusiast will begin in July.

PBS's Summer of Space will begin in July, timed to the 50th anniversary celebrations of the Apollo 11 moon landing.

The centerpiece of the programming is the six-hour *American Experience* film *Chasing the Moon*, written, produced and directed by Academy Award nominee Robert Stone.

The film will premiere on three consecutive nights at 8 p.m. July 8, 9 and 10, then encore weekly at 7 p.m. Tuesdays on July 16, 23 and 30.

The film tells the story of the space race, from its earliest beginnings to the monumental achievement of the first lunar landing in 1969.

The Summer of Space lineup also will include:

- Antiques Roadshow: The "Out of This World" special episode, premiering at 7 p.m. July 8, features stellar appraisals including NASA memorabilia, space travel treasures, science fiction finds and more.
- **8 Days: To the Moon and Back:** Rare mission audio takes viewers inside the

Apollo 11 in this new documentary from BBC Studios, premiering at 8 p.m. July 17

- NOVA: Two new specials include Back to the Moon at 7 p.m. July 10 and The Planets at 8 p.m. July 24
- Ancient Skies: This three-part series, beginning at 7 p.m. July 24, will show how centuries of knowledge, experimentation and engineering helped our ancestors explore outer space.

"Our Summer of Space programming lineup invites PBS viewers to visit the farthest reaches of the universe, blending past and present to celebrate both the 50th anniversary of the moon landing and the latest advances in space exploration," said Perry Simon, chief programming executive and general manager of general audience programming at PBS.

The Summer of Space interactive hub will be housed on PBS.org. Throughout the summer, viewers are invited to submit videos, photographs, audio recordings, or text entries about how they experienced the Apollo mission and/or about their interest in space exploration in general.

From 2 to 4 p.m. July 18, Clifford will appear at our annual Summer Splash, a kid-friendly event at the splash pad at Memorial Park. 2501 S. Washington St., just down from the Panhandle PBS studios on Jackson Street.

Other events will be announced on our Facebook page.

Fun-filled episodes follow Clifford and his pals (both canine and human) as they play, discover and interact with each other and the inhabitants of Birdwell Island, learning that good friends are what life is all about.







Celebrate Independence Day on the 39th annual A Capitol Fourth



A Capitol Fourth will air at 7 p.m. July 4.

John Stamos will return as the host of PBS's *A Capitol Fourth*, America's national Independence Day celebration.

The country's longest-running live national July 4 TV tradition puts viewers front and center for the greatest display of fireworks anywhere in the nation lighting up the iconic D.C. skyline.

The concert will air at 7 p.m. July 4 and encore at 8:30 p.m. afterwards.

This time-honored 39 year-tradition will kick off our country's 243rd birthday with all-star musical performances by Colbie Caillat and

Gone West, Carole King and the cast of the musical *Beautiful*, Keala Settle (*The Greatest Showman*), Vanessa Williams, Lee Brice, Yolanda Adams, Angelica Hale, Laine Hardy and the National Symphony Orchestra.

The concert will also pay special tribute to our men and women in uniform with a special performance by Stamos with the MusiCorps Wounded Warrior Band, featuring injured veterans who became musicians through MusiCorps, the music rehabilitation program that helps wounded warriors play music and recover their lives.

Now in its 68th season, Wonderland Park offers family fun for tourists and Panhandle residents alike.

The park began as Kiddie Land, the dream of the late Paul and Alethea Roads, opening Aug. 12, 1951. In 1969, it became Wonderland Amusement Park and continued growing thanks to the addition of dozens of rides, many built by hand by Paul Roads.

The park's summer hours run through Labor Day.

Today, the park attracts more than 200,000 visitors each year with its thrill rides, coasters, water rides, kids rides and miniature golf.

The park also is a valued supporter of Panhandle PBS.




