DEAR LORD,

Proverbs 15:1 reminds me that harsh words will only stir up more anger!

In Nahum 1:3, You are described as slow to anger and great in power. I want to be more like You. I want to be understanding and speak softly so the problem can be resolved—but this attitude doesn't come naturally to me. So Lord, don't let me sin by allowing anger to control me as Psalm 4:4 warns. Instead, give me enough self-control to think about the situation overnight and let You fight my battles as You have promised to do in Romans 12:19.

Thank You for always being there when I need You and offering to help me through all my troubles, including the trouble I'm having right now with my anger! AMEN.
