Venues and Achievements

Hello NMRA people! I am so happy to be putting out another newsletter for all of our fans. Although it stresses me out each time, I do have plenty of information to impart, and I feel a little pressure to get it right—not miss something important or put the wrong name on a tournament picture, perhaps.

One of my duties for the past several years has been securing the bones of our tournaments for the next 12 to 18 months—the club, the hotel, the food, the shuttle, etc. It takes a lot of phonecalls and emails, and sometimes we just go back to a fantastic place that worked well before. There is some strategy behind this; if they haven’t already done so, the returning players in that venue who don’t travel must renew their NMRA membership. This is really great for the first-timers who didn’t join the NMRA. This happened in *Kansas City* in March. We are really happy to have the Midwest area players renew and enjoy the *Overland Park Athletic Club* event. It was a great one.

We plan to return to a few places in the next year.

Denver— Get your reservations in to play in our July 22 through 25 *Denver* event. The deadline is coming up quickly. You’ll read about the special hotel discount in this newsletter—I hope you can take advantage of it before the rooms are all booked. Info can be found at www.nmra.info or by going to the www.r2sports.com website where you can sign up for the tournament.

Fullerton— Our doubles-only tournament will be returning to *Fullerton, California*, December 3 through 5, 2015. *Fullerton* is close to *Disneyland* and the many beaches in southern *California*, and our tournament dates are still during school months so the parks will be less crowded and the traffic a little lighter. St. Louis— Although the NMRA has not yet been to *St. Louis* and the *Vetta Club Concord*, we have already heard that the *Kansas City* players will drive across the state to join us in March, 2016. The dates aren’t yet firm, but keep checking the www.nmra.info website for updates so you can make firm plans. It will be a little chilly, but *St. Louis* has much to offer during the spring months, too. And the *Gateway Arch* is open year-round.

Portland— We are VERY excited to return to *Portland, Oregon*, and the *Sunset Athletic Club* in July, 2016. You may know that the *Great Northwest* has much to offer the tourist/racquetball player, so we hope you’ll join us in July one year from now. The dates are not yet final for this event, either, but we hope to publicize those in the next newsletter.

I got a great boxed award and had my picture taken with the other USAR award winners for the year, including the Athletes of the Year, Jake Bredenbeck and Rhonda Rajsich. It was a great night, and I'm sure the photos will be in *Racquetball Magazine* very soon. Now I feel I have to practice a little harder and play a little better. I'll keep working on that.

just for players like Ruben who make a living in the sport of racquetball. Up to this point, all inductees have been either Amateur Athletes or Contributors.

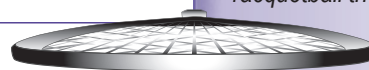
As happens with all *NMRA* Hall of Fame inductions, there were many smiles, with many fun pictures from the old days and much reminiscing.

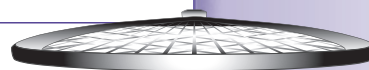

Tournament Check-In	Tuesday, July 21, 2015, 5:00 to 8:00 pm near the Primary Club Wetterhorn Room ; (Check www.r2sports.com for venue changes) Let the access desk person know you are there for the racquetball tourney. Light appetizers and drinks, with player meeting at 7:00 pm. Plan to stay and socialize!
Tournament Souvenir	A high-quality shirt will be given out at check-in night. If you would like to have your name or something else embroidered on the shirt for \$10, you may have that done during the tournament. Details will be available soon.
Play Begins / Ends	8:00 am Wednesday, July 22, to 5:00 pm Saturday, July 25, 2015 Every division plays every day (Wednesday through Saturday) Please show consideration for all players and remember that we play every bracket every day of the event. Schedule your travel arrangements accordingly. ID/bagtag may be required at both venues.
Tourn. Ball	Ektelon Classic Black is the official ball of the NMRA.
Tournament Scoring	All round robins, self-refereed matches; Every division will play two games to 15. Large "pool play" divisions will have Saturday playoff matches. Playoff format will be two games to 15, tiebreaker to 11 if needed. Bonus points are awarded for winning games (2 per game) and the match (4). Ties will split the extra four match points. Points are automatically calculated by the R2sports tournament software. When any team or player must forfeit, average scores will be used to determine final results of the division or pool. If a forfeit occurs during a match, the opposing team or player will be awarded points required to finish the match. You must play all of your matches in a division to receive a medal. In rare circumstances, a "watcher" may be requested of the tournament director to settle disputes.
Appeals	The NMRA has a rules committee that can be used by the players to submit an appeal on a rule (immediately) or issue (not necessarily immediately) that arises during the event. The decision of the rules committee is final and binding on all parties concerned.
Tournament Awards	NMRA medals will be awarded to First through Fourth place winners for each bracket. Combined brackets will be awarded medals based on age. No medal will be awarded for the combined division itself.
Eligibility	USAR-sanctioned; Current USAR membership is required to participate. Entries will not be accepted without payment for USAR membership. NMRA membership is required for all, EXCEPT players who are playing in their FIRST NMRA event. Special recognition and gift for first-time players and new NMRA members will be given out.
Breakfast / Morning Hosp.	Full hot breakfast is included in the price of the Hilton Garden Inn host hotel. Fruit and drinks available at Northridge Rec Center.
Lunch	Available at the Northridge Rec Center only. Check for details during the tournament. Planned lunch times will be 11:30 am to about 2:00 pm. Match times may be scheduled around lunch, but please get a lunch if you are playing and will want to eat afterward.
Evening Hospitality	Available at Northridge Rec Center only—not a substitute for dinner.
Banquet	Friday night, July 24, 2015, at the Hilton Garden Inn ballroom Cash bar at 6:00 pm; Dinner and program from 7:00 to 9:00 pm or so Videos, slide shows and possible awards (fun and serious) presentations are customary. Don't miss this!

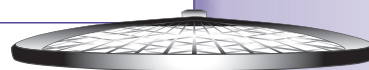

Denver Host Hotel — Giving Back to the Players

Your NMRA board of directors is always trying to come up with ways to please the members. We thought of a really great one that will directly impact your wallets for *Denver*. We hope you'll take advantage of it.

You may know that *Colorado* in both winter AND summer is a tourist destination. The economy of the state depends heavily on tourist dollars flowing in. To group like our NMRA, it means rather high hotel prices, depending on the services needed. For our July event, we needed a hotel that was fairly close to the *Northridge Rec Center* and had banquet facilities in addition to a shuttle to the club(s). After much negotiation, we were able to get the room rate to \$119 per night plus tax for the weekend at the *Hilton Garden Inn* one-half mile from the club. Our players need rooms during the week, so they were going to have to spend an extra \$20 per night for the week nights. That just isn't something our players are used to, and we ABSOLUTELY wanted all players to stay in the host hotel.

Before publishing our room rates to the potential players, our board met to discuss this and we decided to **take money directly out of the tournament budget to pay down the hotel bills** so that all nights of the tournament would cost \$119 per night at the *Hilton Garden Inn*.

To take advantage of this, you must be one of the first 30 rooms booked in our NMRA block. You'll want to get your hotel room reserved NOW so the rooms don't fill up. You don't have to do anything special to get the deal—it is all set up between the hotel and the tournament directors.

There is also a second, higher-priced host hotel for families, in case you want more room and a kitchen. The *Residence Inn* is equally close to the club, and it is available for \$189 per night.

Although the hotel will be providing shuttle service to the club(s), if the weather is great, as it normally is in July, you would

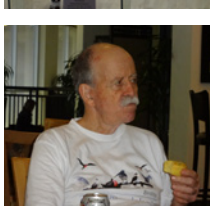
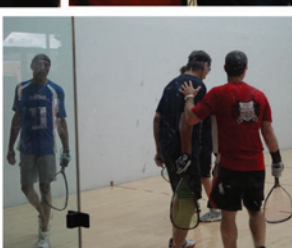

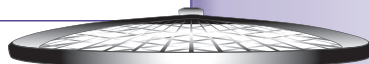

Tournament Scoring	All round robins, self-refereed matches, Every division will play two games to 15. Larger "pool play" divisions will have Saturday playoff matches. Playoff format will be two games to 15, tiebreaker to 11 if needed. Bonus points are awarded for winning games (2 per game) and the match (4). Ties will split the extra four match points. Points are automatically calculated by the R2sports tournament software. When any team or player must forfeit, average scores will be used to determine final results of the division or pool. If a forfeit occurs during a match, the opposing team or player will be awarded points required to finish the match. <i>USAR</i> amateur rules will be used.

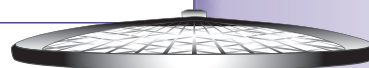

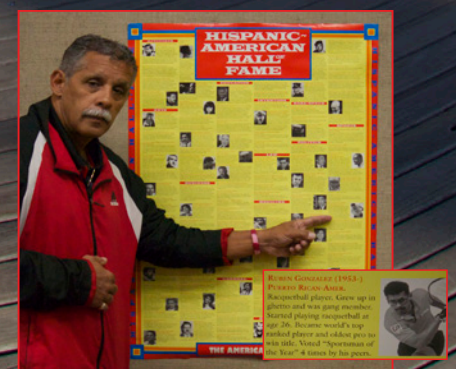

We want to say a special thank you to several of our members who recently made sizable donations to the *NMRA*.

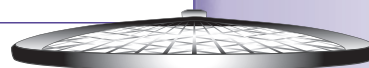

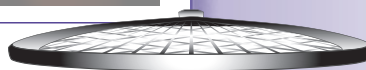

Russ Maninno, Temecula, CA

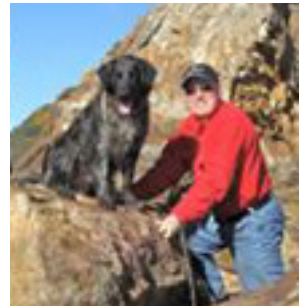

Coach's Corner: Player/Coaches for Hire

You probably know that I am not a coach. You may also know that I use a lot of coach time and take a lot of lessons. I am a big proponent of working on your game and wanted to share some of my thoughts on that, because I believe most players don't take the time (or spend the money) when they could easily slide that practice regimen into their weekly routine. Old dogs (NMRA players) CAN learn new tricks and the time to do it is NOW.

Coaching on a Budget

Right away, I want to address the issue of not having the extra cash to get some coaching. If you really can't spare the cash to have an instructor give you a lesson once in a while, there are still a few things you can do.

1. Take videos of yourself playing and drilling. Play them back slowly to criticize your form and footwork, as well as shot selection. You will probably remember the thoughts going on in your head, and which shots you chose. You should be able to see why the wrong shot did not work, and why the right shot did not happen the way you wanted to execute it.
2. Take a half hour from your regular play time and have your buddy hit setups for you. He/she should tell you which shot to hit, then watch your form and footwork and make suggestions. Switch positions so you can hit setups for him/her.
3. Give a kid at the club a few dollars to hit setup shots for you.

Even if you are taking lessons from an instructor/coach, you will probably want to use some of the above techniques between sessions.

Let Yourself Spend a Little on Your Game

To get good at any sport, you really must take some lessons. Imagine trying to become a scratch golfer without taking a lesson. Racquetball can be too fun to drill when you have the chance to play, so we don't. If you set up an appointment for an instructor, you won't be tempted to play instead—unless, of course, your lesson is a "playing" lesson.

If you don't have respected, qualified instructors in your area, plan to travel. Many coaches will already be planning to be at national tournaments, so ask one to spend a few extra days to work with you. Or, take the opportunity to visit a player/coach and arrange to spend a few days with him/her. You can add a few new skills to your game and correct some mistakes you are making. Even a few days will make a big difference. If you are willing to be a little adventurous, arrange for your player/coach to watch your match at the national tournament and actually coach you. This can be inexpensive if the coach already has a few other clients, but can work you into the schedule.

Then, if you have a group of people you play with who all want to work on their games, pick a weekend and get a player/coach to come to you to spend some quality time with your group. Basically, you set up your own private racquetball camp and pick the campers and instructor you want. Splitting the expense will save you some money and make it much more social. You only run the risk of your buddy learning something better than you do, and then beating you with it. That's a risk worth taking.

Consider Spending Even a Little More on Your Game

Many players don't know this option is available, but if you are looking for some player/coaching in doubles, you can enter a tournament WITH your coach and experience the complete package. NMRA and other round-robin, multi-day national tournaments are perfect for getting some serious instruction, under pressure, against top players in your age group. Who knows? If you play well enough with your coach, you might even win a national title! The age of your player/coach will determine which age group you can enter, so you will want to choose one who is around your age.

I spoke with several player/coaches about this option, and they all recommend doing some up-front homework first. It would be unrealistic to enter a tournament and expect to win without first working for hours ahead of time with your player/coach.

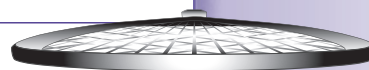

That work will set you up to know which shots your coach will expect you to take and which shots to hit, so it won't be foreign when you get to the pressure situation of the tournament.

In general, you can expect to pay for your player/coach's entry fee and all expenses, and some type of salary. In addition, you may agree on a bonus if you win, or win a medal. Each coach does things a little differently.

Player/Coach Suggestions

The *NMRA* tournaments start at age 45, with the exception of our December doubles tournament, where 40+-year-olds may enter, and oddly enough, 45 is about the age that people can set aside some time and money to work on their racquetball skills. Everyone knows there are many coaches out there who have not played in years. Many are really great coaches, but why wouldn't you spend the same money to have your coach on the court with you helping to win matches, rather than making suggestions from the sideline?

For the past ten years or so, the player/coaches who excel in their age group players have mainly been **Ruben Gonzalez** and **Tom Travers**. Both are now coaching 60+ and 55+ players.

It is exciting that a few newer, younger player/coaches have entered the arena. **Woody Clouse**, **Cliff Swain**, and **Dave Negrete** are all available to play the "young" 45 and 50 age group doubles, and coach singles too. There are a few female possibilities, too. **Cliff Swain** lives in the *Northeastern US* near *Boston*; **Dave Negrete** is currently in the western *Chicago* suburbs. **Woody Clouse** lives in the *Denver* area, so he would be an excellent choice for the July 2015 *NMRA Denver* tournament—fewer expenses and an opportunity to work with him before that tournament if you plan to play *USAR National Singles* in May.

I know there are more player/coaches out there—I just haven't heard about their availability. I hope other player/coaches will contact me with their information too. If you need assistance contacting these or other player coaches, email or call me.

What You Might Learn From a Player/Coach

I spoke at length with a few of these player/coaches (and I have worked with **Tom Travers**) and asked them what they could do for a tournament player's game. There were many things, but they all wanted to stress that they coach at the *PLAYER's* level and not at their own. Some other ideas include:

- Crystalizing Goals / Motivations
- Stretching
- Healthy Diet Ideas
- Strength / Conditioning
- Improving Speed
- Mental Toughness
- Adding New Skills
- Perfecting Old Skills
- Good Defense
- Aggressive Offense
- Shot Selection
- Situation Recognition
- Video Analysis
- Opponent Weakness Analysis

Choosing Your Player/Coach

Since you do have several choices when deciding on a player/coach, you might keep in mind a few things when deciding on one to call.

Make sure your coach has a similar philosophy as you when it comes to competing and working at improving. If you play with him/her in a tournament and you are made to feel uncomfortable, perhaps you have not made the best choice. If your coach expects you to put in two hours a day drilling in between coaching sessions and you have no intention of doing that, your coach may not want to stay with you.

And make sure your coach is telling you the correct techniques and rules. You don't want to learn bad habits.

Coaches have their strengths, so you may pick one that is strong in the area on which you are concentrating (singles, doubles, serving, on-court situation analysis, footwork and positioning are some examples). You may like one coach for playing and another for shot setups.

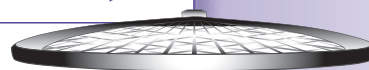
➤ Don't be afraid to try them all. If a coach objects to you wanting to work with other good coaches, alarm bells should be going off in your head. There is so much to learn from everyone, even regular players.

Certain coaches communicate better than others. Pick one that speaks to you the way you need to learn. Perhaps a good test would be to send a 15-minute video of your game to your potential coach and see what he/she can suggest.

There is still time before the July 22 through 25 *NMRA* tournament in *Denver* to make some steady improvements to your racquetball skills with a coach. And our December 3 through 5 doubles-only tournament in southern *California* is months away. What are you waiting for? Get the contact info from me, pick a coach and get to work! ○

MORE *NMRA* Tidbits

If you enjoy watching live racquetball but can't travel to the pro stops, you can watch it online. Two of the pro tours stream the matches for free, and the *IRT* tour is still on a subscription basis. Check out the *LPRT Tour* where the top ladies play (www.lprtour.com) and use the Schedule link to find out when they play, as well as links to the livestreaming). Then the *World Racquetball Tour* is a set of top-prize-money events with an international flavor created by *Gearbox*. Find the schedule using their www.gearboxrb.com site, and the *Gearbox Live* link. The top eight *IRT Tour* players are not allowed to play in the *WRT* events. Of course, the *IRT* is where you will find **Kane Waselenchuk** and **Rocky Carson** battling it out in many finals. Go to www.irt-tour.com or www.irtnetwork.com for the livestreaming. Subscriptions can be purchased for \$100 a year, or by the weekend. In addition there are many free broadcasts too—especially early-round matches, and we all know those can sometimes be the most exciting. John Scott's commentary is well worth the subscription price! Watch all of these tours on your PC, phone or tablet in **your own home, and invite some friends over to catch all of the action.**

Paddleball, Racquetball, Senior Games and Len Sonnenberg

Paddleball is thriving at *San Diego's Sorrento Valley Racquet Club*, thanks to the legend, **Charlie Brumfield**. *Paddleball Senior Olympics* is also thriving, thanks to the efforts of **Leonard Sonnenberg**.

Leonard (Len) Sonnenberg is the *Commissioner* for *San Diego's Senior Olympics Paddleball and Racquetball* tournaments, and he knows a whole lot about both 501(c)3 organizations and senior fitness activities. Leonard is a CPA specializing in 501(c)3 non-profit organizations. His business, *Sonnenberg & Co. CPAs*, at 42 years strong, is itself almost old enough to compete in the *Senior Games*. Leonard's affinity with non-profit organizations made him a key asset to *Senior Games* organizations. He has been the *Treasurer* and *Board Member* for the *San Diego Senior Olympics*, the *California Senior Games*, and *National Masters Racquetball Association*. He served as a *Racquetball Commissioner* for *San Diego* and also for *Palm Desert, Orange County, Pasadena*, and the *2009 National Senior Games*.

Racquetball and *Paddleball* play a special role for Leonard. In 1997, Leonard was diagnosed with incurable lymphoma, and his prospects weren't optimistic. His doctors recommended vigorous physical activity to maximize his chances. He had always enjoyed racquetball, and so he stepped up the pace of his workout in an effort to overcome the disease. In a fairly memorable moment during a *Senior Olympics Racquetball* tournament, Leonard's chemotherapy was running overtime and he was unable to make the start time for his match. Knowing the cause, the tournament director broke the rules and postponed the match to start when Leonard arrived...whatever time that might be. He was finally cured with a stem-cell transplant from his brother. In 2002, he was selected to carry the torch for the *Winter Olympic Games*.

Leonard adopted this kind of flexibility as a hallmark of the tournaments he directs. It is really not so much about winning, but about playing. If you want to play, he'll find you a partner. If your partner gets injured, he'll find you a substitute. If two teams want to play each other as part of the competition, he'll schedule a match even if they aren't in the same age group. If you need to leave by noon, you can play early. If you can't arrive until ten o'clock, you can play late.

As paddleball gained in popularity in *San Diego*, Leonard added a paddleball bag to his gear, and made paddleball a part of the *San Diego Senior Olympic Games*. Leonard now plays in the 70-to-75-year age group where his forehand is regarded as automatic. He plays in and contributes to numerous local and national tournaments, and has accumulated nearly 100 medals in age group competition.

Moreover, the *Paddleball and Racquetball Senior Games* live up to the mission of encouraging seniors to carry on vigorous physically and mentally healthy lives through fitness and participation in competitive sports. It is a tradition worth preserving, so each year at *Senior Games Paddleball and Racquetball*, we proudly say "Let the games begin!"

Just recently, the *National Paddleball Association* awarded Len the *Earl Risky Memorial Award* for the person who has contributed most to the sport of *Paddleball* for 2015.

Previous winners over the 40-year history include **Ron Pudduck**, **Steve Keeley**, and **Charlie Brumfield**. ○
