Welcome back to the Writers' Corner. We want to take this opportunity to share a little about how writing is taught at North Pointe, and to assure you that rigorous writing instruction is part of the English Language Arts curriculum at all grade levels. Our School Based Decision Making Council (SBDM) has adopted a writing policy specifically addressing writing instruction and progress monitoring. Our policy addresses our philosophy and expectations for writing instruc-

tion. Policies are reviewed periodically and amended when appropriate. We think you will find our standards for writing instruction maintain our tradition of excellence here at North Pointe. Below is our rationale for the components of our policy. In later editions of this section of our newsletter, we will provide specifics regarding expectations for writing experiences offered to students.

SBDM POLICY STATEMENT

Communication through written expression is an essential component of a well-rounded education. North Pointe Elementary will ensure each student experiences a variety of opportunities for written expression across curricula and will provide intentional research-based instruction to ensure the academic success of all students in written communication.

The Dream Out Loud Challenge

Kentucky students in grades K-6 have a chance to win \$1,500 toward college and \$500 for their school in the "Dream Out Loud Challenge." Students are invited to submit an original drawing, poem, essay or video answering the question: "How will I change the world after I go to college?" Materials are now available in the school office!

The challenge, sponsored by the Kentucky Education Savings Plan Trust (KESPT), is intended to remind families that it is never too early to start saving and planning for higher education.

One winner will be chosen from each of two submission categories — drawing or video and essay or poem—in grades K-2, grades 3-4 and grades 5-6. The winning students will receive a \$1,500 KESPT college savings account, and their schools will win \$500. The contest runs January 21 through March 22, 2013. Entries must be postmarked by March 22 and received by March 27.






The PTA board is gearing up for some of our most exciting events. As with every event, it couldn't happen without parents and teachers volunteering to be on the planning
