Over the past few months, the joy of announcing pregnancies has been shared with me from four couples experiencing infertility, some of whom have struggled for years to conceive. I've been privileged to witness to the joy the Creighton Model brings to married life while instructing engaged couples preparing to use this method of family planning in their upcoming marriages. Even greater is the joy expressed between married couples working to integrate their sexuality with daily life experiences. By far, the greatest joy comes in the simple knowledge that the miniscule role I play in teaching these couples the Creighton Model enriches their vocational call to marriage and strengthens family life. What great JOY!
