PPOA Project Needs Your Help..... Commemorative Shelter & Bench

Last year the PPOA Board passed a motion to fund a Commemorative Shelter which we hope to construct next to the PCSD Building. We have a budget for the material we need to buy, and our local builder, **Will Legette**, has offered to help and he drew up the preliminary plans you see in this article. Keep in mind these are rough rendering.

The Ponderosa Community Service District Board at a meeting last fall approved the placement of the shelter on their property, and we thank them.

Help Needed

We intend to construct the project with volunteer labor. Richard Thomas is spearheading the project for the PPOA and we plan to begin construction in the late spring/early summer. We need your help. God willing, Richard will be at Ponderosa from about May 14^{th} till June 3^{rd} , 2018, and we hope to get a good start on it during this period – so save some time on your calendar.



Project Description

This project when completed will provide a shelter for a bench. We will use local material where possible. The shelter will have partial sides where commemorative and memorial plaques can be affixed. It will be made of Lodge Pole Pine posts and slab wood siding. We will probably put a metal roof on it. We intend the bench to be a memorial to our very own Barbie Dolmovic who gave so much to our Ponderosa community. The bench will be constructed of local cedar or redwood slab. Local tree service owner **Dennis Brown** said he will help secure the slabs.

We believe this shelter and bench will be a great place to stop and watch the trees grow, and will over the years to come be a place where we honor those who have served our community, and those who mean so much to us all. It will help preserve our Ponderosa history. Once completed, anyone from our Ponderosa community can place a plaque in this space. Of course we will have some guidelines in place so we can continue to make the best use of the limited space.

FIRE BRIGADE TRAINING: MAY 26, JUNE 23 AND JULY 21

For Your Information....

Jeff Gletne plans to submit a grant request for Ponderosa on behalf of the Tulare County Resource Conservation District. It is a fire prevention grant through CalFire and will probably be in the \$200,000-\$300,000 range. The two primary objectives would be to:



- Remove dead and dying trees that threaten homes, roads, trails, etc. These
 would be trees not scheduled for removal by SCE contractors
- Thin areas that are overgrown with far too many trees per acre. This would improve forest health and reduce fire danger.

Landowners that are interested in having their property treated would be required to sign a Right to Enter form. There would be no cost to landowners.

CalFire expects over 1,000 applications will be submitted for a limited amount of funding, so it is certainly no guarantee that we will be awarded a grant. But I think it would be a huge benefit to the community if we are successful. It would really complement the work being done by the Forest Service on federal land surrounding Ponderosa.

The grant awardees will be announced in July. The grant funding would be available until 2022.



Caramelized Salmon with Citrus Salsa

The New Grilling Book (Better Homes and Gardens)


Ingredients:

One 1-1/2 pound fresh or frozen salmon or halibut fillet (with skin) 1 inch thick

- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons finely shredded orange peel
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon finely shredded orange peel
- 2 oranges, peeled, sectioned, and coarsely chopped
- 1 cup chopped fresh pineapple or canned crushed pineapple, drained


fingers. Cover and marinate in the refrigerator for 8 to 24 hours.

- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh cilantro
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped shallot
- 1 fresh jalapeno pepper seeded and finely chopped



- 2. Meanwhile, for salsa, in a small bowl stir together the 1 teaspoon orange peel, the oranges, pineapple, cilantro, shallot, and jalapeno pepper. Cover and chill until ready to serve or for up to 24 hours. Drain fish, discarding liquid.
- 3. For a charcoal grill, arrange medium hot coals around a drip pan. Test for medium heat above the pan. Place fish, skin side down, on greased grill rack over drip pan. Cover and grill for 20 to 25 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. (For a gas grill, preheat grill. Reduce heat to medium. Grill as above.)
- 4. To serve, cut fish into 4 serving size pieces, cutting to but not through the skin. Carefully slip a metal spatula between fish and skin, lifting fish up and away from the skin. Serve fish with salsa.




