

This month is a continuation of questions asked in January.

Question#1: For the cartridge you shoot (6ppc, 30BR, etc.), when working up a load for a new barrel where do you start on your bullet seating (touch, jam, etc.), and how did you find it (method used)?

Question #2: What method do you use to work up a load, i.e., with seating, powder, number of shots, distance, and conditions?

Dear Lee,

Q1 - I make a chamber gage with the same reamer that I used to chamber the barrel for a new reamer. The chamber gage needs to be inspected after it's made to make sure that the throat is in the center of the gage. Because of the shortness of the gage, it's really easy for

the gage to be off center when reaming the chamber gage even with dialing in the barrel stub in the lathe to ream. If I'm using the same reamer as I used on previous barrels, it may be lazy, but I'll start with the seater die set to the same specs as where it was with the previous barrels. If I change to a different bullet, I'll use a dial caliper with an ogive checker and either add or subtract shims or change the micrometer on the die to get the same seating depth as the previous bullet. Then will either go in or out a few thousandths depending upon how it shoots. As to moving the bullet out farther as the throat erodes from shooting, I'll go out a few thousandths at a time depending upon how the group looks on target.

Q2 - ? I shoot the 6 PPC pretty well exclusively. I quit shooting the .22 PPC Short when I shot a five shot group at Midland in heavy mirage and never saw a bullet hole. Normally what I'll do when I work up a load is, I'll leave the seater set where it was, put in the powder and weight of powder that shot in previous barrels and start there. I'll shoot three shot groups at 100 and adjust from what the group looks like. If the group is vertical, I'll go up on powder until there isn't any vertical. I have a real hard time telling group sizes at 100 yards. You can have a round hole at 100 and have a .300" group or a round hole and it be a teen group. I aim at 6 o'clock on the ten ring and have the bullet hit slightly below my aiming point. I'll back Continued on page 8

up to 200 yards and do any fine tuning on the load. If it goes in a hole at 200, it's a good group whether it's a .300" or a teen. Not so much at 100. It makes it easier for me to judge progress shooting at 200 rather than at 100. I leave a set of Smiley flag poles set out all the time so that all I have to do is put the tops on to shoot. After I get a 3 shot group that looks good, then I'll go to 5 shot groups. Even with a rail gun, I very seldom go to 10 shot groups except just to confirm that the barrel is shooting.

I use both N133 and LT32, and I start my testing at 28.8 grains (gr), but mainly from 29.2 gr with 133 and go up to 30, with LT32, I start at 28.2 and go up to 29.2 gr. At Holton at the NBRSA Nationals, I was shooting 30.0 gr of 133 for the 200. I had shot a LT30 & 32 mix for 100, but it didn't seem to want to shoot when we switched to 200. The groups were just splattering with space

between each bullet, so I switched to 133.

Harley Baker Dear Lee,

Q1 - The only number I record on a new barrel is my just touch number. Where the bullet just touches the rifling. I usually find this with the barrel attached and the fire control out of the bolt. I have done this for many years and it is totally repeatable "but" you have to develop a "feel" for this bolt in this rifle with no brass before starting the procedure. I have been experimenting without the barrel installed but it is a work in progress to be repeatable. Whatever process you use to start with has to have your full confidence that you are at your exact location. All my future measurements use this as a reference.

I always start with the bullet in the lands. N133 powder. 2-3 shot groups de-

I only shoot N133. 29.5 to 30.5 grains. Where I end up normally, I cannot answer because I let the target tell what it wants. It might be 29.3 or 30.7.

Dear Lee,

Thanks for taking on this project and I think you should be aware that this past November I turned 90 years old and I can assure you some of the ways I shoot now is not the same as I did 10 or 15 years ago. The mechanics are the same but the eyes-hand-brain are not nearly as coordinated. With this in mind I will respond to your questions.

O1 - The first thing I do is to determine the dimension from bolt face to the contact point on the ogive (nose) with the lands in the barrel using Hornady's LOCK-N-LOAD O.A.L. GAUGE and this dimension stays with the barrel as long as it is on the rifle

Q2 - I start with 20 pieces of brass to just touch the lands. I use T32 powder and there will be 20 times at 100 yards and cleaned after each 5 rounds.

I use T powder and after the 2nd firing I will use 27.8 grains and if I have a little problem I will go to 28.3.

Q1&2 - The first thing I do with a new barrel (6ppc, .262 neck) is determine where the light jam length is for each bullet I might use. Currently, I'm using Hottenstein and Conaway 68 gr., 7-10-1/2 BT bullets. Using an old fired round, I push the cartridge shoulder back more than usual, so it doesn't interfere with the bullet seating measurement. When I do this step I replace





Can a Railgun make you a better shooter?

It seems like many competitive shooters ponder this question (I know I did). When you start competitive benchrest shooting, you normally move from a varmint hunting rifle to a used Light Varmint benchrest rifle. Your shooting fairly well at your local range, and then you decide to try competitive shooting at a registered match. You start travelling more and seeing what others are shooting run the group and at times should proband winning with, so you decide that you need to buy a "new" LV rifle.

After a year or two of shooting regional matches, you decide to go to your Regional 3-Gun or one of the Group Nationals. Since the Nationals is a 4-Gun event, you quickly have to make the decision; are you going to shoot the Unlimited event with your bag gun, or are you going to sit it out. Most folks will shoot their bag gun just for the practice, but almost everyone will say, "...it's hard to compete with the railguns".

I waited six years before I decided to buy a Railgun. Two years later, at the 2007 IBS Group Nationals in St. Louis I shot a 0.2226 agg at 100-yards HB to win my first H.O.F. Point (I should have got one earlier, LOL). I like it because it gives me the opportunity to shoot "heads up" and to see the impact the flags have.

I asked these questions to several accomplished shooters: Do you feel that shooting a "Railgun" helps you shoot your bag gun better? What's your shooting technique for the Railgun, i.e., run and gun, or dial-away? Here is what they said.

Walt Berger: I think shooting a Railgun will help you to learn to read the conditions.

Jeff Gaidos:

The Railgun is a good learning tool to become familiar with conditions. I like to shoot the same condition or wait till it returns rather than dial. I try to ably stop rather than forcing a shot that can go out of the group.

Harley Baker:

I do not believe shooting my rail gun helps me shoot my bag guns better. I don't like to dial the Railgun unless it is my last resort. I would rather shoot and stop and shoot again. If I am doing my part of tuning the rifle, I don't worry about restarting on a group.

Joel Nader:

Railguns are a great educational tool but also a huge expense. Most new competitors would be better served with a second or third Light Varmint rig before they buy a rail.

Yes, shooting a rail in unlimited competition will help you judge conditions better. It will improve your "timing" (when to start and stop your group). It will also help with your bag set up as you will better understand how responsible your bags are for controlling the movement and tracking of your rifle. Last but not least you will become a better rifle tuner. An un-tuned rail simply will not be competitive. Neither will an un-tuned bag gun.

When shooting a rail, I tend to look for a nice condition that will stay as I slowly and methodically start shooting, keeping my eyes on the flags and checking each shot through the scope (if shots start to move out of the group, I want to see it). If my condition starts to go away I will simply stop shooting and wait for it to return. Once it settles back in I will finish the group without moving the gun or going down to the sighter target. Of course, sometimes the conditions won't cooperate and running quickly or pounding the sighter and turning the dials is what you need to do.

No matter what conditions you get, shooting 10 shot groups with a rail is a lot of fun.

I think shooting a Railgun helps me watch my wind flags better. I've always thought that if someone was getting into benchrest that they'd be better off starting with a Railgun rather than a 10.5 pound rifle as it would teach them how to read the wind more quickly as all you have to concentrate on is watching the flags and firing the shot once you have the gun tuned up. Of course, no one does that. Just about everyone starts with a 10.5 pound rifle as that's where the matches are.

My shooting technique for the Railgun depends upon the conditions. If they are steady, I'll run them. If they are switchy, I'll try to pick my way through

them. If I need to hold, I'll hold and sometimes will be dialing into the wind a little if I think the wind picked up or dialing the other way if it dies down. Sometimes it works, sometimes you'd have been better off not to have dialed

I'll come closer to remembering a group several years down the road if I had to hold to finish the group and I held correctly than if I just run 5 or 10 shots down range as fast as I can get them.

You'll remember the group where you held the last shot a $\frac{1}{4}$ " left and a ¹/₄" up to put the shot into a zero group. Not so much the zero or small teen that was shot as fast as you could get them down range.




point, I load and test three shot groups with the bullet seated at the light jam and .003 further in and out of the case. I load these cases with VithtaVuori 133 at 29.7 grs, 30.0 grs and 30.3 grains for each length. If none look good, I add and subtract .003 again to the seating. Once I find the seating and powder combination that gives me the best groups, I'll fine tune it by testing the seating .001 in either direction and my powder charge plus or minus 0.1 and .02 grains. I like to test at 100 yards when it's not too calm and verify the final load at 200 yards at a range that provide constant and fairly consistent winds (like Holton). I don't like testing in the calm, because all loads/seating look good, and you get a false level of confidence by loads that may be wind sensitive.






