The math meet has students take an individual and a group test in the areas of algebra, geometry, advanced algebra, and advanced math. Each category can have at most six students participating. Dear Parents/Guardians,

Would you be willing to lose your home so your teen can have friends over and drink beer in your basement?



The Columbia County Connects to Prevent Substance Abuse Coalition wants you to be aware of a few facts:

- Parents who give alcohol to their teen's friends under any circumstances, even in their own homes, are breaking the law.
- Parents who knowingly allow a person under 21 to remain in their home on in their property while consuming or possessing alcoholic beverages can be prosecuted and everything associated with a violation can be confiscated, including personal property.
- Parents can be sued if they give alcohol to anyone under 21 and they burt someone, burt themselves or damage property.

Some parents have the attitude that "I did it when I was in high school, so what's the harm?" Realize that things have changed:

- When many parents were in high school, the legal drinking age was 18, and underage drinkers often consumed "3.2%" beer. The legal age for any alcohol consumption is now 21.
- Drunk driving laws are much tougher than in the past.
- Many more teens have automobiles at their disposal, and are driving farther to anend parties,
- Recent research into brain development of adolescents has revealed that underage drinking is the main eause of adult alcoholism. The average age when kids take their first drink in Wisconsin is 12.

Where do kids get alcohol? From you!

- According to the Wisconson Clearinghouse for Prevention Education, more than half of 9° graders who drink get alcohol from their own home et a friend's home. Seniors in high school obtain 1/3 of the alcohol they consume from frome or friends' homes.
- Two-thirds of teens said alzohol is easy to get from their home.
- One third of teens surveyed said parents supplied alcohol for them to drink.

What can you do to protect yourself and your teen?

- Secure alcohol you have in your home. put a lock on the liquor cabinet or extra fridge in the garage.
- Talk to other parents—do you want someone else deciding it's okay for your child to drink? Be sure the parents of your teen's friends know where you stand.
- Refuse to supply alcohol to teens or allow drinking in your home or on your property.
- Support police efforts to break up parties and report teen parties if you suspect alcohol will be served.

In the next few months, we'll be celebrating prom and graduations. Be aware of the health risks and legal consequences of providing alcohol to youth.

Annual Competitions Shine Spotlight on Academic Achievements

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Several annual competitions have taken place over the last month, allowing a number of Fall River students to get a look at the level of academic achievement that students at other schools have reached, and how their own efforts compare, using the standard of general knowledge in specific areas. Some of the highlights of these competitions include two individual trophies at the 7th and 8th grade Regional Math Meet, held in Juda on April 9th. The students competed in 4 individual tests including computation without calculators, computation with calculators, problem solving and mental math. There were about 70 students present. Fall River 8th grader Corrin W. earned the 3rd place trophy for overall points, and 7th grader Emma D. brought home the 4th place trophy, earning only 1 point less than teammate Corrin. Our team placed 3rd among the 9 teams competing.

The 5th and 6th grade Math Meet team came up against some really tough questions during their competition on April 2nd. They faced questions like this one in the Mental Math test " How many different ways can 5 students arrange themselves in a line?" The students had 10 seconds to respond, without using paper, pencil or calculators. The Fall River team placed 3rd out of 7 teams, with Caleb S. scoring the highest total of the local students.

The Wisconsin State National Geographic Bee was held on April 4th in Madison. The top 100 scorers on a written test are invited to the State Bee. For the 3rd time, 6th grader Josh F. faced up against Wisconsin's best geography students in grades 4 through 8. Josh went 7 rounds without missing any answers, but missed the last question, which asked for the largest city in Zimbabwe, by saying "Harabe" when the city is Harare. Congratulations on your qualification and excellent performance, Josh! Fall River School is proud of The Math Teams and Josh for their outstanding performances in the recent competitions!

As your child's school nurse, I want to make you aware of a medical problem that impacts schools around the country throughout the school year.

Pediculosis, or head lice, is a condition that each year affects approximately six to 12 million children between the ages of three and 12 years of age, and about one in every 100 elementary school children. Head lice are parasites that are generally found on the scalp, around the ears, and the back of the neck. The adult louse is about the size of a sesame seed, and can be reddish brown in color. Eggs, or nits, are smaller and silver in color.

Head lice are not a sign of poor hygiene and they do not transmit disease. Transmission from one child to another can occur during direct head to head contact or sharing of personal items such as combs, brushes, caps or helmets.

The most common symptom of head lice is head scratching, particularly at night, although red bite marks may also be noticed. If you suspect that your child has head lice, he or she should be examined or consulted by your health care provider for treatment options. There are many safe and effective products available, both over the counter and prescription, to treat the problem. It is important to follow the directions carefully. Parents should also wash in hot water or dry-clean all recently worn clothing, hats, used bedding and towel. Personal care items such as combs, brushes and hair clips should be washed in hot water.

My goal as school nurse is to provide you with the information you need to safeguard your child's health, and ensure that his or her education is not disrupted, but remains the most positive experience possible. We must keep the problem of head lice in perspective, as it is not a serious health problem, rather an annoying and unpleasant condition. Head lice are a problem nationwide, so we are not alone. Overreacting will not help. Parents and schools, working together, in an intelligent, open manner, always is a more effective approach. Thank you for your cooperation with this situation.
