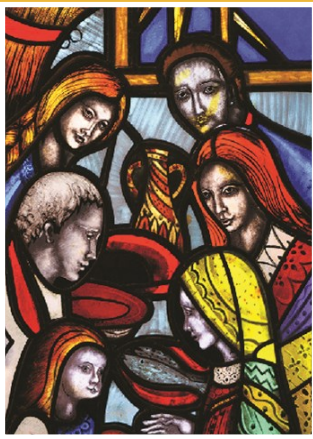

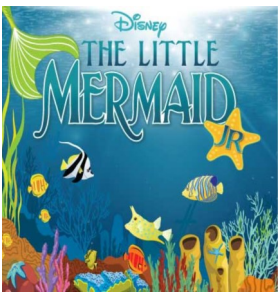

CATECHISM CORNER

Goal of ALL Things by Josh Miller



"Christians of the first centuries said, 'The world was created for the sake of the Church.' The Church is the goal of all things" (CCC 760).

I often think of the world being made for the sake of each human person or of God as the goal of all things. It strikes me as a little unexpected that the catechism gives the Church these two distinctions. The Church is a latecomer to creation history. Shouldn't the goal be to connect each of us individually with God?

Yes and no. It is true that Christ died for you personally. He knew your name as He hung upon the cross. It is also true, and equally important, that He died for mankind as a whole. More specifically, He died for the divine institution in which all of mankind is united to one another and to Him, the Catholic Church.

As human beings, you and I are communal creatures. We crave community. We can hardly survive or stay sane without a community to belong to. If you're doubtful, just watch Tom Hanks in *Castaway* with his friend, Wilson the volleyball. We gain identity, purpose, love, etc. from our communities.

That is why the Church, the community of men and women which follows Christ, is necessary. Thus, God directs all things, since the beginning of time, for the building up of His Church.

In our individualistic age, temptation to do it on our own is frequent. It is easier to say, "I just need Jesus to be holy." In practice, Jesus comes through our fellow Christians. Jesus does not just come to us as individuals. He does not call us to lock ourselves in a room alone with Him. He comes to us as a family, and we have many siblings.

God made everything in the universe as gifts to His family. Sports, movies, jobs, music, shopping, and meals can and should serve the good of His Church. How can you and I align our lives so that we do not just participate in the community of the Church on Sundays, but always live in unity with the Body of Christ?

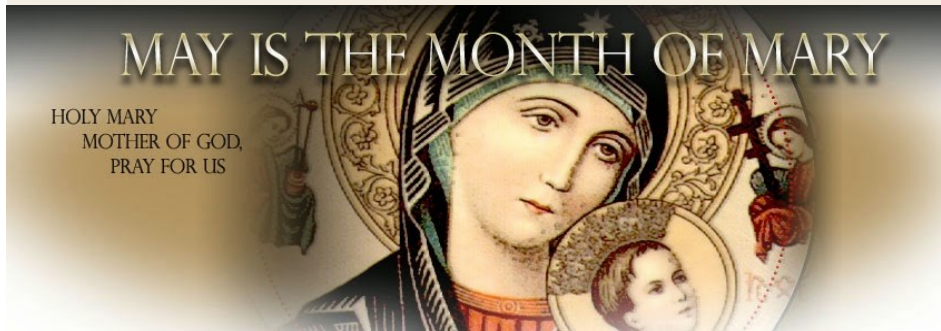
