Secretary Says,

I have received many questions about the Academy of Reflection that our Valley is getting started. I found the following paragraph from the Guthrie Oklahoma Academy of Reflection that describes it very well.

"The Academy of Reflection offers encouragement and instruction to Scottish Rite Masons interested in the pursuit of inner work such as meditation and silent prayer. Scottish Rite Freemasonry is inherently holistic in its moral, social, and spiritual development of its members. It offers beautiful and inspiring ritual, profound and stimulating literature and appendant bodies for men with callings and interests of many sorts. However, despite our ritual and literature consistently referring to the importance of meditation and prayer in Masonic life, prior to the Academy of Reflection there was not organization within the Rite specifically dedicated to such pursuits. Men with these interests have been forced to seek light elsewhere, and typically, in non-Masonic organizations. The Academy of Reflection therefore offers such men opportunities to pursue contemplative interests within the rich contest of the Rite's symbolism, ritual, and literature, and to associate with brothers of like mind. The Rite in turn benefits from their increased sense of loyalty and attachment. Perhaps more importantly, the deeper insights that naturally come from inner work flow out into the Rite, enriching the experience of all members and enhancing the Rite's potential to assist with the transformation of their lives, their families, and their communities."

I hope this answers most of the questions.

Do you know... At the Orange County Childhood Language Center we work with children who have trouble speaking, listening, reading, writing and thinking. Our team of Speech Language Pathologists from Chapman University are certified by the American Speech Language Hearing Association (ASHA). The SLP is responsible for testing and working with our children to improve communication and speak to their families about the problems the child is having and what can be done to help. Because we work with Chapman University, our SLPs do a great amount of research to find new and better ways to treat our kids. Some of the disorders we treat are Aphasia (problems speaking, understanding, reading, writing, or using numbers), Apraxia (problems controlling mount muscles to speak clearly) and Cognitive-Communication Disorders (problems with memory, reasoning, problem-solving and attention). Now that you know more, please help us in any way you can, so together we can bring the gift of voice to these children.
