UMW News

Happy New Year! We start out with grateful hearts for the great year we just finished with your support.

Thank you for your incredible generosity in supporting Pledge to Missions, which supports local and global ministries of the church. We sent more than \$6000 through our district from Shepherd of the Hills UMW.

Because of your support of our fundraisers, we supported local missions: South County Outreach: \$500; Southwest Community Center: \$500(plus helping with 6 meals) ; Orange County Human Trafficking Task Force: \$100; Beth Mueller Skid Row ministries: \$100 (plus over 150 pair of socks and reading glasses); Families Forward family meal including \$75 grocery certificate. We sent blankets to Choc Hospital, and tee shirts and hygiene supplies to Alabaster Jar, and lots of kits to our military through Operation Interdependence.

We sent \$400 to UMCOR for disaster relief, including fire areas in California. We contributed \$100 to the new Rehab Unit at the Methodist Hospital. We sent additional donations to our National Missions here in California: David and Margaret House; Toberman Neighborhood Center; Calexico Neighborhood House. We also supported Pure Water and Grace Hospital in Haiti.

We contributed \$900 to the Yugo project!!!! And gave a total of \$700 to SOTH Good Samaritan's Fund to help families in our on congregation.

Season of Epiphany Through February 14

The season of Epiphany begins on January 6 and runs until Ash Wednesday, February 14.

Epiphany Day is the day for remembering the wise men that came to worship Jesus in Bethlehem. Read Matthew 2:1-12 to review the story. Although we often put the wise men in our Nativity scenes with the shepherds and the baby in a manger, the wise men did not arrive until much later. Jesus may have been about two years old when they arrived.

The word epiphany is a Greek word that means, "to appear." The word epiphany, and the visit of wise men from far away in the East, reminds us that God has appeared in Jesus to reveal God's love to the entire world. The symbol of Epiphany used most often is the star. The star reminds us of the journey of the wise men from the East. It is interesting to note that the star is appropriate during this season, not Christmastime.

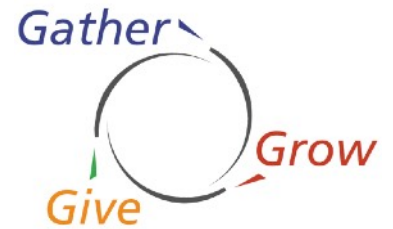
