Matthew 13

¹That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. ²Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. ³Then he told them many things in parables, saying: “A farmer went out to sow his seed. ⁴As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. ⁶But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. ⁷Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. ⁸Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. ⁹He who has ears, let him hear.”

¹⁰The disciples came to him and asked, “Why do you speak to the people in parables?”

¹¹He replied, “The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them. ¹²Whoever has will be given more, and he will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken from him. ¹³This is why I speak to them in parables:

“Though seeing, they do not see;
though hearing, they do not hear or understand.

¹⁴ In them is fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah:

“You will be ever hearing but never understanding;
you will be ever seeing but never perceiving.

¹⁵ For this people’s heart has become calloused;
they hardly hear with their ears,

and they have closed their eyes.
Otherwise they might see with their eyes,
hear with their ears,
understand with their hearts
and turn, and I would heal them.’

¹⁶But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. ¹⁷For I tell you the truth, many prophets and righteous men longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

¹⁸“Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: ¹⁹When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is the seed sown along the path. ²⁰The one who received the seed that fell on rocky places is the man who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. ²¹But since he has no root, he lasts only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, he quickly falls away. ²²The one who received the seed that fell among the thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke it, making it unfruitful. ²³But the one who received the seed that fell on good soil is the man who hears the word and understands it. He produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown.”

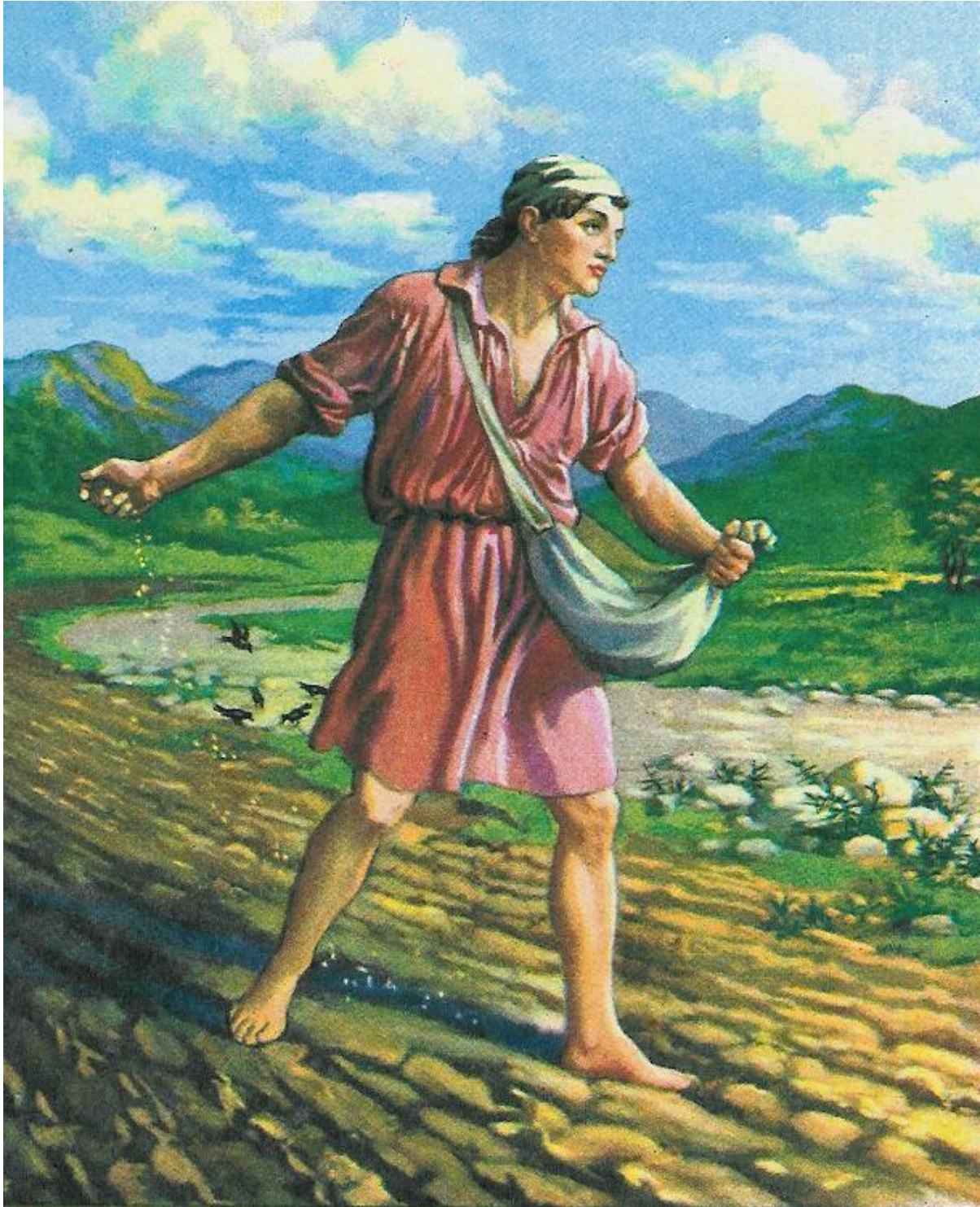

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: SEED PACKETS

Students will make “seed packets” to remind them how some seed fell on rocky places, on the path, among thorns, and on good soil.

MATERIALS

1. 67 Lb. White Cardstock
2. Seed Packet Patterns
3. Scissors
4. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
5. Flower Seeds
6. Glue or Tape



DIRECTIONS

1. Make copies of the “Seed Packet Pattern” for each student onto 67 lb cardstock.
2. Have students color the seed packet with crayons, markers, or colored pencils.
3. Instruct students to cut the seed packet along the solid black lines.
4. Students will then fold on the dotted lines.
5. The two tabs on the sides of the seed packet pattern may be glued or taped to the back side of the packet.
6. Fill the packet with flower seeds and glue or tape the top tab closed.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are coloring their seed packets, review the meaning of the parable of the sower. The seed that fell on the path is like someone who hears the gospel message, does not understand it, and the devil snatches it away. The seed that fell on the rocky places is like the one who hears the gospel message, receives it with joy, but because it has not root, it lasts only a short time. The seed that fell among the thorns is like one who hears the gospel message, but the worries of life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke it out. The seed that fell on the good soil is like one who hears the gospel message, understands it, and it produces a bountiful harvest.

TIME NEEDED TO COMPLETE:

Approximately 15 minutes

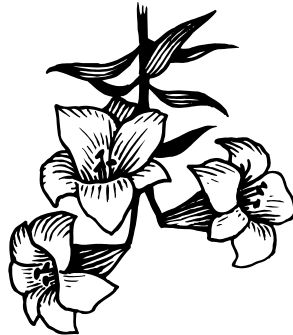

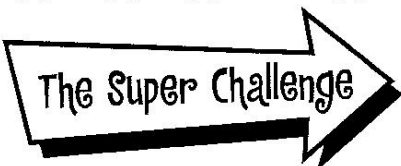

THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER



As Jesus sat by the lake, a large crowd gathered around him. Jesus got on a boat and taught the people as they listened from the shore.

Jesus told the crowd a parable. A parable is a story with an earthy and heavenly meaning.

Jesus told the story of a farmer who went out and planted seeds. As he did so, some of the seed fell on the path and the birds ate it up. Other seed fell on rocky soil where there was no soil so the seed sprang up quickly but then died. Other seed fell among thorns which choked the plants. And finally, some seed fell on good soil where it grew and grew.

Jesus then explained the heavenly meaning: "When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The one who received the seed that fell on rocky places is the man who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since he has no root, he lasts only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, he quickly falls away. The one who received the seed that fell among the thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke it, making it unfruitful. But the one who received the seed that fell on good soil is the man who hears the word and understands it. He produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."

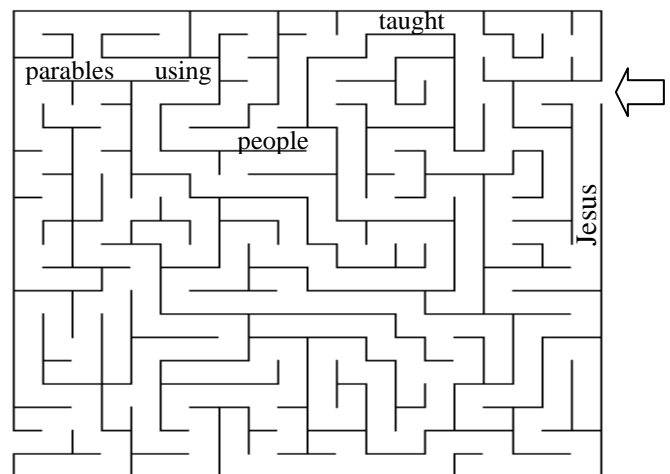

PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: Balloons (one for every four children)

Challenge your preschoolers in this game based on the parable of the sower.

Make groups of four. Have each group make a small circle, and assign one of the following roles to each of the four children in each group:

- **Birds** put their hands at their ribs and flap their arms like bird wings. They can only use their “wings” to bat the balloon.
- **Rocks** put their hands at their sides and stand very still. They can only use their heads or shoulders to bat the balloon.
- **Thorns** put their hands at their sides. They can only use their legs and feet to kick the balloon.
- **Good dirt** stands relaxed. They can use either their hands or their feet to bat the balloon.

Say: **Today we are going to see how well you can pass the balloon around your group. You can only hit the balloon in the way I showed you, no matter what other people in your group are doing. Let's see how many times you can pass the balloon around your group.** Let the children trade roles and try this activity in each of the four roles. Ask: **What was the easiest way to play our game today?** Say: **When seeds fall on good soil, they grow quickly and easily. Our hearts are like good soil when we hear and do what God tells us to through the Bible, our church, and our parents.**

This game can be simplified for younger children by showing them one action at a time and having all the children perform the same action together.
