Care of Baby Chicks

- Litter:** Use wood chips or Guardian Swift Pick to a depth of 1" to 2".
- Heat:** Temperature should be 90°F for the first week. Reduce temperature 5° each week. Chicks will crowd together if too cold or move away from the heat source if too warm. Heat lamps should be placed 26" to 30" from the litter. Approximately one heat lamp should be used for every 25 to 50 chicks.
- Water:** Chicks should be supplied with fresh clean water. Start with two one-gallon waterers for every 100 chicks, adding more as chicks get older. Terramycin or Duramycin may be added at 1 teaspoon per gallon if needed.
- Feed:** Start chicks on 19% Start-N-Grow. At 8 weeks of age switch chicks to 17% Grow-N-Finish, 5 weeks of age for broilers. Do not cut starter and grower feeds with corn or oats as this will cause slower growth or other growing problems.
- Draft Shield:** A sheet of corrugated paper, baled hay or straw that should surround the starting area to prevent drafts. This is very important during cold, early spring starting periods. Do not corral chicks which must be able to move away from the heat source if they desire.
- Floor Space:** Approximately one-half square foot per bird for the first two weeks. Increase to one square foot per bird after that. Do not crowd birds as this will lead to higher mortality rates and increased feed costs.
- Picking:** If picking develops in your birds, check to make sure there is good ventilation in the building. Birds 1 to 3 weeks of age may begin picking around the tail, wings, or neck. If this occurs, apply pine tar around the troubled areas.

Baby poultry and waterfowl need a commercial feed which provides protein, vitamins, and minerals for skeletal growth and development. Never feed bread, milk, egg yolks, oatmeal, cornmeal, etc. These foods do not contain the proper nutrients and may lead to lameness.

Do not feed Medicated Feed to ducks, geese, or guineas.
