Dangerous "Super Pill"

Prescription pain killer drugs such as Xanax, Oxycodone and Percocet are being mixed with deadly amounts of fentanyl and is being called the new "Super Pill". Sold illegally on the street, the "Super Pill" looks just like legal prescription pills and can quickly lead to death for users.

Central Florida and the Tampa Bay area are the main locations where the new illegal drug has been found but Attorney General Pam Bondi warns that the issue needs to be discussed across the State. "Please, please, please just talk to your kids about it," she said. "Don't take anything if you don't know what it is, because when they are cutting it with fentanyl some of these kids are dying within seconds. I say kids, but some of them are in their 20s and older."

When prescribed legally, fentanyl is a pain medication stronger than morphine and is given to people dealing with severe, chronic pain.

At least 10 deaths in Florida have been linked to the use of fentanyl-cut drugs.

Marijuana continues to rank first among the most used illicit drugs in the United States, according to SAMHSA's 2014 National Survey on Drug Use and Health. Marijuana use was most prevalent among people age 18 to 25. Among youth, heavy cannabis use is associated with cognitive problems and increased risk of mental illness.
