

Art Zwerling - In Memoriam 1952 - 2014



On July 25, 2014, the world of nurse anesthesia lost one of its most vigorous supporters, and the AANA movement to address chemical dependency proactively lost one of its staunchest advocates, with the passing of Arthur Zwerling.

Zwerling's passion and enthusiasm for helping others was inspirational. He became ardently involved with wellness and peer assistance efforts.

Many lives were positively impacted by Art, many of whom never met him in person; he was the voice on the phone that calmly and knowledgably responded to CRNAs, SRNAs, family members and supervisors in difficult and often crisis chemical dependency situations, and he saved the lives of many.
