

MASS ONLINE AT HOME

All morning and weekend Masses are to be offered without the physical presence of the faithful until Phase II. Masses may not be celebrated for small groups of the

faithful in chapels or homes. The only Masses allowed for Phase I are Funerals & Weddings.

VOTIVE CANDLES

During this time of celebrating Mass without the faithful, we know that many parishioners may have the need or desire to light candles in the church. If this is so,



please send an envelope to the parish office with your intention, and we will light the candle/candles for you.

When we are ready to celebrate Mass together, for your safety the votive candles will be covered. There will be a sign and envelopes available to request a candle to be lit for your personal intention. After the final Mass for each weekend at St. Casimir & St. Elizabeth, the candles will be lit by a staff member or minister and remain lit until the following weekend.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION AND PRIVATE PRAYER

St. Casimir Church will be open on Sunday, May 24th from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM for Eucharistic Adoration and Private Prayer. During exposition, the faithful are

invited to spend some quiet time of prayer and reflection in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord. Face masks must be worn before you enter the Church and the 10 person limit in the Church is still in effect. The benches will be marked where you can sit so that social distancing can be achieved for the health and safety of everyone.

FUNERALS, WEDDINGS & BAPTISMS

We can begin to celebrate Baptisms and Wedding & Funeral Masses during Phase I as long as we abide by certain Requirements. Individuals present, including liturgical ministers, can not exceed the State's restriction (currently 10-person maximum) on the number of people able to be gathered. Face masks are a requirement for everyone 2 years of age and up and seating must be according to the marked pews in the Church for social distancing. The physical greeting of friends and family at the entrance of church by the clergy is prohibited.

BEANS AND BREAD NEED OUR HELP!

For a number of years St. Casimir parishioners have generously prepared casseroles for Beans & Bread a local soup kitchen, due to COVID 19 Beans & Bread has suspended their casserole program.

We have been asked to provide bagged lunches for their Thursday and Friday meals a **combined total of 350 lunches for the two days.**

As such, we have committed to providing 350 bagged lunches every Thursday for the next month or so until Beans/Bread can be fully operational again and ask for you help.

The bagged lunches should include:

a meat and cheese sandwich of any kind, any variation, or just meat, or just cheese

Please NO PB&J due to peanut allergies

Any type of bread, however, please NO bread with seeds - (sandwich does not need to be cut) put into sandwich

bag or wax paper

a sweet treat/dessert

chips or something crunchy

fruit cup (only if possible) (No fresh fruit at this time)

Individually wrapped snacks/treats, bottled water or juice boxes are needed as they will be distributed to low income families and shelters
