Parish Advent Communal Penance Service: The Sacrament of Reconciliation— God's Unconditional Love for Us!

In recent years, a name change has taken place with the "Sacrament of Confession." We no longer call the act "Confession," but rather "Reconciliation" and/or "Penance."

This name change better reflects what happens in this celebration. We do not go to the priest just to list our sins, have them forgiven, and receive a penance; but rather, and most importantly, we come to the priest to celebrate the forgiveness of God that we experience in our lives. We come to the Sacrament with a sense of joy for what God has already done in our lives and what God continues to do—showering us with unconditional love.

The verbalization of our sins, the verbalization of the words of absolution, and the acceptance of a penance are steps in the process of celebrating God's forgiveness and unconditional love for us.

If we are open to God's love, we begin to experience the many ways in which God forgives us our sins in the daily occurrences of our lives.

When we ask forgiveness from someone we have offended, our sins are forgiven. When we accept the forgiveness of another, our sins are forgiven. Each time we talk to God in the silence of our hearts and sincerely seek forgiveness from God, our sins are forgiven. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we hear the words of the priest shortly before the reception of Holy Communion—"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world! Happy are we! We are called to His supper!"—our sins are forgiven.

So why go to the priest? We do so in order to celebrate the forgiveness of

God we experience in our daily lives, to ritualize it, sacramentalize it and, as in all things, to place our lives and God's involvement in our lives within the context of the Church, the Body of Christ.

The priest "stands in" for the community. As we verbalize our sins, we are mindful that there is no such thing as a personal sin. Our sins, no matter how personal we may think them to be, affect others—"No Man Is An Island." We live in community. Our lives always touch the lives of others.

Telling our sins, hearing ours sins from our own lips, helps us to be real and to acknowledge our weakness and our dependence upon God. It is so easy to rationalize our sinfulness when we talk to ourselves "in our heads." It is an entirely different experience when we hear ourselves verbalize our sinfulness. Those sins become much more real! We become much more aware and sensitive of our responsibilities to others.

The priest "stands in" for Christ. Hearing the words of absolution, the forgiveness of God, from the lips of the priest is indeed comforting. You know how wonderful it feels when a family member or friend says, "I love you!" In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we allow God to say those words to us in and through the person of the priest.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not something to be feared but to be celebrated with trust and confidence because of God's unconditional love for us.

This weekend, on Sunday, November 27, at 4:00pm our Parish celebrates her Advent Communal Penance Service. In this Parish celebration, a number of our young people will be celebrating this Sacrament for the first time. Your presence will also be a sign of support to them.

Many priest/confessors will be available for you. They will be in Church waiting for you so that through the words of absolution God will once again say to you:

"I forgive you and I love you unconditionally!"

Will you be there to hear God's words?

ADVENT

Summoned to a new beginning

in Rhode Island.

The season of Advent resets the clocks and calendars of Christian worship. The liturgical readings, antiphons, and music that the church gives us in this season attempt to broaden and stretch the rhythms and motions of Advent in our own lives. We await the coming of the Messiah as the ancient Israelites did. We wait for his coming in our own lives and his glorious coming at the end of time. The Advent treasury of the church inspires our imagination and heightens our sensitivity to the saving presence of the Lord.

The churches of France and Spain started to celebrate a preparation season before the feast of Christmas around the beginning of the fourth century. This season became universal in the church by the sixth century. In some places, the season lasted six weeks; in others, four weeks. Advent was originally



considered a kind of "second Lent" because the early Christians fasted, prayed, did penance, and confessed their sins much as they did during Lent. Even the liturgical penitential color of purple was shared by both Lent and Advent.

This ever-ancient, ever-new season of Advent summons us to a new beginning. Another year in the church's calendar of redemption begins. We enter into the Christmystery dynamic once again, and we are drawn deeper and deeper into our relationship with Christ. Through word and sacrament, the church invites us to encounter Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. Our encounter is not with a distant figure of the past but a daily contemporary. The Advent readings in the liturgy of the Mass and in the Liturgy of the Hours enable us to encounter Jesus in very concrete ways: in the Old Testament prophesies, we can relate to the struggles and hopes of the Israelites as they longed for the coming Messiah; in the Gospel readings, we can relate to the challenging journeys of Elizabeth, Zechariah, Joseph, and Mary.

Too often, Advent is considered merely a shopping season to prepare us for Christmas. Understood correctly, however, it is a season that prepares us for the three comings of the Lord: his coming as an infant in the incarnation, his coming as judge of the living and dead at the end of time, and his coming into our lives every day in big and small ways.

Christian Stewardship Gratitude: The Heart of Thanksgiving

In the U.S., Thanksgiving Day is a holiday that is among the nation's finest national traditions. Setting a day aside for giving thanks to God is not only a U.S. phenomenon. Canadians have a Thanksgiving Day, and many countries worldwide celebrate harvest festivals that express gratitude to God.

For Christian stewards, Thanksgiving Day has special meaning, for we know that gratitude lies at the very heart of stewardship. A grateful heart heralds the beginning of discipleship and opens the way to our deepest response, the desire to return to God for the bounty of our lives.

The French educator Jean Baptiste Massieu put it beautifully: "Gratitude is the memory of the heart."

For what do we thank our Creator? The early American colonists, who gave inspiration to the Thanksgiving Day tradition, were thankful for their very survival in a harsh and unforgiving environment. Many of their compatriots were buried in the soil of their new land, far from all that had been cherished and familiar.



It's natural to thank God when things seem to turn out the way we had hoped, when disaster is averted, when life seems filled with abundance.

Harder, perhaps, is the ability to thank God for being present to us in times of struggle, seeming failure, illness, and death, especially this time of year.

But, in the heart of the Christian steward, the memory of God's presence is a comfort and a gift all its own.

If we take time to reflect on our lives, we often discover that that for which we are most grateful was a gift which we struggled to receive. What came to us in the form of hardship has in hindsight revealed itself as gift. This is why each day's struggles and trials should be met with a heartfelt "thank you."

Meister Eckhart, the 14th century Dominican mystic, wrote, "If the only prayer you ever say is 'thank you,' that will suffice." At first, this seems puzzling. What of praise and petition? But Eckhart knew that the most genuine response, and indeed, the first and most spontaneous response of the heart which has discovered God, is "thank you." Gratitude lies at the beginning of true prayer.

As we reflect on this time of thanksgiving, let us be present to those moments when God's gifts were hidden in shadow and remember to be thankful for all.
