PCC Foundation Scholarship

One application = 240+ scholarships Over 1,600 recipients in 2020-2021 2.1 million dollars!! Awards range from \$500-\$5,000 per year Average award is \$1,500 (\$500 a term)



PCC Foundation Application Deadline

PCC Foundation Scholarship Application opens 12/1/2020
Deadline for *most* scholarships is 3/1/2021
No preference for completing early
Students are notified early June through their PCC email



PCC Foundation Scholarships can pay for:

- PCC tuition
 - PCC fees
- Books through the PCC Bookstore
 - Some other educational expenses/equipment

Oregon Promise is a state grant that helps cover tuition at any Oregon community college for recent high school and GED® test graduates.



Recent Oregon high school or GED® test graduate 2.50+ GPA

2.50 cumulative GPA or higher



Attend Oregon community college within 6 months of graduation



Oregon resident at least 12 months prior to attending college

Your eligibility may also be determined by your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). The EFC criteria are subject to change. Check website for details.



Deadlines/Requirements

You must complete the FAFSA or ORSAA

List at least one community college on the application

Complete the Oregon Promise Grant application by the deadline

Deadline is 5pm (PST or PDT).

If deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, it automatically extends to 5pm on the following business day.

What does it pay for? How do I keep it?

- * Any remaining tuition balance after scholarships and financial aid
 - * If all tuition is paid then you get \$1,000
 - * Up to 90 college credits
 - * Must renew for the second year
 - * Must be enrolled in at least 6 credits per term

Half-time status while receiving a scholarship




Scholarships: What are we looking for?

Scholarship committees are looking at the whole student



How do scholarships work if I get financial aid?

 Think of your tuition and costs as a bucket. Then you fill it with free money first, then loans. Understand loans before you take them (subsidized vs. unsubsidized) and repayment plans.



Reviewing scholarship applications

Each application is reviewed by 2 trained employees or volunteers for PCC Foundation General Scholarships and those scores are averaged.


PCC Scholarship Officer reviews letters of recommendation and verifies that a students are qualified for each application pool before awarding

Some "apply to" opportunities are narrowed to a finalist pool and reviewed by appointed committees



Your dashboard

You can see if your application is complete and if your reference has been submitted through your dashboard.



The pieces of a scholarship application

- 1. PCC Admissions
- 2. Three personal essays
- 3. One professional/academic reference
- 4. Financial documentation (to be considered for financial need scholarships)

You can work on these steps anytime during the application cycle, not necessarily in order



College admissions

You must be admitted to PCC to apply for scholarships (G# required). If you are already taking classes, this step is already done. If not, www.pcc.edu/admissions


If you think you'll attend a different college next year then you need to apply at that school for their scholarships.



The application

The PCC Foundation application asks a lot of basic questions about you. Based on your answers to those questions, we are automatically matching you to the general scholarships you qualify for, to save you

time!



References (only 1 for general application)

How to do this

- Enter their name and email into your scholarship application (make sure you have it 100% correct)
- They receive an email from the system
- Follow up that they received it
- Follow up that they complete it
- If your reference is not submitted by the application deadline your application will be considered incomplete and won't be reviewed
- Send a thank you email/card to your reference when they are done

Who to ask?

- Professional or Academic only
- Teachers
- Advisors
- Program directors
- Mentors
- Coaches
- Volunteer supervisors
- Work supervisors
- NO friends or family members



To be considered for financial need scholarships you must complete one of these:

FAFSA

Complete your <u>FAFSA</u> as soon as you can


 PCC Foundation will receive the results from Financial Aid Financial Worksheet (mainly intended for International students)

- If you are not eligible for the FAFSA or ORSAA PCC Foundation offers a financial worksheet instead.

 - Upload it to your general scholarship application




Optional opportunities

- PCC Foundation
 - 350 word limit
 - Save a copy of your essays
 - Get feedback on your essays
 - Writing center
 - Tutoring Center
 - Advisor/teacher
 - Peer mentors

What are we looking for in each of your essays?



Career and education essay

- Explain your career goals and your education plan to meet those goals. What inspired you to choose this field of study and career?
- Detailed career goal
- Clear educational plan
- What inspired you?



Challenge essay

- Describe a significant challenge or change that has occurred in your life in the last ten years. How did you respond and what did you learn about yourself?
- Focus on one topic
- Focus on what you learned about yourself
- How will this make you successful in the future?



Freeform essay

 What have you done for your family or community that you care about the most and why?

- List one thing
- Why is it important to you?
- Why is this important in regards to your scholarship application?



Final tips

Check your spelling and grammar
Don't talk about too many topics
Be detailed
No texting language
Be personal
Start and submit ahead well ahead of the deadline!

We do not review late applications

Letters of reference must also be submitted before the 3/1/2021 deadline



Keep applying

Even if you don't get something, or if you do, apply for scholarships each year. It's a skill that you will get better with each time.
