

That's 2 times more jobs than the other six Oregon Metros combined.





Employment Growth by US City2013 to 2015

Portland enjoyed the second fastest job growth rate among the 50 largest US cities. That's more than twice the growth rate of the United States.

The city of Portland added 42,062 jobs within the city limits from 2013 to 2015. That's more than Salt Lake City, Las Vegas and Milwaukie combined.




Median Household Income Growth by US City 2010 to 2015

Portland enjoyed the third largest increase in household income among the 50 largest US cities. That's more than seven times the growth rate of the United States at 2.5%. (Inflation adjusted.)

That increase of \$9,604 from 2010 to 2015 brought Portland from being the 17th wealthiest city to the 8th among the 50 largest US cities.


Housing Price Index S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller



Population Growth US City

2010 to 2015

The population of the city of Portland grew by 8% from 2010 to 2015, slightly faster than the 6.7% average growth rate among the 50 largest US cities.



College Graduates of Working Age Growth by US City

2010 to 2015

The city of Portland added 41,130 people with college degrees, between the age 25 and 65, from 2010 to 2015.

That growth rate of 27% is the 8th fastest among the 50 largest US cities. The US growth rate is 10%.

Portland's growth in this demographic is more than Indianapolis, Milwaukie and Minneapolis combined.

- 20% of Oregon's population (790,294 in 2015)
- 0.5% of Oregon's area
- 27% of Oregon's jobs (506,700 in Nov. 2016)
- 29% of Oregon's payroll (\$27.2 Billion in 2016)
- 22% of Oregon's state personal income tax
- 40% of jobs created in Oregon in the last 10
 years (52,200 jobs. 12% job growth versus 6% for Oregon)
- 20% of people in poverty in Oregon (121,764 in 2015)


Employment Growth by County



Households with incomes of more than \$100,000 grew by 50%.


Households with incomes of less than \$35,000 declined by 20%.

Median tier households, with incomes between \$50,000 and \$75,000 grew by 2%.






Employment Growth – Portland Region


These 9 counties have a population of 2.4 million. That's 59% of Oregon's population and 3.8 times the size of the City of Portland.






















Workers Earning \$100,000 + 2015



Average Income by Census Tract - 2015










Per Capita Income By Oregon County 2015

Multnomah is the 3rd wealthiest of the large counties.





Per Capita Income By Oregon County 2015

Imagine we divide Multnomah County between "East" and "West" along 82nd Avenue.

"West Multnomah" would be the wealthiest Oregon county with an average income 68% higher than "East County". If it were a US state, it would be the 2nd wealthiest state

"East Multnomah" would be among the poorer counties, but with a population greater than Linn, Umatilla and Josephine combined. If it were a US state, it would be the 49th wealthiest state, between West Virginia and Mississippi.
