2021 Junior Livestock – Santa Cruz County Fair

Exhibitor Eligibility

Junior Livestock Divisions will be open to members of 4-H clubs, FFA Chapters, Independent Junior and Grange Youth residing in the counties listed below. Exhibitors must be 9 years of age or older on December 31, 2020. 4-H and FFA membership must be finalized prior to September 13, 2021. Poultry Show is open to adults and youth. Limited pen space is available; certain limitations have been placed on exhibitors as shown here. See showmanship and Round Robin rules for additional eligibility information. YQCA training is required for all youth exhibitors.

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS – Animals entered in the fair must be owned by the exhibitor by the dates shown below:

Market Beef – May 16, 2021 (120 days prior to opening of fair)

Market Lambs, Goats, Swine – July 15, 2021 (60 days prior to opening of fair)

Breeding animals, market rabbits and poultry – August 14, 2021 (30 days prior to opening of fair)

Independent exhibitors must provide documentation by these dates. See rules.

RECEIVING SCHEDULE

Pen assignments are posted in barns. No penning of market, breeding or open carcass lambs or goats prior to health check and weighing. Sunday penning of cattle is optional. Dairy cattle may arrive on Thursday, September 16. **Poultry—see Poultry Department for info.**

EXHIBITOR RULES AND CONDITIONS

COMPLIANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING RULES IS A CONDITION FOR EXHIBITING AT THE SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FAIR.

Your use of the Online Entry System and/or your signature on paper Entry Forms signifies your compliance with all State and Santa Cruz County Fair Rules.

As an exhibitor, you agree to abide by all rules contained in the Santa Cruz County Fair Entry Guide and understand that such rules are incorporated with and become a part of this agreement. You understand that information contained on entries may be released to the media (e.g., your name, club/chapter name, city of residence).

As an exhibitor, you agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the fair, the county and the State of California from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage, which is caused by, arises from or is in any way connected with participation in this program or event, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Fair.

The fair management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in fair programs or events. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.

2021 State Rules for California Fairs

The 2021 State Rules for California Fairs apply to all competitive exhibits conducted by district, citrus and county fairs in the State of California. Fairs may create "local rules", presented here, that may be stricter than the State Rules but that may not circumvent the State Rules. The complete State Rules for 2021 are online at

Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules that have not been enforced. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weighmasters, breed callers, tail dock officials and timers cannot be protested and are final. All protests must be presented to Fair Management (CEO) within 24 hours of the alleged violation, or 24 hours after the results are available to the public of exhibits judged pre-Fair. Protest must be accompanied by a \$500 deposit (cash, money order or certified check) which will be returned only if the protest is determined valid. Protest and appropriate action are decided by the Fair's Board of Directors or designees in a timely manner. Violations of State Rules may be appealed to Fairs and Expositions.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY

Junior Livestock Divisions will be open to members of 4-H clubs, FFA Chapters, Grange Youth and Independent Youth Exhibitors. Open Divisions will be open to adults, 18 years and older. The Poultry Show is open to adult and youth exhibitors. Division eligibility varies according to county of residence:

"Local area" exhibitors are those residing in Santa Cruz, San Benito and Monterey Counties

"Extended area" exhibitors are those residing in Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties

4-H/Grange Youth/Independent Youth Exhibitors of large animals (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Market Goats) must be 9 years of age or older by December 31, 2020 and must be no older than 19 at the end of the calendar year in which the fair takes place. 4-H Primary/Independent Youth Exhibitors of Poultry, Rabbits, Nigerian Dwarf Dairy Goats or Pygmy Goats must be 5 years of age or older by December 31, 2020.

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FFA exhibitors must be currently enrolled in an FFA high school program and may exhibit as FFA members to the end of the calendar year following graduation.

4-H and FFA membership must be finalized prior to September 13, 2021.

Independent youth exhibitors not affiliated with a junior organization may enter appropriate FFA and 4-H classes for which they qualify. Independent exhibitors entering market animals must provide Fair Management with a picture of their animal, appropriate proof of ownership, permanent tag, tattoo and/or hog ear notch information 120 days prior to the fair for beef and 60 days for sheep, swine and goats. Personal liability insurance is required and may be purchased from Fair Management by entry due date, August 28, 2021.

Independent and Grange Youth exhibitors will compete in 4-H classes if they are less than 14 years of age on Check-In Day of the fair; older exhibitors will compete in FFA classes.

EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS

YQCA training is required for all youth exhibitors. All exhibitors must complete an age-appropriate YQCA quality assurance session between September 19, 2020 and August 28, 2021. The certification must be valid during the fair. Certification numbers must be submitted via the online system. These numbers will be checked against the YQCA database. Exhibitors who enter invalid or expired certification numbers will be notified via email to take corrective action prior to the entry deadline. See yqca.org for information and sessions.

ALL LIVESTOCK MARKET ANIMAL EXHIBITORS MUST enter a **non-perishable** still exhibit in a non-livestock department of the fair. Note that all online entries must be submitted by 8/28/2021. The actual item being entered must be brought to the Fair according to the department's receiving schedule. Do not bring the items to the fair office prior to the actual receiving date. Livestock Educational Displays do not count for this requirement. **Market Animal Exhibitors who do not meet this requirement will not be allowed to weigh-in or show their market animals at the fair.**

ENTRIES

Unless otherwise specified within the rules of each department, entries must be submitted through the Online Entry System NO LATER than 11:59 pm on Saturday, August 28, 2021. Entries should contain accurate information, including name, address, club/chapter affiliation and birthdate (for exhibitors under the age of 20). See State Rule No. II. Classes with less than 2 entries for two years in a row may not be offered the following year.

Livestock Management may combine classes of 4 or fewer entries for meaningful competition.

Junior Livestock entries will not be accepted from an exhibitor whose family or family member has an unpaid balance at the Junior Livestock Auction.

LIVESTOCK PEN SPACE POLICY: It is the intention of the Santa Cruz County Fair Livestock Department to promote maximum participation in both Junior and Open Shows while providing a quality show for the general public. To accomplish this, pen space will be allocated by species in the following order:

- 1st Priority – Market Animals: Local Area – Santa Cruz, Monterey and San Benito Counties
- 2nd Priority – Market Animals: Extended Area – Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties
- 3rd Priority – Dairy Goats and Dairy Cattle
- 4th Priority – Breeding Animals and Feeders
- 5th Priority – Open Carcass Contest Animals

Extended area entries will be accepted through a lottery and will be limited as stated in this guide. There will be no waiting lists.

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Pens will be assigned by department heads. Special penning requests may be considered if submitted in writing prior to August 28, 2021.

EXHIBITOR CREDENTIALS, PASSES, FEES, CAMPING and PARKING

Exhibitor wristbands are required for exhibitors who enter large animals (beef, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats). Poultry, Rabbit and Pygmy Goat exhibitors do not need wristbands, but must purchase single-day tickets for entry into the fair.

Youth Large Animal or Carcass Exhibitor Wristband @ \$35
or Adult Carcass Exhibitor Wristband @ \$50 (additional entry fees required)

All Exhibitors are required to wear their wristbands at all times. Lost or broken wristbands will be replaced one time at no charge; additional replacements must be purchased in the Main Fair Office.

Other items may be purchased through the online system. Use Department “*Wristbands and Camping*”

Parent/Sibling Pass – \$50 each – up to two per family. A parent or sibling of a junior exhibitor of large animals may request a Parent/Sibling via the online system, two passes per family at \$50 each. Passes must be requested through an exhibitor’s online account. You will be limited to 2 entries for Class 100. Each entry will result in one wristband. Additional day passes may be purchased through the main fair.

Leader Wristband - \$50 each (submit paper form). LEADERS/ADVISORS of large animal projects must submit a paper Leader/Advisor Entry Form. The Leader/Advisor form must include the leader’s cell phone and email address, and the names of the exhibitors in the project. The form must be submitted by the entry due date. The exhibitors listed on the Leader/Advisor form will be cross-checked against the individual exhibitor entries. The leader/advisor will be contacted via email should any problems or deficiencies be identified. Rabbit, Pygmy Goat and Poultry leaders are not required to submit the Leader/Advisor Entry Form. Leader/advisor wristbands may be purchased for \$50 each via the online system.

LIVESTOCK RV CAMPING & PARKING

In order to comply with State and local fire regulations, camping will be extremely limited this year. Available spaces will be assigned via lottery after the entry deadline. Look for further information on the santacruzcountyfair.com/livestock webpage in early September. Camping fees will be due upon notification that space is available for you. Please submit paper camping form to the fair office no later than August 28, 2021.

Tent Camping - \$100 (submit paper form)

RV Camping - \$250 for units up to 32’, \$300 over 32’ (very limited space will be available—submit paper form)

No online reservations/entries will be allowed. See RV Camping Form and Rules for pricing. Parking will start from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Sunday, September 12, 2021. All Junior Livestock RV’s/tents must be in place by 5:00 p.m. on that day. There will be no space saving. Limited 20A electrical hook-ups will be available. All units must be self-contained, no dumping of gray water on the ground.

Campers are required to keep the aisles clear of vehicles. The Fire Marshal requires that aisles of at least 20 feet must be kept clear between camping units. Stock trailers must park in designated areas. No stock trailer parking in the vehicle parking area adjacent to the campground. Trailers in violation will be towed at owner’s expense.

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Entry to the fair is not included in RV camping fees. Plan ahead – day passes may be more economical than parent/sibling wristbands.

FEES

New for 2021: Some classes will require entry fees. Fees will be noted in the appropriate Entry Guide section.

All fees (except for camping) are due and payable by the entry deadline – August 28, 2021. Credit card payments for most entries will be accepted through the online system. You may also pay in person with cash, check or credit card at the Fair Office, or you may send in your check to the address listed here. Please bring/send a copy of the confirmation invoice that you receive from the online system when making your payment. Entries for which no payments are received by August 28 will be cancelled.

Exhibitor wristband fees for market, breeding or dairy animals that are disqualified at check-in or weigh-in are not refundable. Carcass entry fees are not refundable. Wristbands that are not picked up by Wednesday morning of the fair will be forfeited and are not refundable.

The following rules sections apply to large animals and their exhibitors. Consult the Rabbit, Poultry or Pygmy Goat Department rules for receiving and other show information.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES

1. This entry guide will use the following convention when referring to dates during fair week:
 - Check-In Day – September 13
 - Fair Tuesday - September 14
 - Fair Wednesday – September 15
 - Fair Thursday – September 16
 - Fair Friday – September 17
 - Auction Day – September 18
 - Load-Out Day – September 19
2. RECEIVING AND REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS: Unless otherwise specified in Department or Division rules, all exhibits will be received on Check-In Day. See schedule for livestock arrival times. Decorations and pens may be set up if barn charts are available on the weekend prior to Check-In Day. All exhibits must be in place and ready to be judged by Fair Tuesday at 8:00 a.m. and remain on exhibit throughout the fair according to the Load-Out Schedule.
3. ALL ANIMALS MUST ARRIVE IN SHOW CONDITION: The Fair reserves the right to refuse entry of stock for competitions that is not in suitable show condition. Furthermore, the right is reserved to exclude such unfit stock from the Fairgrounds. Any animals not washed or not in show condition may be excluded from the scales at the discretion of the department head.
4. Goats and sheep SHALL NOT be unloaded or penned until examined by Vet – see Livestock Schedule for Vet Check times. All open carcass and market lambs and goats must have a Scrapie ID Tag in their ear at weigh-in. **If Scrapie tag is lost or ruined, contact breeder for replacement prior to arriving for weigh-in.**

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5. The Livestock Department shall reserve the right to examine all animals. Any animal that shows evidence of any active, communicable or unsightly disease or other condition, upon recommendation of the Fair Veterinarian and decision of Fair CEO, shall be disqualified from the fair and shall be removed from the fairgrounds by the exhibitor immediately. The decision of the Fair CEO will be final. The Livestock Department will under no circumstances be held liable in any way for such removal. Any disqualified animal not removed from the fairgrounds will be turned over to Santa Cruz County Animal services and all charges resulting from this removal will be the responsibility of the owner of the animal.
6. THE EXHIBITOR MUST PROVIDE ALL BEDDING. Used bedding from the cleaning of stalls must be delivered to holding areas before 8:00 a.m. daily. Only straw bedding is allowed for beef and dairy cattle. See Breeding Beef/Dairy Cattle Departments. First day bedding for carcass animals will be provided. Carcass exhibitors are required to provide additional bedding.
7. No generators are allowed in the livestock barns. Notify Livestock Superintendent if additional power is needed.
8. Animals in livestock classes must be properly cared for at all times. Animals must be kept clean and well-groomed. Stalls and pens must be neat and free of refuse. Feed and water must be provided to maintain the animal in show condition. Bedding should be kept clean and replaced as necessary to remove waste. Aisles MUST be kept clear. All tack must be safely stored in designated areas. All tack, decorations and club signs must remain in place until 5:30 PM on Load-Out Day.
9. All animals must remain in their assigned pens throughout the fair except for washing, grooming, shows, exercise and the auction. Pen change requests may be submitted to the Livestock Office. If you are exercising/walking your animal outside the barn, please leave a note in your pen stating that.
10. Club/Chapter and independent exhibitor signs and stall cards MUST be in place at all times. Stall signs must clearly identify the name of the Club, Chapter or independent exhibitor. Stall cards must clearly identify the name of the club or chapter, the name of the exhibitor and the ear tag number or other animal identification. Stall cards will be available in the Livestock Office on Check-In Day. No “for sale” signs may be posted in the Livestock area until after the Jr. Livestock Auction. No commercial advertising is allowed in the barns.
11. Junior livestock exhibitors shall groom their own animals while on the fairgrounds. Other junior livestock exhibitors from the local area may assist them. Adult supervision is allowed but only for safety reasons while grooming and fitting.
12. When two (2) or more animals are entered in the same class, a junior helper may be used. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their animals in the judging show ring on time.
13. All Animal Health rules as stated in State Rule X apply.
14. There will be no loitering or sleeping in the livestock or horse barns after the Fair closes each evening. No eating or drinking in any barn at any time.
15. No animals will be allowed in the auction tent.
16. **Load-Out Day.** Vehicle access to barn areas will be staggered. No large stock trailers will be allowed in the Livestock Area until 7:00 p.m. No exceptions. Cars and trucks may enter the barn areas beginning at these times. Please load and exit the barn areas as quickly and as safely as possible. This schedule is subject to change. Check Livestock Bulletin board for updates.

Hog Barn: 5:30 pm

Dairy Goats: 6:00 pm

Sheep Barn: 6:00 pm

Beef/Dairy Cattle: 7:00 pm

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Decorations, stall cards, live-pick up and breeding animals may be walked out no earlier than 5:30 p.m. for all barns. Tack may be walked out before 10 a.m. or after 5:30 p.m. Exhibitors are asked to be considerate of fair visitors during load-out. The barns will not be closed to the public. NO ANIMALS MAY LEAVE BARN PRIOR TO 5:30 pm.

17. ANIMALS NOT ENTERED IN THE FAIR WILL NOT BE PERMITTED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.

18. NO DOGS ALLOWED IN THE LIVESTOCK AREA.

MARKET/BREEDING ANIMALS RULES

1. EACH ANIMAL EXHIBIT is subject to eligibility rules as stated in State Rule VII. Acceptable documents for proof of ownership are Bill of Sale, Sales Yard Bill of Sale, Certificate of Brand Inspection, or an affidavit stating that the owner is the breeder of the animal. MARKET ANIMALS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BE WEIGHED WITHOUT PROPER PAPERS. PAPERS WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE CLERK AT THE SCALE. ALL BILLS OF SALE MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE SCALES AT WEIGH-IN.
2. WEIGHING of market livestock will be on Check-In Day, between the hours of 3:30 PM and 7:00 PM for goats, hogs, and sheep; beef between 5:30 PM and 6:30 PM ONLY. Goats and sheep must be vet-checked prior to unloading. Vet check begins at 3:30 PM. If there is any question concerning weight, animal must be reweighed immediately, without exercising or leaving the area. Any unnatural, inhumane weight control prior to weigh-in is prohibited.
3. Eligible market animals are defined in State Rule IX – ANIMAL SPECIES RULES. All other market animals that do not fall into these categories will be disqualified at weigh-in and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately by the exhibitor. (Meat pen rabbits and poultry are not included in this rule.) There will be no altering of animals on the fairgrounds.
4. All exhibitors must weigh in their own animals, unless prior arrangements are made with the Livestock Office in writing (email) and approved by the Livestock Superintendent. Traffic can be heavy around the fairgrounds. Plan accordingly.
5. Extended Area (Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties) will be limited to 5 market beef and 10 other market animals per species unless otherwise stated in the Department Rules.
6. 4-H, FFA, Grange Youth and Independent exhibitors are eligible to enter one or two market as shown below. Do not enter more animals than are allowed:

Local Area Exhibitors (Santa Cruz, Monterey and San Benito Counties)

Beef Enter 1 You may also enter 1 lamb, 1 goat or 1 hog

or

Lambs, Goats Enter 1 or 2 of the same species

or

Hogs Enter 1 You may also enter 1 lamb or 1 goat

Extended Area Exhibitors (Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties)

All Species Enter 1 Limited to one market entry, regardless of species

Entries in excess of these limits, if not rejected by the online entry system, must be scratched prior to Check-In Day. Contact the Livestock Office via email to do so.

Natural Fed and Bred & Fed entries must be entered in market classes and will count toward the exhibitor's allowable entries. Meat pen rabbit and poultry entries are not included in this rule.

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7. Market beef, goats, lambs or hogs that do not meet the weight requirements of the appropriate department at the time of weigh-in may enter, but not place, in the Open Carcass Contest provided they meet the weight requirements for the carcass Division and the Division entry limit has not been reached. Open Carcass Contest entry fees will be due and payable by Fair Tuesday, in the Main Fair Office. See Open Carcass Department.
8. Market classes will be judged according to Danish System rules for marketability. To select Champion and Reserve Champion for Auction purposes each market weight break will also be judged by the American System. The first and second places in each market weight break will be designated as Weight and Reserve Weight Champions in the auction catalog. Breeding, dairy, small animal classes will be judged by American System rules.
9. Market animal entries require Animal Medication Certifications two times: first certification form is due via the online system by the entry deadline; second certification form (paper) is due on check-in day and must be brought to the scale.
10. Exhibitors of breeding animals must be present during the show or make prior arrangement with the Department Head.
11. ALL BREEDING ANIMALS must check in no later than 7:00 pm on Check-In Day. All Original copies or a stamped duplicate of all required registration documents must be presented and checked in at the Livestock Office when animals arrive and must be available on request at any other time. Breeding association markings will not be accepted as identification. Animals for which registration papers are pending cannot be shown either in registered or grade classes with the exception of Dairy Goats. See Dairy Goat Department rules.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION RULES

1. The Santa Cruz County Fair will hold an auction of livestock starting at 10:00 a.m. on Auction Day. Animals sold through the sale are not intended for breeding purposes and the buyer assumes all responsibility for such use.
2. Only animals exhibited at the Santa Cruz County Fair as Market Animals in the Livestock Department and Meat Pens shown in Rabbit or Poultry Departments may be sold. No breeding stock will be sold through the auction ring.
3. Livestock judged as Market Ready (beef, lambs, goats) or Market Acceptable (hogs) may be sold. The top two meat pens of rabbits and poultry will be sold.
4. Market animal champions, listed below, are terminal; no live pick-ups are allowed.

Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion
4-H Champion, Reserve 4-H Champion
FFA Champion, Reserve FFA Champion

Rabbit and poultry meat pens are live pick-ups only. Local area fairs that take place after the Santa Cruz County Fair Junior Livestock Auction will be notified of the champion and reserve champion rabbit and poultry meat pens.

5. Local Area exhibitors who show two non-beef animals (hog and lamb or hog and goat or 2 lambs or 2 goats), either of which is designated as one of the champions listed above, may sell both animals. If neither animal is a champion, the exhibitor must declare, in writing, which animal will be going through the sale no later than 5:00 pm on Fair Thursday. Declaration forms will be available in the Livestock Office during the fair. Failure to declare will result in Livestock Management selecting the animal that will sell. Beef exhibitors showing two animals may sell both animals, regardless of champion status. Extended Area exhibitors are limited to showing and selling 1 animal.
6. Permission to withdraw a non-champion animal from the Auction Sale may be given by the Livestock Department Heads, if the exhibitor presents a request in person with parent or leader within one hour after completion of the

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market animal judging (Sheep, Goat, Hogs). The Market Beef Show is a terminal sale – no live pick-ups will be permitted. Meat pens must be live pick-up.

7. No exhibitor or agent of said exhibitor selling an animal during the Junior Livestock Auction may approach a buyer at any time during the auction regarding altering the sale contract.
8. ALL MEAT-PRODUCING livestock must be withheld from processing at least 21 days after treatment with biologic, chemical and pharmaceutical substances (antibiotics, hormones, dewormers, etc.). Animals containing unauthorized residues will be condemned and the parties responsible for these residues are subject to prosecution under the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. NO ADDED HORMONE TREATMENTS ARE ALLOWED. Exhibitors will be asked to certify compliance with this rule at weigh-in.
9. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR to get his or her animal into the auction ring on time, or the animal may be eliminated from the auction. Exhibitors who miss their sale spot may elect to sell their animal for the posted market price. Champions who miss their sale spot will be sold at market price. The owner, in uniform, must accompany the animal during the sale, unless a request is made to the Livestock Superintendent who will take the request to the Fair CEO for consideration.
10. All animals being sold through the auction must appear in the same condition as shown in their market class, the only addition being bona fide ribbons, signs or champion drapes received at this Fair. No gift baskets or other items in the sale ring. No glitter or other decorations are allowed.
11. All livestock sold shall be returned to the seller's pen. Proper care of stock sold (feed and water), pens or stalls, are the responsibility of the seller until load out on Load-Out Day. Animals will leave the fairgrounds on Monday morning after Load-Out. Exhibitors are asked to leave feed for natural fed animals.
12. It shall be expressly understood that the Santa Cruz County Fair acts only as an agent for the consignors and assumes no liability, legal or otherwise. The Fair will not be responsible for animals that are condemned or rejected after processing due to disease or are heavy muscled (callipygian gene lambs) and not fit for human consumption. The Processing Plant verifying the disease or muscling problem will issue a certificate. The Livestock Department shall make recommendations for condemnation to the Board of Directors of the Fair. The Board of Directors shall make final determination.
13. The Fair will not be responsible for sales made outside the official sale ring. All sales made at the auction are final.
14. There will be an 8% (eight percent) selling fee on all stock going through the auction to defray expenses of the auction, auctioneer, hauling, clerking, etc. We reserve the right to adjust the commission upward should the pandemic circumstances dictate. Additional species-specific deductions (subject to change) include
 - Market Beef: \$1.50 per head for Brand Inspection and \$1.00 per head Beef Promotion Checkoff
 - Market Hogs: .004 times sales price for Pork Producers Checkoff
 - Market Lambs: \$.007/pound + \$.42/head for American Lamb Producers Checkoff
15. Auction picture fees, \$12 per sale lot (subject to change), will be deducted from auction checks. Extra pictures may be ordered during the fair by arrangement with photographer.
16. AUCTION SALE LIVE PICK-UPS: The seller must be present to assist in loading their animals for live pickup. The change of ownership of any animal sold through the auction does not change to buyer of said animal until the exhibitor is released from the fairgrounds on Load-Out Day. Only the original buyer of the auctioned animal at the original auctioned sale price will be allowed to remove said animal from the Fairgrounds. LIVE PICK-UPS MUST BE REMOVED BETWEEN 5:30 AND 7:30 P.M. ON LOAD-OUT DAY AND MUST BE PAID FOR BEFORE LEAVING THE GROUNDS. THE FAIR IS NOT RESPONSIBLE AFTER 7:30 P.M.

17. NO LIVE ANIMALS WILL BE ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE FAIRGROUNDS WITHOUT PROPER RELEASE CREDENTIALS, available from the department heads during load-out.
18. Any auction animal being sold for charity must be sold at the end of the auction. Arrangements must be made in advance.
19. Extended Area exhibitors who receive show/sell confirmations via the lottery will go through the Jr. Livestock Auction process on Auction Day.
20. Top auction weights may vary from actual animal weight. Qualifying animals weighing more than the weights show here will be sold at the top auction weight.
 - Market Beef – 1400 pounds
 - Market Goats – 105 pounds
 - Market Lambs – 150 pounds
 - Market Swine – overweight animals are not eligible for auction. Actual top weight is 285 pounds.
21. All large animals will be sold by the pound – meat pens will be sold by the pen.
22. All junior exhibitors participating in the auction will be expected to volunteer as auction ring setup help, auction runners and/or to work at the buyer appreciation dinner following the auction. Sign up in the Livestock Office.
23. Auction sale checks and pictures will be released on **Monday, October 12, 2021, from 4:00 to 6:30 p.m.** in the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds Board Room (behind Main Office). Each exhibiting 4-H club, FFA Chapter or independent group will designate a single adult leader or advisor who will pick up checks for each species or group as a whole. The name of the designated leader(s) must be submitted to the Livestock Office no later than noon on **Load-Out Day**. Every seller of livestock is **REQUIRED** to write a thank you letter to the buyer(s) and any add-ons (if applicable) of their animal. “Thank you” letters are to be turned in to the project leader/advisor prior to check pick-up. Project leaders/advisors must bring required thank you letter(s) for each check they are picking up on Monday, October 12. We will not accept auction thank you letters during the fair. **AUCTION CHECKS MUST BE CASHED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF ISSUE. Date of check release subject to change.**
24. The Auction Committee will post seller-buyer add-on information on our website within two days after the end of the fair. Leaders and advisors may obtain stationery for writing thank you letters from the Livestock Office during the fair. Please write the sale order number in the top right corner of the letter – for add-ons, append an “A” after the sale order number. The exhibitors’ letters should reflect appreciation of the buyers. Leaders and parents are encouraged to review the letters. The Auction Committee will mail the thank you letters and pictures to the buyer. Sellers not complying with this rule will not receive their pictures or checks.
25. Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds Foundation Donation Certificates will be available for purchase during the Fair. Contact the Livestock Office, at 831-761-9741, beginning on **Check-In Day**, for more information.
26. The Official Show Uniform, defined in this Entry Guide, applies to all exhibitors participating in the Jr. Livestock Auction.
27. Credit card payments for auction sales and/or add-ons will incur a 3% processing fee. An auction fee of 1% will be charged on all sales and add-ons, regardless of payment method.

OFFICIAL SHOW UNIFORMS

4-H EXHIBITORS

- 4-H cap
- 4-H tie or scarf

4-H, INDEPENDENT JUNIOR and GRANGE YOUTH EXHIBITORS

- All white, long- or short-sleeved shirt, button front and collar.
- White, dark blue or dark black bottoms.

Shirt must be tucked in. No sleeveless shirts allowed. No sweat pants, leggings or see-through or revealing styles allowed. No acid or stone washed or excessively baggy or worn jeans. No visible undergarments. Belts should be worn if trousers have belt loops. Footwear and belts must be clean and/or polished. If boots are worn with pants, they must be inside trouser legs. Boots must be worn to show cattle.

FFA EXHIBITORS

Official FFA Uniform to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows:

- Official FFA jacket zipped to the top
- white pants
- white collared (short- or long-sleeved) with the FFA emblem attached to left pocket
- FFA tie or scarf

The official FFA jacket is optional; if worn, the shirt emblem is not required. Hats or headgear of any type shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing. Shoes should be appropriate for what is being shown. Boots must be worn to show cattle.

CODE OF CONDUCT
Exhibitors, Leaders, Parents

By submitting entries through the online entry system, you agree to observe the following Code of Conduct. Parents, legal/guardians and leaders are expected to observe the Code of Conduct and comport themselves accordingly.

1. Follow the general rules governing entries, exhibits, judging, and payment of premiums as stated in the Entry Guide.
2. Follow any rules relating specifically to a department in which they are exhibiting.
3. Show the animals they enter in the fair. Exhibitors who do not show their animals will be asked to leave the fairgrounds and remove their animals and tack.
4. Exhibit proper conduct according to the following guidelines:
 - Show respect for the rights of others and be courteous at all times. Direct criticism or interference with fellow exhibitors, parents, leaders, committee members, judges, fair management before, during and after the competitive event is PROHIBITED.
 - Be courteous to the public visiting our fair.
 - Respect the property of others.
 - Demonstrate sportsmanship in the show ring, judging contests, and meetings.
 - Be honest and not take unfair advantage of others.
 - Refrain from loud, boisterous talk; foul language; and/or horseplay.
 - Refrain from bullying – both face-to-face and through social media.
 - Possession of any weapons on the fairgrounds is prohibited.
 - No consumption of any alcoholic beverages or drugs (prescription drugs accepted) if under age of 21. Adults will limit use of alcohol so that a proper example is set for children around them. Any abuse of alcohol or public intoxication by adults in or around the Livestock Area is PROHIBITED.
 - Smoking, vaping or use of tobacco or cannabis products **is not allowed** in the Livestock Area. Smoking or use of other tobacco or cannabis products is prohibited if under age 21 in the Livestock Camping Area.

Violation of any of these rules may result in the expulsion of the exhibitor, the club or chapter and their animals from the fairgrounds, the forfeiture of premiums or auction sales checks and/or the prohibition of participating in future Santa Cruz County Fairs.

___ Submit your entries for Livestock Departments by August 28, 2021. If you are submitting entries in other departments, make sure to note their entry deadline and receiving dates.

___ **SCRAPIE TAGS for Carcass and Market Goats and Lambs: The following Official USDA individual identification Scrapie Tags will be accepted by the fair. Make sure to include the entire identification number with your entry.**

- Radio Frequency Identification Device (RFID) tags with 840 numbers (eg., 84000000001234)
- Eartags containing a premises/flock number with an individual animal number, separated by a space (eg., CA055 1234)
- Eartags containing a letter/number combination for serial numbers (usually a state abbreviation followed by a letter/number combination that is six characters in length)

___ **MARKET ANIMAL exhibitors only:** Submit your Still Exhibit entries by August 28, 2021. Check Official Entry Guide for receiving dates and make sure your entries are delivered to the fairgrounds on time.

___ Submit your Exhibitor Eligibility and Release of Liability Forms on time. Project leader and parent signatures for youth exhibitors are required on the forms. Plan to obtain signatures well before the entry deadline. Upload documents via the online entry system.

___ Copies of bills of sale, registration papers and pre-fair animal medication certifications must be uploaded to the online entry system by the entry deadline.

___ Make sure you purchase an exhibitor wristband (if required). Wristbands will be distributed at the Mandatory Meeting on **Check-In Day**.

___ Pay for your wristbands or other entry fees on time. Online entry fees may be paid via credit card. Make sure to pay at the time you submit your cart. If you elect to pay later, you cannot come back to pay with a credit card.

___ Sign up for Showmanship, making sure to select the class appropriate to your age (4-H) or experience (FFA).

___ Complete or renew your YQCA training by the entry deadline. You will not be reminded to complete the training.

___ Check-in on time and have the original documents for purebred stock and check-in animal medication certification must be brought with you on **Check-In Day**.

**Reserve premium will only be paid if there are four or more exhibitors per species.*

In addition to the rules below, all animals and exhibitors entered in the Natural Fed Divisions must also meet all other Livestock requirements for each respective species.

Exhibitors will exhibit their natural fed entries in traditional market classes. At the end of each market show, all natural fed exhibitors will return to the ring for the selection of Champion Natural Fed (and Reserve Champion for any species with minimum of four entries).

1. **Restricted Period** – Entries may originate from any conventional or organic herd. Either way all entries must be purchased by and transitioned to restricted diet and supplementation within the guidelines on or before the dates below:

Market Swine, Lambs & Goats – June 25, 2021

Market Beef – March 17, 2021

2. Please note the restricted periods may be longer than ownership requirements for traditional market classes and do not end until the fair is completed on Sunday night unless the livestock department is unable to accommodate separate pens or stalls. Still, the exhibitor should make every effort to maintain the integrity of the feeding program throughout the fair.
3. All exhibitors must provide letters containing three separate signatures (one from a parent/guardian, another from an advisor, third from the exhibitor (copies will be available in the Livestock office) confirming all requirements of this class have been adequately met. A designated member of the Livestock Committee must approve and sign off on all entries before weigh-in. Any entries that do not meet requirements for the Natural Fed Division may participate in conventional market classes providing all other entry requirements of those classes are met. In the case of independent exhibitors a second parent, guardian, relative or close observer can provide a letter in the absence of a club advisor.
4. Exhibitors must be able to provide proof of adequate purchases of feed and any hay or supplementation utilized on check-in day upon request. Original feed tags and feed/hay receipts denoting these details are satisfactory. **Save your feed tags and receipts!**

Any or all of the following are allowed for animal consumption during and before the restricted period...

- Pasture
- Any non-medicated feed certified as GMO free
- Certified organic feed or grain
- Hay of any source (except alfalfa and wheat must either be certified as organic and/or GMO free)
- Supplemental nutrition containing herbs, minerals, enzymes, amino acids from plant based sources. Vitamins may be from synthetic or natural sources.
- Probiotics
- Oils from organic or non GMO sources
- Medicinal mushrooms
- Diatomaceous earth (DE)
- Fish meal

DE, clay and/or herbal dewormers (garlic, ginger, etc.) are still encouraged though chemical dewormers may be utilized when deemed necessary. Any dewormer utilized containing a withdrawal period must be properly administered within that time frame.

Not allowed for consumption at any time during the restricted period includes...

- Antibiotics.
- Implants of any kind including additional vaccines.
- Hormones, stimulants, growth regulators including steroids and Paylean.
- Animal by products including blood meal.
- Artificial colors, dyes, other synthetic substances of any kind.

Should any natural fed animal receive antibiotic(s) or other synthetic supplements during the restricted period, they may still participate in conventional classes providing any medications administered are within proper withdrawal periods for sale and both the exhibitor and the entry meet all other market livestock entry qualifications.

5. Animals not meeting specific species requirements for **type and conformation** may be judged unsuitable for sale. In the case of pasture or grass fed animals, entries not meeting handling **condition** expectations for traditional live grade requirements can still be considered

sale-eligible as this may be customary for grass fed.

6. Market animals not meeting minimum weight requirements may show in traditional feeder classes providing all other department requirements are met. Overweight swine may opt to move to the Open Carcass department (if space is available) or go home.
7. Natural Fed exhibitors are encouraged to refrain from using any synthetic products on the exterior of the animals exhibited. Natural products (plant based shampoos, conditioners, gels, oils, etc.) may be utilized but are not required for show or sale. All animals are expected to be clean and well-groomed.
8. The additional documentation required for entries in Natural Fed Divisions including letters (provided by the Natural Fed Coordinator) and feed receipts/tags must be presented and approved on weigh in day. Animals not meeting minimum health requirements will be disqualified and must be removed from the fairgrounds by 8 PM Monday evening. All decisions by the livestock superintendent, department head and/or official SCCF veterinarian of record are final without recourse.
9. All entries may be subject to blood draw, urine, hair and/or feces analysis during the fair at the discretion of the livestock superintendent or department head to confirm absence of antibiotics, growth regulators, steroids, synthetic hormones or any other synthetic compounds including biochemical markers for Paylean.

Natural Fed Champions and Reserve Grand Champions **may be required** to have blood drawn at the discretion of Livestock management.

Entries: Online Entries only. All Natural Fed animals will enter in their respective market classes **AND** in the Natural Fed Division in the department for judging.

Judging: Entries received from 4-H, FFA, Grange Youth and independent exhibitors will be judged together.

Please note guidelines for Natural Fed are local and written with local consumer demand in mind. While it's possible that some entries may originate from entirely organic fed herds the program overall is not to be confused as USDA Organic certified nor fully integrated with the Naturally Raised Livestock Claim that is currently listed as a proposal for future standards in the Federal Register. The Natural Fed Division was established in 2011 to give exhibitors who choose to learn an alternative method of bringing livestock to market that embraces a very significant portion of food consumption trends in our county and beyond.

NOTE: Rabbit Show divisions for Lightweight, Heavyweight, Fur and Pet Rabbits and Meat Pens have been cancelled. Showmanship has not been cancelled and will be a knowledge bowl this year - no live rabbits will be used.

- The Rabbit Show entries will NOT be limited to two entries per exhibitor per class per Division unless otherwise specified in this entry guide. The show limit will be 250 rabbits. Entries after the first 250 animals will not be accepted.
- Awards are paid from entries made by the judge's clerks on the "Official Judging Sheets" and not from award stickers placed on entry. Judges decisions are final.
- This is a youth only show. Youth must be able to handle their own rabbits and be available to put them on the table.
- Official ARBA sanctioned show: Show TYA0002.
- Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the *Official Guidebook To Raising Better Rabbits & Cavies* and Standard of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. shall apply to all District Fair rabbit shows provided they do not conflict with any of the rules prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture. Legs will be awarded according to American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. rules.
- All animals must be identified by legible, permanent ear marking in left ear which MUST correspond to those on the entry form. Pet rabbits are excluded from required ear markings.
- Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same Breed and Class will not be allowed. Entries with duplicate ear numbers will have one of those rabbits eliminated.
- Animals will be shown and judged in Showroom Divisions recognized by the ARBA. Divisions will be established by the number of rabbits entered in any given breed and any given variety within that breed. ANY DIVISION LISTED THAT RECEIVES AN INSUFFICIENT NUMBER OF ENTRIES MAY BE DROPPED, AND THE RABBITS ENTERED WILL BE PLACED WITH OTHERS OF THAT BREED OR IN THE APPROPRIATE "ALL OTHER" DIVISION.
- The judge will eliminate those animals which have disqualifications from competition. They will count when computing the number of rabbits shown in the class.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to take the rabbit to the show table when the class is called for it to be judged. Those rabbits absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of rabbits in the class.
- Rabbits entered in a class, which are the wrong sex, breed, or variety is to be eliminated from the class and the number in the class corrected accordingly.
- All Best of Breeds winners are invited to stay for Best in Show.
- The exhibitor is to check the show cards at the beginning of the Rabbit Show and report any discrepancies to the Show Secretary immediately. **NO CHANGES WILL BE ALLOWED DURING THE SHOW.** Substitutions can only be made within the same section, sex, variety and class and must be submitted in writing ten (10) days prior to the show date.
- Pedigree papers or a Bill of Sale showing the required ownership period (30 days) may be used instead of a pedigree if ear number and other required entry information are shown on the Bill of Sale. This should be available upon request the day of the show.
- The age in months (e.g., 3 months) must be entered on the entry form for each animal entered; however, rabbits are to be entered by weight and age (see show classes).
- Exhibitors must attend the Santa Cruz County Fair Rabbit Show with their rabbits. Consideration will be given to those showing other species on a case-by-case basis, with prior notice in writing.
- Thank you letters for awards are due at the end of the show.

Exhibitor must be present for Mandatory Market Beef Ear Tagging and Brand Inspection, Sunday, May 16, 2021 at the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds. Scales will be open for weighing animals as a courtesy to our exhibitors. Exhibitors may tag more than one animal, but will be allowed to enter only one. If animal loses either visual ear tag or RFID tag, a \$10 replacement fee will be assessed at Check-In. **If animal loses both visual tag and RFID tag, the \$10 replacement fee will be assessed and the animal IS NOT eligible for championship.**

New Rule for 2022: Mandatory Market Beef Ear Tagging and Brand Inspection: First animal tagged is free. Additional animals will be charged \$10.00/head for tagging.

THIS IS A TERMINAL SHOW/SALE. NO LIVE PICK-UPS.

1. A Brand Inspection made out to exhibitor, an Out Billing from an Auction Sales Yard, or a Bill of Sale showing 120 consecutive days ownership is required. If animal is dropped by one of your own cows, a Yellow Slip must be presented. 7. Nigerian Dwarf Goats registered with the Nigerian Dwarf Association must ALSO be registered by ADGA. The Fair will provide standard metal goat pens. Exhibitors are responsible for bringing any additional penning materials they deem necessary for the security of their animals, e.g., netting.
8. Original certificates with the name of the exhibitor printed as owner are required. Signed transfers are not acceptable. For does under 6 months of age, a stamped duplicate is acceptable **only** if faxed directly from ADGA to the Fair Office before the end of check-in time. The office fax number is (831) 761-5827. Certificates may not be faxed for older animals.
9. A permanent tattooed ID is required. Make sure the tattoo matches the registration papers for your animal before the fair.

A Belt Buckle will be awarded to the 4-H or FFA member who best exemplifies the Dairy Goat Industry.

Enter JUNIOR DAIRY GOATS – Division DG600 – Class 100 by the Entry Deadline. This will show your intent to submit the application and essay by the due date.

Complete the entry form provided in this book. Submit with your entry, along with a one-page essay describing yourself and your Dairy Goat Project, by the end of check-in on **Check-In Day.** Limited to youths 9 to 19 years of age. Award will be given to the youth that best represents Dairy Goats during the Santa Cruz County Fair. In order to be fair to all exhibitors, previous winners of this award are not eligible to compete. **A minimum score of 80 points will be required.**

- 25 points Possible for PUBLIC IMAGE as shown by proper preparation or grooming of animals, cleanliness of exhibitor; and proper condition and health of animals.
- 25 points Possible for CLEANLINESS as indicated by the Clean Stall (competition) score card. Includes cleanliness of animal and exhibitor.
- 15 points* Possible for KNOWLEDGE, as conveyed to the public. Winners will answer questions politely, present a positive view of dairy goats, and inform the public factually with information on breed characteristics, milk production and husbandry.

- 15 points Possible for DISPLAY. Posters, pictures, charts, articles, clippings or by any method of educating the public in a pleasing manner.
- 10 points* Possible for ENTHUSIASM or ATTITUDE, which will include enjoyment of the project and love of Dairy Goats.
- 5 points Possible for SHOWMANSHIP, based on placing of that individual in whatever level he or she enters; 5 points for first place, 4 for second, and so on.
- 5 points Possible for CLASS PLACING: 5 points for first place, 4 for second and so on. The average of the youngster's animals' placing will be used to achieve the owner's score. (group placing, championships, etc. not counted)

* These categories to be scored after talking to ALL contestants.

WINNERS IN THE ABOVE AREAS WILL BE DETERMINED IN THREE CATEGORIES OF SCOPE: 1) Youngsters owning fewer than five animals, 2) those with five to ten animals, 3) those with more than ten. This is done so that the handicap of caring for different size herds can be overcome.

From the three semi-finalists, juniors who wish to be considered for the award must be available for interviews after the Junior Show. The interview will cover: Individual goals; size and scope of project; knowledge of costs and income for the project; prior awards or recognition; participation in the decision of the project (the why, how, where and when); history of his or her project; any failures or mistakes.

RULES AND INFORMATION

Check-In Time: Load-Out Day 8:30 am

Judging time: Load-Out Day 9:00 am

- 1. 4-H Junior and Senior, and FFA Novice and Senior Showmanship class winners** in the species of beef, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, market goat, dairy goat, horses, rabbits or poultry are eligible to compete in Round Robin. Species to be shown are beef, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, market goats and dairy goats. Horses and rabbits will not be shown in Round Robin. Livestock Department Heads have the right to eliminate a species if there are not sufficient animals available.
- 2. First place winners in each species will automatically fill the slot for their species. If a showman wins in more than one species, they will represent the first species they win. Winners must notify the Livestock Office by 8:00 p.m. on the night of their showmanship win if they decline to participate. If the first place winner declines or has already filled another slot, the slot will be filled by the next-highest, eligible winner of the species, second through eighth place in that order. A final list of Round Robin competitors will be posted in the Livestock Office on Auction Day.**
3. Competition will be completed when each contestant has shown all species. Final results will be based on a total point system. Tie breaker question(s) will break a tie.
4. All exhibitors must wear boots.
5. All participants must provide their own equipment, e.g. cane, show stick, etc. No whips are allowed.
6. Contestants will be disqualified if they are getting coached during a competition. Once judging has begun, no talking to contestants will be allowed. This rule will be strictly enforced.

Sheep, Swine, Beef and Market Goat species only: 4-H Senior and FFA Senior Showmen finishing in places 1 through 5 are eligible to compete against each other for the title of Supreme Showman. The competition will take place immediately following the last showmanship class for each species. There must be at least two FFA and two 4-H senior showmanship winners to compete for the title in each species.

1. Eligible exhibitors will be notified at ringside. Exhibitors must have finished in first through fifth place in 4-H Senior or FFA Senior Showmanship.
2. Entry is voluntary – no substitutions.
3. All other showmanship rules will apply.
4. Exhibitor must use same animal used in the showmanship class.
5. Jacket will be awarded to the Supreme Showman in each species after the fair.

Pee Wee and Adult Showmanship

These contests are just for fun. Sign-ups will be taken in the Livestock Office during the fair. No entry fee for pee wee showmanship. **\$5 entry fee** for adult showmanship per species shown. Species to be shown will be identified at sign-up.

Exhibitors must sign a release of liability and borrow a livestock animal from a 4-H, FFA, Grange Youth or independent exhibitor. All animals used must have been entered in livestock or carcass departments.

Pee Wee – ages 3 through 8 – classes may be broken up into age groups if warranted by the number of entries. Kids who turn 9 after January 1, 2020 are also eligible.

Adult – ages 18 and over, not exhibiting junior livestock at the fair. Carcass exhibitors 18 and older are eligible if they are not exhibiting junior livestock.

The Clean Stall/Herdsmanship Contest will recognize club and chapter livestock exhibits that ensure the well-being of the animals, are neat and attractive, provide information that is interesting or educational about the species, and promote FFA and 4-H programs to the public.

All clubs/chapters will be entered in the contest and will be judged according to the scorecard below. Independent exhibitor groups will be judged with 4-H clubs.

Pens will be inspected after 8AM and 5PM, Tuesday through Saturday, and after 8AM on Sunday. It is not required to have any club/chapter member present during inspection.

Daily total points will be posted outside Livestock Office. Overall winners for each species will be awarded prizes at the Awards Ceremony on **Load-Out Day**. In the event of a tie for overall species winners, Sunday's score will serve as a tiebreaker. Species winners must turn in thank you letters by noon on Sunday or forfeit the award to the runners-up.

Herdsmanship duties are the responsibility of exhibitors rather than leaders and parents. Leaders and parents may supervise and provide minimal assistance in the interest of safety from outside of pens and stalls, but exhibitors are encouraged to do duties they are capable of doing. Points will not be awarded if the parents/leaders perform the work.

Area of responsibility will extend to all alleys surrounding each exhibit.

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Open to Residents of Santa Cruz, Monterey, San Benito, Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties.
2. Livestock educational displays provide individuals and clubs/chapters an opportunity to acquaint the public with information about beef, sheep, swine, goats (dairy, market, breeding), dairy cattle, rabbits, sheep, swine and poultry. Content for entries in miscellaneous class will pertain to areas of livestock animal science or husbandry not represented by another class.
3. These are to be individual or club/chapter exhibits and are not part of a Club or Chapter Clean Pen display. The Committee will display exhibits.
4. All entries in this Division must have been produced within one year of the opening of the Fair. **Entries may not have been previously exhibited at the Santa Cruz County Fair.**
5. Entries limited to 1 per individual, 4-H Club or FFA Chapter per species. An individual participating in 4-H Club or FFA Chapter entry may also enter an individual exhibit.
6. Displays must be designed and constructed by organization members. Instructors or leaders may supervise only. Instructors or leaders must sign entry forms as agent for Clubs or Chapters.
7. Exhibits may consist of signs, mechanical displays or interactive boards.
8. **If text, graphs or charts on the display are taken directly from the internet or other sources (cut and paste), the original source must be cited on the display to avoid disqualification.**
9. Signs are not to be larger than 4'x4', with information on one side. **All signs must be laminated or otherwise weather proofed as display may be shown outside for the duration of the Fair.**
10. All combustible materials must be fire retardant. All exhibits must meet safety requirements.
11. Three-dimensional displays will be allowed provided they are free standing, no more than 40 lbs., **weather resistant**, do not exceed 4'x4'x4' and can be safely displayed to the public. Any displays that do not meet these standards may be disqualified at the discretion of the department head. **LAMINATE YOUR POSTERS – THEY WILL BE DISPLAYED OUTSIDE.**
12. 4-H or FFA entries may place club/chapter name along bottom of exhibit. Letters should be no taller than 3 inches. Individual entries may have name and age in the lower right hand corner. Maximum space for name and age to be 4"x6".
13. Judges shall insist upon a high quality of products and materials used in the exhibits.

DEPARTMENT RULES

Open to Santa Cruz, Monterey, San Benito, Santa Clara and San Mateo County residents.

1. Small animal contests are limited to 15 entries, beef contest limited to 5 entries, accepted on a first-come time-dated basis. Entries from Santa Cruz County will be accepted first. Entries from all other counties will be accepted up to entry limit.
2. Exhibitor must be at least 9 years of age by January 1, 2021.
3. Photos will be taken on show day.
4. Exhibitors must show their own animals.
5. Exhibitor must own their entries. Beef entries must be owned at least 120 days to the opening of the fair. Lamb, hog and goat entries must be owned 60 days prior to the opening of the Fair. Proof of ownership must be presented at the time of weigh-in.
6. Only one entry per person per species.
7. Animals must arrive in show condition.
8. Sheep and goats must have scrapie tags – NO EXCEPTIONS.
9. All carcass animals must remain in assigned stall area.
10. Carcass animals must be properly cared for and stalls must be kept clean during the entire length of the Fair. Stalls must be cleaned each day and the work must be completed by 8:00 AM.
11. The carcass will remain the property of the exhibitor. The carcass can be picked up after the contest or cutting instructions can be left at Freedom Meat Lockers. **Cut and wrap costs to be paid by owner.**
12. The Open Carcass Champion will be selected using combined results from Live & Carcass Judging. Live Judging will count 20% and Carcass Judging will count 80% toward the overall combined ranking to determine the Open Carcass Champion.
13. Ribbons will be awarded to the top 5 entries. A trophy belt buckle will be awarded to the champion. Premiums will be awarded to the top 3 entries. Animals whose weight is outside the species limits are not eligible for awards or premiums.
14. Any carcass that has undergone an excessive amount of trimming or has parts removed during slaughter or one that is condemned by USDA meat inspection will be disqualified. Any cryptorchids or rams/bucks/boars/bulls will not be accepted. Animals found with cryptorchidism (and/or PSE in

hogs) will not be eligible for awards.

15. Market beef, goats, lambs or hogs that do not meet the weight requirements of the appropriate department at the time of weigh-in may enter **but not place** in the Open Carcass Contest provided they meet the weight requirements for the carcass Division and the Division entry limit has not been reached. Original entry fees will be forfeited and the entry fees listed below will be due and payable on Tuesday, September 14, 2021, in the Main Fair Office.
16. See species-specific rules below.
17. **State Rule VIII.17 will be enforced. No animal may be entered in more than one department/Division in Junior Live-stock unless provided for in the specifications of the department/section. However, market or feeder animals may be entered in both Divisions for individual and pens of market or feeder animals.**
18. First day bedding will be provided. Carcass exhibitors are responsible for additional bedding.

DIVISION CC010 – OPEN CARCASS BEEF CONTEST

1. Brand inspection and bill of sale or other proof of ownership must be presented at scale before weighing at Fair. A Yellow Transportation slip must accompany all cattle.
2. Live weights are the same as Market Beef limits (full size and mini beef).
3. Exhibitors must be present to assist in loading of cattle for hauling to processing plant.
4. Wild steers will not be permitted. Cattle must be halter-broken and shown by owner.

CLASS 10: Open Beef Carcass Live Judging

1. Cattle will be shown and judged on conformation, finish, muscling, and estimated USDA Yield and Quality Grades.

Open Beef Carcass Judging

1. Carcasses will be judged for USDA Quality and Yield Grades. Yield Grade is converted to an estimate of Percent Boneless Retail Cuts, which is used as the Carcass Index, and adjusted for Quality Grade and carcass weight. The Index then ranks the carcasses.
2. Carcasses must be "A" maturity and grade Select + or better to qualify.

DIVISION CC020 – OPEN LAMB CARCASS CONTEST

1. Minimum live weight for lambs is 100 lbs, no maximum weight.
2. Lambs must be shorn one (1) week prior to the Fair and **MUST ARRIVE AT THE FAIR IN SHOW CONDITION.**
3. The contest will be limited to wether or ewe lambs less than 12 months old.
4. Scrapie tag required. See Exhibitor Checklist.

CLASS 10: Open Lamb Live Judging

1. Lambs will be shown and judged on conformation, finish, muscling, and estimated Quality and Yield Grades.

Open Lamb Carcass Judging

1. Carcass evaluation will include USDA Quality and Yield Grade, Adjusted Back fat thickness, and Ribeye area.
2. Final carcass placing will be based on USDA Yield index, after conversion to percent retail cuts and adjusting for Ribeye area.
3. Lambs must grade USDA Quality Grade of Choice Minus (Ch-) or better to qualify.

DIVISION CC030 – OPEN SWINE CARCASS

1. Hogs with a live weight of 210 – 285 pounds will be eligible to compete.
2. No animals weighing above 285 pounds will be allowed.
3. Hog hair must be at least ½ inch in length.

CLASS 10: 210-285 Pounds

1. Swine will be shown and judged on conformation, finish, muscling, and estimated USDA Yield and Quality Grades.
2. After weighing, carcass hogs may be divided into weight classes for judging. Possible weight classes include: 210-240 pounds, 241-285 pounds, etc.

Open Swine Carcass Judging

1. Carcasses will be judged for USDA Quality and Yield Grades.
2. Essential carcass traits:
Loin eye 4.5 — maximum back fat 1.5 at 10th rib fat depth
3. Muscle color and marbling score to average 2.0-4.0
4. Minimum Carcass Weight is equal to or greater than 70% of bottom weight for class.
 - 210-240 pounds = 147 pounds
 - 241-285 pounds = 169 pounds
5. Maximum Carcass Weight is equal to or less than 70% of top weight for class.
 - 210-240 pounds = 168 pounds
 - 241-285 pounds = 200 pounds
6. Must have acceptable belly score

DIVISION CC040 – OPEN GOAT CARCASS CONTEST

1. Minimum live weight of 75 pounds, no maximum.
2. The contest will be limited to wether or doe goats, any breed or crossbreed less than 12 months of age showing kid teeth and must be disbudded or dehorned.
3. Carcass contest animals need not be shaved.
4. Scrapie tag required. See Exhibitor Checklist.

CLASS 10: Open Goat Live Judging

1. Goats will be shown and judged on conformation, finish, muscling, and estimated Quality and Yield Grades.

Open Goat Carcass Judging

1. Carcass evaluation will include Quality, Yield, rib-eye area and leg score.
2. Final carcass placing will be based on USDA Yield index, after conversion to percent retail cuts and adjusting for Ribeye area.
3. Goats must grade USDA Quality Grade of Choice Minus (Ch-) or better to qualify.

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LIVESTOCK CAMPING RULES

Camping is a privilege extended to Livestock Exhibitors, Leaders and their families. That privilege may be revoked at any time by the Santa Cruz County Fair. Livestock Camping is not open to the general public.

All youth exhibitors (under 19 years of age) must have an adult chaperone on site. All youth exhibitors must have prior approval of their leader or advisor in order to stay overnight at the Fair.

Exhibitors engaged in disruptive activities or failure to comply with rules and restrictions set forth by the Livestock Camping committee and the Santa Cruz County Fair Board of Directors will be disqualified and removed from the fairgrounds with the loss of all premiums and prizes. The Fair Manager has the authority to dismiss exhibitors.

Non-exhibitors, such as family members, are required to follow the same requirements, rules and restrictions as Exhibitors.

No camping units or vehicles will be admitted to the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds prior to 8 a.m. on Sunday before the Fair. Any vehicles arriving early will be subject to towing at the owner's expense. Exception: Livestock Committee members, Fair Board Directors and Security. All camping units must be in place on **Sunday by 5 p.m.**

Requests for camping space must be made via Livestock Camping Form. Fees for camping are listed on the form and are based on the type of unit that will be used.

Camping spaces are available on a first-come basis, with priority given to animal exhibitors, leaders and fair personnel. **Remaining spaces will be assigned via lottery. Form must be submitted to be entered in lottery.**

1. Camping units will be placed at the discretion of the Livestock Camping Coordinator. Emergency Vehicle Access lanes will be observed and kept clear at all times.
2. A designated adult is responsible for all persons staying in their assigned space. Youth exhibitors are not allowed to remain overnight unsupervised by a parent/guardian. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. If at any time a camping unit is found with youth without a chaperone, parents will be called to pick up their children and the camping unit must leave the Livestock Camping area.
3. Limited electrical hook-ups may be available. Campers must bring their own electrical adapters and extension cords, **12 gauge at a minimum. Fairgrounds not responsible for campers connecting to electrical hook-ups. All recreational vehicles connecting to shore power at the fairgrounds must have a surge protector installed between the RV's power cord and the Fairgrounds receptacle to which the RV is connected.**
4. Electrical junction boxes and cables located in the camping area are expensive and should be left alone. Campers who drive over or otherwise damage electrical equipment will be fined \$400 per damaged item.
5. NO GREY WATER MAY BE DUMPED ON THE GROUND, either from holding tanks into dug holes or from containers onto the ground. NO WASTE DUMPING ALLOWED IN THE CAMPING AREA. Closest waste dump is located at Pinto Lake Park. Violation of this rule will result in the camper's immediate removal from the grounds.
6. All camping units must be in place before 8 p.m. on **Sunday**. No automobiles, trucks, etc. are allowed in the camping area after they have unloaded. Parking for support vehicles is available on a space-available basis in the lot adjacent to the Livestock Campground. Stock trailers may be parked in the exit field in the southeast corner of the fairgrounds. No stock trailers may be parked in the campground or adjacent parking lot. Violators will be towed at the owner's expense. No attempt will be made to find the owner. This rule will be enforced starting on Monday at 8 p.m.
7. All tents must be located away from roads and fire lanes.
8. Camping units must leave the campgrounds on the last day of the Fair, no later than 7 p.m.
9. Quiet hours are 30 minutes after close of fair to 6 a.m. No generators are to be used during this time except for approved medical necessities. Generators will not be operated for more than two hours in any eight-hour period outside of quiet hours.
10. Each sleeping accommodation must have a usable fire extinguisher, and campers must know how to use it.
11. Responsible use of alcoholic beverages is required. **Alcohol should not be available to anyone under the age of 21. Alcohol must be consumed in campsites only.** Outside alcohol may not be brought into the Livestock Arena, tent or barns. **Violation of this rule will result in immediate ejection of all involved parties from the fair and all entries/awards will be forfeited.**
12. Secure all valuables. Santa Cruz County Fair, its employees and volunteers are not responsible for any loss, theft or damage.
