Greyhound Drops Port Orford By Evan Kramer



Greyhound Bus Lines has issued a service advisory on their web site announcing major changes in Oregon service. Many cities will lose long distance bus service effective August 18 including Port Or-

ford. Currently Greyhound offers two busses a day from Port Orford—one south-bound to San Francisco at 5:00am and one northbound to Portland at 12:50am. The bus station in Port Orford is at the Circle K store. Greyhound had discontinued their daytime buses that stopped in Port Orford last October.

Port Orford joins 35 other Oregon cities in having their Greyhound service discontinued. The biggest loser is the Oregon coast where there will be no more service. Towns from Brookings to Lincoln City are losing their bus service. But on their web site, Greyhound has thoughtfully provided a list of the "closest operating stations" for the public's convenience. The closest operation station for Port Orford will be Grants Pass, 165 miles away. However, there is no public transportation to Grants Pass. The Highway 97 corridor is also being abandoned

as Greyhound pulls out of Warm Springs, Bend, Redmond, Chemult, and Klamath Falls. The company is also pulling back from Interstate 5 cities like Albany, Ashland, and Cottage Grove. A report on National Public Radio on Monday night said the cutbacks were caused by financial considerations.

The only public transportation left in Curry County after August 18 will be Curry Public Transit. They offer much appreciated bus service from Brookings to North Bend six days a week. The fare is \$2.00 per segment so a trip to Coos Bay from Port Orford is \$4.00 (\$8.00 round trip.) Curry Transit sells a monthly pass for \$45 with unlimited rides, which is a deal hard to beat. You can call Curry Transit for more information at 1-800-921-2871.

There is only one way by public transit to get to Eugene. From Eugene you can get to the rest of the United States by bus, train or plane. There is an independent bus company in Coos Bay called Porter Stage Lines that operates out of a station on the ground floor of the Tioga Building in downtown Coos Bay. Porter Stage Lines offers buses from Coos Bay to Eugene at 7:00am and 1:05pm Monday through Friday and at 1:05pm only on Saturday and Sunday.

Bud at Porter Stage Lines told me the fare for the bus to Eugene Monday through Thursday is \$22.00 and Friday through Sunday \$24.00. The 7:00am bus continues on from Eugene to Sisters, Bend, Burns, Vale and terminates in Ontario on the Idaho border.

The Porter Stage Bus will drop you off at either the Amtrak or Greyhound Bus Stations in downtown Eugene. Once you get to the Amtrak station you can take the Coast Starlight north to Portland and Seattle or south to Oakland/San Francisco or Los Angeles or the Amtrak Cascade trains north. Contact Porter Stage at (541) 269-7183 for current fares and schedules.

Another, and more expensive, alternative to traveling out of the area is flying out of North Bend Airport. Horizon Airline operates four flights a day out of North Bend to Portland. Curry Public Transit goes to North Bend Airport before it makes the return trip south.

A customer service representative with Greyhound said the discontinued stations would lead to more streamlined service. She said the company was reducing service where passenger travel is not very heavy. According to the company's web site Greyhound operates more

than 2,400 buses with 112 company owned stations and 1,500 "agency operated terminals and sales agencies." As of July 12 the company serves close to 2, 500 locations in the United States. Greyhound took over Continental Trailways Bus Company in 1987 and operates the only nationwide bus system. Greyhound began business in 1914 in Hibbing, Minnesota and was called the Mesaba Transportation Company. Greyhound is currently owned by Laidlaw Inc.



But is the matter worth discussion, as suggested by Mr. Chilton in his letter? Of course it is

to carrying out a strategy for battle. And in that tradition, John Kerry risked his life for personnel under his command.

Would you prefer to have a president such as George Bush Jr., who repeatedly lies to America about the connection between Osama Bin Laden and Sadaam Hussein, about weapons of mass destruction in Iraq, who continues to deplete America's economic resources, inflame Muslim hatred and endanger the rest of the world, severing important traditional European ties, while needlessly endangering American soldiers? And there it is. There's the choice: Bush a reckless liar or Kerry? Indeed it is a matter for discussion as Mr. Chilton asked me in his last week's letter to the editor.

As for Mr. Chilton's assertion that former President Clinton was a draft dodger, that is patently untrue. How absurd. Mr. Clinton received a legal college deferment from military service as a Rhodes scholar and absolutely no deferments from the draft were issued to college students during the Vietnam conflict or any war simply because they attended foreign universities such as Cambridge or Oxford in England, as Mr. Clinton And although the system of college deferments is too lengthy to discuss in this forum, this system was standard operating procedure until the draft was ended. But I find it interesting that Mr Chilton seems to consider former President Bill Clinton's legal deferment from military service more offensive than the fact that President George Bush Jr. was absent without leave for thirty days from his military duty station during the Vietnam conflict, just one day shy of being possibly considered a deserter.

However the scope of this upcoming election is far greater that this simple sparring. Every program from social se-

curity, to Medicare, to unemployment benefits, to food. banks and educational programs for our children, assistance for the elderly, the disabled, the unemployed and the single parents of children in Curry County, but in every county in this nation, stand at risk under the present presidential administration. The environment is at grave risk. Veteran's benefits and programs are being slashed and medical facilities are being closed. The jobless rate is down but only for two bad reasons. One is the war. The other is the way that the government counts the number of unemployed. That number is derived from the number of people receiving unemployment benefits, but after their benefits run out they are no longer counted. That number is in the millions. Yet corporate welfare goes on and on.

I trust John Kerry because in my book he's a soldier's hero. He did his job and he came home. But he also did something remarkable as a combat veteran. He finished four years of college, law school and has served his state and this nation for thirty five years since Vietnam. But he shouldn't be pumped up as being any more than he is. He's just one man trying to make a difference. But should there be a mandatory criteria of prior military service in order for an individual to become an elected president, as Mr. Chilton asked in me in his letter last week? Of course not.

It is time for those on the fence to stand down, to switch horses and get on the right track. America is a great nation. It deserves better than George Bush Jr. We have the right to run our government, not to be run by it. Letter to the Editor,

Most Port Orford residents, like me, feel the police are there to protect them from serious crime and, failing that, to apprehend and charge the guilty. However, according to one officer, he is only there "to take reports". He also told me that in a domestic dispute, he would not arrest me (even if I had not a mark) if my wife was lying on the ground bleeding with a broken nose and a friend told him "she took a swing at me".

This rude awakening came after the recent July 4th festivities, when my adult son says he was struck suddenly, while on bicycle near his younger brother, by a larger and heavier teenage minor. The blow broke his nose and knocked him into the Northbound lane of Hwy. 101. My younger son says the alleged assailant ran from him and threatened him.

When my wife and I arrived on the scene, the police chief left and never spoke with us that night. No photo was even taken of my son's injuries at the scene. An officer on the scene prior to the incident to unlock a car did not pursue the alleged assailant after my son told him he had run away.

Surprised that the officer's version of the incident was so dramatically different from the one I'd heard, I soon learned he had only spoken with my semiconscious son and had not even interviewed his brother, who was there. He only did so



after I insisted, and I noticed him turn his head several times and wave his hand in front of my son—as if he didn't want to hear what he was saying.

Finally, the officer refused repeated requests to press charges—which do not require detention of the suspect and can be done by citation—because the individual in question was a minor.

In closing, anyone feeling we need a new direction in responding to violent crime and its investigation should contact our Police Chief, City Administrator and city council. An upcoming police levy might also be a good opportunity to vote on the issue!

Meanwhile, no one has stepped up to the plate and offered to help with thousands of dollars of medical expenses we're facing. EMS did give my son water and ice—but that cost \$150.

Tseriadun History By Scott Byrarn

Tseriadun was a unique Native village on the Oregon coast. Located near a coastal headland, offshore islands and reefs, and a coastal lake that was once an estuary, the village had access to a tremendous variety of resources from the sea and the land. The name Tseriadun comes from the large rocky headland (the Port Orford Heads) that offered protected waters for ocean canoeing during much of the year. From their homes by the coast, it was only a short hike to mountain hunting camps, and fishing sites along Kusuma (the Elk River), one of the most productive salmon streams on the Oregon coast today.

The people of Tseriadun were wealthy in many ways. They lived in finely made houses built of cedar planks, with smooth clay floors. Like others in southwest Oregon, they made fine stone tools, and they were known for their sea hunting skills. They were expert canoeists, fishers and hunters, and skilled artisans. They used hundreds of native plants for food, medicine, and a variety of other technologies.

The Tseriadun people spoke an Athapaskan dialect, reflecting strong ties to the Tututni and Totowa to the south and the Coquille to the north and east. They often traveled to distant villages for celebrations, trade, gaming and athletic events, and to visit relatives. Storytelling was more than a pastime; it was a way to pass on history and cultural tradition. Women usually married into Tseriadun from other communities at the Rogue or Coquille rivers and beyond, and it was not uncommon for several different dialects to be spoken in one village.

Archaeological evidence shows that the native people lived at Tseriadun for over 5,000 years, and possibly more than 10,000 years. Most of the food remains at archaeological sites in Port Orford are of marine origin, including the bones of whales, sea lions, seals, sea otter, rockfish, salmon, and shell-fish, especially mussels.

In 1856 the Tseriadun people were forcibly removed from their homelands by the U.S. military, and relocated at the Coast Reservation (later called Siletz Reservation). Many of their de-

scendants live at Siletz today. Other descendants trace their ancestry to those who moved back to the southern Oregon coast after the government closed portions of the Coast Reservation in the 1870s.


