As the retreat chairperson I wanted to mention that we "grew" our retreats to 3 winter events instead of the 2 we have been having the last 12 years. And the reason for that was the crowded conditions we endured the last couple of retreats.

So, with consultation with our lovely hostess Janet Rochefort we went to the 3 retreats with a maximin of 24 retreaters per retreat. This way no one should feel crowded and can have more opportunity to enjoy each other and make new friends. Also no one who wants to go will be turned down. We have had lists of people on stand-by in case someone got sick.

We have a few more spaces available for the February retreat and more for the March retreat. The cost of the weekend covers two nights lodging and includes four great meals. Friday night dinner, two meals on Saturday, and Sunday morning breakfast. Rates are based on two to four people per room. If you want a single room there is an additional charge of \$50. The sewing begins Friday afternoon 1pm and will continue throughout the weekend. Please bring your own projects to work on. We will have some fun retreat projects as well.

Rooms are assigned on a first come first serve basis, per date of registration. Due to the growth of the retreat I cannot take requests for specific rooms.

## **GUIDELINES FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES**

- 1. Each entry requires a separate Entry Form. Copy or print as many as you need.
- 2. Quilts may only be submitted by an active member of the Pieces & Patches Quilt Guild.
- 3. Quilts must be made by a guild member in order to be eligible for the "People's Choice" Award.
- 4. Forms must be received by the end of the March 30, 2020 Guild Meeting.
- 5. As there are a limited number of racks to accommodate large quilts, large quilts will be placed based on entry date (first come basis).
- 6. Members may enter more than one quilt in the show. If there is not sufficient room to accommodate all entries that have been submitted, you may be contacted to prioritize entries.
- 7. Quilts (other than miniatures) must have a 4½" hanging sleeve to enable hanging on the racks. (Miniatures will be pinned to curtains hanging from the racks.)
- 8. <u>Each quilt</u> must be submitted <u>in its own cloth bag</u> (one cloth bag per entry, regardless of the quilt size) and must have a label sewn or pinned to the back of the quilt with the person's name and the name of the quilt.

## HINTS FOR COMPLETING ENTRY FORM

- 1. Completing form <u>electronically</u> (Word version):
  - a. Download the Word version of the form.
  - b. Click on each box to enter requested information. (Note: You can enter more information than the space appears to allow... just keep typing and the information will be stored in that box, even if it doesn't all show. Ignore the lines in the "something interesting" box.)
  - c. Click on the top line of the upper left-hand box to insert a picture of the quilt. (Don't worry if it moves or overwrites the words currently in the box.)
  - d. Save your file to whatever name you choose.
  - e. E-mail your document to djolson2005@hotmail.com.
  - f. If submitting more than one quilt, download the form again (or edit your existing document) and <u>save it to a</u> <u>new name</u>.
- 2. Completing the form in hard copy (PDF or Word version):
  - a. Download and print the first page of the Word or PDF version of the form. Print one for each quilt you are entering.
  - b. Please print legibly and complete the form.
  - c. Attach a picture in the upper left corner. Picture does NOT need to be large or on special photo paper.
  - d. Submit your form to Denise Olson at a guild meeting, mail it to address on membership list or scan the completed document and e-mail it.

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## Communications Committee First quarter Report 2019/2020

**S**pecial thanks to Ann Midkiff who has overseen the newsletter advertising for the guild for the past 11 years. During the period January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019 there have been 15 advertisers who have paid to have their businesses listed in the newsletter and/or the website. The Guild received \$1,200 in revenue during this period of time. \$225.00 of the total amount was paid for website advertising. Ann will be turning over the advertising responsibilities to Sue Kofflin within the next few months.

Our Facebook page continues to be very active with 437 "followers" and 428 "Likes" for the quarter covering September, October and November, 2019. Janet Rochefort(Immediate Past President) and Cheri Pickett(Past President) remain as Editors on the page with Rebecca Turner as Page Administrator.

Rebecca says "One of the goals of a Facebook page is to attract visitors to the organization's website. One of the Communication Team's goals for the first Quarter of 2020 will be to develop some strategies to achieve this action." Remember the Facebook page is a great place to ask quilting related questions, share photos of your latest quilting projects, and look for current area quilting events.

Anna Pedrotte, Newsletter Editor ,says "The quarterly newsletter for November was emailed to members before the October Guild meeting. 50 copies were printed and 20 were distributed at the Guild meeting or mailed. The remaining copies were given to membership for new member packets. Board members continue to do a wonderful job providing articles pertaining to what is happening in the Guild."

original copy of the newsletter will be sent out to all guild members via email or mail. With much appreciation, the newsletter editor will create a copy of the newsletter removing the personal emails and phone numbers. This copy will be posted on the website for the public to view. This new process is aimed at protecting the privacy of our guild members.

The retreats and workshops forms shown on the website have been reformatted so that viewers can download and print these forms more easily. The website has been online for approximately  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  years. As the community becomes more aware of the website, the Contact Us form is being used more frequently to ask about new membership, Guild donations, and monthly program information, etc. Overall, during the first quarter, the website was used for 413 session by 291 individuals.

As a part of the Communications Committee responsibilities, a Standing Operating Procedures (SOP) description is being developed for how to use the sound system and Guild equipment at the Guild meetings. A copy of these procedures will be kept in the Guild storage cupboard at Ella Sharp Museum along with the equipment used at the Guild meetings.

## 2019-2020 Quilt Challenge

You might include 30 of something (maybe 30 flying geese or 30 four-patches or 30 different fabrics or 30 buttons...) or make your quilt represent something that happened 30 years ago or when you were 30 years old...

Your quilt must have the dimensions of 30" x 40" or 40" x 30" because we hope to once again enter your winning quilts in the AQS show in Grand Rapids in 2021. It will need a sleeve on the back. You will also need to enclose a card describing your interpretation of '30'.

The challenge 'reveal' will be at the April 27, 2020 meeting. The fee for entering the challenge will be

\$5.00. Good luck with this challenge and most of all, ENJOY!

We are hoping to enter the winners from this challenge into the AQS show in Grand Rapids again next year, so do your best 'thirty-something' quilting!



# The When, Where, How and Why of Quilts

**T**he word quilt comes from the Latin word 'culcita' and the French word 'coilte'.

No one is exactly sure when quilting began. Did quilt making begin in the America's or Europe? Let's take a journey.

China, India, Persia (modern day Iran), the Middle East, early Egypt all used quilted fabric as clothing. Pieced patchwork was found in early Egypt dating from 3400 BC. Evidence of this was found on an ivory carving in the Temple of Osiris at Abydos, Egypt.

Forward to the 12<sup>th</sup> Century Europe. Quilting appears to have been introduced by the Crusaders. They wore quilted clothing as protection under or over armor or chain mail.

One of the earliest decorative quilts made in the 14<sup>th</sup> Century is the **Tristan Quilt.** It is one of the oldest surviving examples of medieval quilts in the world. You can see this on line at the **V & A Museum**, search collections V & A Online Journal, Issue No. 2 Autumn 2009, ISSN 2043-667x "Tales from the 'Colte'."

**The 1718 Silk Coverlet** is the Uk's earliest known dated patchwork. This can also be seen online by looking up **The 1718 Coverlet.** If you'd like to make your own 1718 Quilt, look up Susan Briscoe's book, *The 1718 Coverlet* for information.



The east coast of the United States have some of the oldest quilts housed in area museums. The east coast is where quilting came to shore. Wholecloth Quilts hold the honor of the earliest quilts from 1630's, 1660 and 1786 which are in museums.

Block style quilts were uncommon until the 1840's. There is very interesting history with most pieced quilt blocks and the fabric used to make them.

This is just a touch into the history of quilting. There is so much more!
