

Who is Foreign Born? % Foreign Born, by Race/Ethnicity: 2007



Projected U.S. Population, 1960-2050: Alternative Immigration Scenarios



Projected U.S. Population, 1960-2050: Alternative Immigration Scenarios




Projected Hispanic Population, 1960-2050 for Alternative Immigration Scenarios

Population Growth by Decade, by Race/Ethnicity: 1960-1970 to 2040-2050




Race/Ethnic Composition of U.S. Population: 1950-2050






Core Hispanic States (9)



New Hispanic States (11)












Latino Growth Centers, 1980 to 2005






Hispanic Share of the Labor Force, by Age: 2007






Hispanic Share the Labor Force, by Citizenship and Education: 2007













Hispanic Share of Employment for Selected Industries, 2007: 5 Highest and Lowest






Hispanic Share of Employment for Selected Occupations, 2007: 5 Highest and Lowest






The Unemployment Rate: 1973 to 2006




