In order to continue going forward, we need YOU! We have more than 250 members, and many of us are Zooming in to our virtual meetings and workshops. BUT, we've been depending on a core group of women to make things happen, and these women need help. At our January meetings, we'll talk more about what is needed, but start thinking now about what you might be able to do to pitch in. The 2022 Quilt Show Committee has a number of openings. We need people to help assemble community project quilts, as well as people to sew them. And we also need people to volunteer (or let themselves be nominated) for positions on our Board.

Quilt Show News

In person in 2022!

At the moment we are optimistic that we'll have an in-person show in 2022. The show dates are October 14 & 15, 2022. We have the DuPage county fairgrounds reserved for those dates. During this planning year we will continue to meet virtually until it's safe to meet in person.

Now it's time to form the committee and there are a couple of areas where we need help right away.

Judged quilts

We need someone to select the judge and then be the hostess/ coordinator for the judge during the week of the quilt show. If we don't have this position filled by the end of February 2021, we will not have a judged quilt category in the show.

Opportunity (Raffle) Quilt

We did not get a volunteer to coordinate the creation of the opportunity quilt, so we took it upon ourselves to decide on the pattern and colors. You can find all the details on the guild website under quilt show & opportunity quilt.

This quilt will be scrappy and our hope is that it comes from your stash. The background should be cream, off-white, or white with one of the other colors from our chosen palette. Please finish your blocks by April I so the top can be assembled and quilted. If you would like to take over the coordination of this project, please let us know. This job is not selling tickets, but coordinating the creation of the quilt.

Kathleen Herbach


Kathleen has been quilting since 1993 when her mother introduced it to her and started a foundation flip and sew block.

Why Take the Hurdy Gurdy Workshop with Beth Helfter? And wait ... Who the Heck is Beth Helfter?

the second question first — that's me right there. I'm a quilt designer and instructor from Massachusetts who's been quilting for over twenty years and has been building a business since 2005, when I had twin two year olds and a need to create to stay sane. Many years later I have three teenage daughters, and the need to create has been joined by the need to get out of the house now and then (or just lock myself in the studio with my Zoom account) and be with quilters; inspiring, motivating, learning, and sharing my designs and seeing theirs as well!

My work has been featured in Quilters World, The Quilter, Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks, Quilts From Quiltmakers 100 Blocks, and I was a member of the 2014 Quiltmaker "Scrap Squad". My style tends toward the scrappy and my designs mirror my company tagline: Inspired Designs, Relaxed Attitude. I am the creator of the Accordion Sewn HSTsTM (Half Square Triangles) method; a way to get way more bang for your scrappy buck when it comes to half square

triangles! Quilting is supposed to be fun, and with every pattern I strive to keep you as far away from your seam ripper as possible, with every lecture I work to keep quilting light, fun, and motivating, and with every workshop I try to create a relaxed atmosphere of learning with a fun pattern or technique that doesn't aim for perfection, but aims for a great day of quilty entertainment and learning.

Lecturing and teaching is still my very favorite part of this career and I can't wait to meet Prairie Star in February!

But really, why take the Hurdy Gurdy Workshop?

If you're going to learn a new technique, you might as well go straight to the source! Not only am I the inventor of the Accordion Sewn HSTsTM method, but Hurdy Gurdy is one of the first patterns I designed for my first book about the method. You can't get more original than that.

In this workshop you'll master the Accordion Sewn HSTsTM within the first 45 minutes—really, you WILL!—and move on to learn how they go beyond just a way to make HSTs more scrappy, but can be used to create ordered accordions that lay out blocks like butter. You'll never want to make HSTs any other way again!


