July 7, 2019 - Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

The poet constantly cries out "Rejoice!" over the new Jerusalem. He tells Israel that God's children will nurse at the breast of this same city, which is an image of peace and contentment.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul declares that he will never boast except in the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The only thing that matters is a new creation. He wants peaceful relations with the Galatians.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20; or 10:1-9

Luke bases the universal mission of the Church in the ministry of Jesus. The disciples go out in pairs for their mutual support and witness. Jesus later tempers the great enthusiasm of the disciples as they return to Him with all the good things they were able **to do.**

Reflection:

A key theme of today's Gospel and last Sunday's Gospel is discipleship—its challenges, its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry. Even for us today, the harvest is plentiful. We should pray to the master of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest.

So we ask ourselves:

- How do you share in the mission of Christ?
- What helps you have the strength to stay loyal to Christ?


